### **Preliminary Objections**

- 1. That the appeal is badly time bared in the eyes of Law.
- 2. That the appellant has got no locus standi or cause of action against the replying respondents.
- 3. That the appellant has not approached this Hon'ble Tribunal with clean hands.
- 4. That no discrimination/injustice have been done to the appellant.
- 5. That due to concealment of material fact and misstatement the appeal is liable to be dismissed.

### **COMMENTS**

- That the record reveals that the appellant Mr. Adam Khan along with others was recruited in the Project titled "On Farm Water Management World Bank Assisted Project IDA Credit No. 3516-PAK" as Water Management Officer vide Notification dated 24-11-2004 as per terms and conditions specified for recruitment against the project posts (copy of notification attached **Annex-A**). The contract Project services of the petitioner was extended from time to time and t he appellant worked there till March, 2007 (copies of extensions orders attached **Annex-B&C**).
- 2. Pertains to record hence needs no comments.
- 3. Correct to the extent that the project service of the appellant in OFWM World Bank Assisted Project was extended from time to time and lastly up to March, 2007.

It is pertinent to mentioned here that the appellant Mr. Adam Khan was appointed as fresh candidate in another Project titled "National Program for Improvement/Lining of Watercourses Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Component" vide Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Agriculture, Livestock & Cooperative Deptt: Peshawar notification No. SOE(AD)II(2)70/2007/WMO dated 12/03/2007 without through proper channel as per terms and conditions specified for project posts (copy of recruitment order attached Annex-D).

4. Incorrect, that the appellant Mr. Adam Khan along with others in 2<sup>nd</sup> spell of service i.e. from 12-03-2007 while serving in the Project titled "National Program for Improvement/Lining of Watercourses (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Component) filed writ petition No. 2249/2011 in the honourable Peshawar High Court Peshawar for regularization of his services which was allowed by the honourable court vide judgment dated 15-09-2011 (copy of judgment attached Annex-E). The department filed CPLA

against the judgment dated 15-09-2011 of honourable Peshawar High Court Peshawar in august Supreme Court of Pakistan. The august Supreme Court of Pakistan vide judgment dated 22-03-2012 decided the case and in compliance to the decision of the august Supreme Court of Pakistan (**Annex-F**) the services of the appellant was regularized vide notification dated 03-07-2013 (**Annex-G**).

- 5. As explained in Para-4 above.
- 6. Correct to the extent that the appellant filed departmental appeal which was sent to the Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Law & Human Parliamentary Affairs Rights Department for consideration. The law department considered the appeal with the opinion that "therefore the regularization notification is to be made in accordance with the provision of Regularization Act, 2009 from the date of initial continuous officiating appointment, subject to final verdict of Supreme Court as the cases of regularization of the Project Employees is subjudice in apex court in Review Petition" (copy of Section Officer Opinion-I Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Law Parliamentary Affairs & Human Rights department attached Annex-H) which was duly communicated to the appellant.
- 7. The appeal of the appellant was considered by the competent authority therefore, the grievance of the appellant is out of place as his regularization order was issued w.e.from 12-03-2007.

### <u>GROUNDS</u>

- A. The notification dated 03-07-2013 is according to law, facts & material on record.
- B. Incorrect, the competent authority considered the appeal of the appellant as explained in para-4 above. Therefore, the plea of the appellant is not based on facts and out of place as the

appellant has been treated in accordance with law, rules & policy on the subject matter and material on record.

- C. Needs no comments.
- D. The acts of Respondents are based on facts and material on record and he is not entitled for counting of his previous project service toward seniority.
- E. Incorrect, the appellant is treated as per law, rules and not discriminated in any way.
- F. The notification dated 03-07-2013 is based on facts, therefore, not liable to be reviewed.
- G. The regularization notification of the appellant is according to law and no disparity has been made.
- H. Incorrect, the appellant joined NPIWCs project on 12-03-2007 therefore, his seniority in the cadre will be reckoned from the date of continuous appointment against that very post, therefore, the same is not tenable and liable to be reviewed.
- I. That Respondents also seek permission of this Tribunal to advance further grounds during arguments.

In light of the above facts, it is prayed that appeal of the appellant may please be dismissed.



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

The epitome of the controversy involved in

writ petitions at S.No. 1 to 13, mentioned above,

is that the petitioners therein were appointed as

Water Management Officers (Agriculture/

Engineering) (BPS-17), on contract basis, for

"National Program for improvement/ lining of water courses in Pakistan (for NWFP)" vide

two different Notifications bearing even No. SOE

(AD) 11 (2) 70/2004 on 24 11.2004 and 4.2.2005

for a period of one year extendable upto the project life on their satisfactory performance and were posted in different projects. Their contract

was extended from time to time and was lastly

extended vide Notification dated 16.9.2008 upto

30.6.2009.

Consequent upon approval of Chief Executive of the Province, sanction for creation of 275 posts was accorded by the competent authority in the offices called "On-Farm Water

Management Department", at district level, with

effect from 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2007 vide notifications dated

21.4.2007 and 30.7.2007 and by virtue thereof,

equal number of posts on developmental side automatically stand abolished. The petitioners were expecting their adjustment/ appointments against the newly created 275 regular posts but

vide notifications dated 21.2.2007 and 3.9.2008

certain contract employees of different projects

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were adjusted against some of those posts but the petitioners were ignored, for no plausible cause

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3. In writ petitions at S.No. 14 to 16,

mentioned above, the petitioners therein were appointed as Veterinary Assistants (BPS-6) in

FATA under the Contract Policy of 2002 and were posted in various Developmental Schemes

which were subsequently converted into regular strength. They continued as such till date and

their contract was never renewed till the NWFP

Civil Servants (Amendment) Act 2005 came into being, regularizing the services of contract

employees by operation of law.

Vide the impugned order dated 2.1.2010, issued by respondent No.3, the services of the petitioners, in WP No. 771/2010, WP No.

3157/09 and WP No.3284/2010, were transferred

from regular sanctioned posts to the project posts

with the alleged malafide intention, on part of the respondents, to convert their pay scales into fixed

pay due to which their salaries w.e.from January, 2010 have been withheld.

4. The petitioners are seeking benefit under the provisions of NWFP now KPK, Civil Servants (Amendment) Act, 2005 (NWFP Act No.IX of 2005) and similar legislation made by the NWFP, now KPK, Employees (Regularization of Services) Act 2009 (NWFP Act No. XVI of 2009 vide which the services of all adhoc & contractual employees were

regularized by the Provincial legislature thus they have filed these constitutional petitions, praying

for declaring the impugned orders, issued by the

respondents, as without lawful authority as well

as of no legal effect and have also prayed for issuing of writ to the respondents for

regularization of their services.

5. Arguments heard and case law cited at the

bar has been gone through minutely.



The respondents were put on notice and by 6

way of interim relief filling of the said posts against which the petitioners are seeking

adjustment were held in abeyance.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Mazhar Alam Khan-J **\*** 7: on the petition of the petitioners accelerated the

date from 8.11.2011 to the second week of

August 2011 because of the interim injunction

order, suspending the fresh appointments on

these posts by the respondents.

Arguments heard extensively and record

perused.

It was not contested by the respondents that 8. the appointment orders of all the petitioners were

made by the competent / appointing authority in the

prescribed manner.

It deserves to mention here that at the time of 9.

appointments of the petitioners as project employees,

the method of appointment was through

departmental selection committee (DSC). The

projects were funded by the ADP, however, keeping

in view the progress made, the importance and utility of the projects, the services of the petitioners were retained/ extended but on contract basis. In their initial appointment orders, it was stipulated that their

tenure would be extended/ extendable on yearly basis (with the approval of the competent authority) and will be subject to the terms and conditions noted/ notified vide their appointment letters.

It is worth to mention here that the posts, 10. on which the petitioners were appointed as

contract employees, were all duly published/

advertised by the respondents in two daily newspapers i.e. "The News" & "Mashriq 22.08.2002 and on 23.6.2004 Peshawar"

### respectively.

The petitioners after assuming charge of 11. their assigned jobs on contract basis, initially served as project employees for a period of one year as was mentioned in their appointment orders but the tenure of their service was

ATTE

extended for further one year vide Notification

No. SOE (AD)II(2)70/2007 dated 16.9.2008.

12. Two important facts are not contested by

the parties i.e. that the petitioners in all these petitions were project employees thus, their

tenure of service was dependent on the

completion of the project. It is also not denied that after the successful operation and

management of the projects and being of

considerable public utility, the Provincial

Government converted the schemes/ projects.

from project budget to the current budget and was taken on the roll and strength of the provincial

civil service. The required funds were allocated

for the same in the annual budget on currency

basis.

13. Another development, providing cause of

action / grievance to the petitioners, took place

when the Government of NWFP presented a bill

in the Provincial Assembly through which

Section 19 of the NWFP Civil Service Act was to

be amended. The said bill was passed by the

Provincial Assembly of NWFP on the 5th July,

2005 and assented to by the Governor of NWFP on 12<sup>th</sup> July, 2005 which was notified/ published

in the Gazette of NWFP, extra ordinary on 23rd

July, 2005

Sub-section (2) of Section 2 of the Amendment Act IX of 2005 is to the following

effect:-

2. Amendment of section 19 of N.W.F.P Act No. XVIII of 1973.- In the North- West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973 (N.W.F.P. Act No. XVIII of 1973) for section 19, the following shall be substituted:-

(19.(1) Pension and gratuity.---Not

relevant. (2) A person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to service or post on or after the 1st day of July, 2001, till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on contract basis, shall, with effect from the commencement of the said Act be deemed to have been appointed on a regular basis. All such ATTESDED persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the the after manner prescribed commencement of the said Act, for all intents and purposes be civil servant, except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant shall, in lieu of pension and gratuity, be entitled to receive such amount contributed by him towards the Contributory Provident Fund, alongwith the contributions made by Government to his account in the said fund, in the prescribed manner.'

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14. Through the above provision of law, the

employees appointed on contract basis but in the

prescribed manner were provided protection by regularizing their services. The proviso added thereto

states that a person, who is selected for appointment

in the prescribed manner to a service or post but appointed on contract basis, shall with effect from the commencement of this Ordinance or from the

date of his continuous appointment whichever may

be later, be deemed to have been appointed on

regular basis in the department concerned. Such

employee shall, for all intents & purposes, be regular ATTESTED

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employees of the Institution concerned except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. All such employees shall, in lieu of pension & gratuity, be entitled to the benefits of the Contributory Provident Fund scheme in the prescribed manner.

Again, through sub-section (2) of Section 2 of 15. the (Amendment) Act of 2005, vide proviso added thereto, it was directed that a person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to a service or post on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 2001 till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on contract basis, shall, with effect from the commencement of the said Act, be deemed to have been appointed on regular basis. All such persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the prescribed manner, after the commencement of the said Act, shall, for all intents & purposes, be a civil servant except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant in lieu of pension & gratuity be entitled to receive such

amount contributed by him towards the Contributory



Provident Fund along with contribution made by Government to his account in the prescribed manner.

Further provided that in the event of death of such

civil servant, whether before or after the retirement,

his family shall be entitled to receive the said

amount, if it has already not been received by such

deceased civil servant.

16. Once again, through the then NWFP now KPK

(Regularization of Services) Act No. XVI of 2009,

on the strength of provisions of Section 3 thereof, all

employees including the recommendee of the High

Court appointed on contract or adhoc basis holding.

that post on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008 or till the

commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have

been validly appointed on regular basis having the

same qualification & experience for a regular post

subject to exception that the service / promotion

quota of all service cadres shall not be affected.

17. Through the provision of Section 4-A of the

Amendment Act, overriding effect was given to the

provision of this Act over all other laws & rules for ATT

EXAMINZR Peshawar High C the time being enforce and it was further provided that any law or rule, coming in conflict with the provision of Amendment Act or inconsistent thereto,

shall cease to have effect. This clause overriding & superimposing nature has equipped the provision of

Amendment Act No. XLI of 2009, with ever lasting effect over all other laws & rules then in vogue.

18. Learned counsel for the petitioners invited attention of the Court to the earlier judgments of the Bench involving same & similar Issues which were rendered in the case of "Dr. Rizwan Ullah & others Vs. Government of NWFP & others" (W.P.No.

1510/1997) and in many other writ petitions, whose contractual services were regularized by the strength of the said judgment, elaborately dealing with each

& every provision of law relevant to the subject matter promulgated from time to time and it was further stated at the bar that this judgment of the

Court was accepted & acted upon by the various

departments of the Provincial Government and

services of contractual employees were

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regularized, issuing office orders at different occasions and no grudge or grievance was shown

against it by the Government to take the matter to the

Hon'ble Apex Court. 19. The learned counsel representing the

petitioners further invited our attention to different

office orders, issued in light of the judgment cited above by various Heads of the Institutions /

Administrative Secretaries of the Provincial

Government complying with the said judgment in

full. 20. The learned counsel then invited the Court

attention to the case of "Mst. Shagufia Sayed Vs.

Government of KPK & others" W.P.No. 1731/2006 along with W.P.No. 475/2006 dated 11.09.2007,

extending the benefit of the provision of

Regularization of Services (Amendment) Act 2005

to various employees, who were appointed on

contract basis on Farm Management. Wing of the

Agriculture Department. The learned counsel also

produced copy of the judgment of the Hon'ble Apex

EXAMI Pechawar isk Court given in Civil Appeals No. 150-P & 151-P of 2009 decided on 24.03.2011 where the

abovementioned judgment of this Court was

impugned The Hon'ble Apex Court after elaborately & extensively dealing with each & every legal &

factual aspect of the case, not only upheld the view

held by this Court but also referred to its own

judgment given in Civil Appeals No. 834-P to 837-P

of 2010 decided on 01.03.2011 wherein, it was held

that the cases of contractual employees though

appointed on project are squarely covered by the

provision of Section 19 (2) of the NWFP Civil

Servants Act 1973. Accordingly, both the appeals

filed by the Government in the said case were

dismissed.

21. Confronted with the above ironclade legal

position, the learned Additional Advocate General

and the learned counsel appearing for the

respondents were time and again asked to draw line

of distinction between the case of the petitioners and

of those to whom benefit of the said provision of law

EXAMINER Peshawar Hinko was extended and their contractual services were regularized, however, they were found defenseless and were found having no answer muchless plausible

to offer. We have on record the copies of the appointment orders issued by the Competent

Authority appointing the petitioners at different

occasions en different dates, as contract employees

on the posts in question

22. An ironclad proof in the shape of documentary record is available on file that the petitioners were appointed on contract basis by the Competent

Authority, which is a fact undeniable in nature and their contractual services were renewed and extended

from time to time.

23. The undeniable legal position is that the

petitioners are contract employees because they have

not been absorbed permanently in the departments

concerned where they have been appointed, therefore, they are entitled to the protection of the

beneficial provision of sub-section (2) of Section 2

of the then NWFP now KPK Civil Servants

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(Amendment) Act 2005 and their rights are further protected in a more effective manner by provisions

of Section 3 of the then NWFP now KPK Employees

(Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 to which superimposing & overriding effect was given on all the rules & law to the contrary. The latest enactment

came into force on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2009 when it was published in the official gazette of the Province extra

### ordinary.

24. The learned AAG and the learned counsel appearing for the respondents also took the plea that these are not substantive vacancies, therefore, the question of regularization of contractual services of

the petitioners could not be made, is absolutely

fallacious because in the first instance no document

or record was produced to substantiate this plea. The

contents of the published notice in the Press do not indicate in any manner that these vacancies are

temporary and not substantive one, hence, this plea

has been raised out of malafide and has no

foundation to stand upon. However, in case the

number of vacancies not commensurate with number of petitioners then, in that case some of them may be placed in the surplus pool for onward posting on various projects in near future when the circumstances so arises and re-adjustment becomes

### possible.

25. For the detailed reasons discussed above, we

entertain no amount of doubt that the petitioners are

entitled to the prayed relief because services of

similarly placed employees of different Institutions/

departments, who were appointed on contract basis,

were held to have been regularized through the

provision of various enactments, discussed above,

moreso, when the main judgment of this Court was

not impugned before the Hon'ble Apex Court by the

Provincial Government, therefore, no distinction can be drawn between the case of the petitioners and of

those to whom the same and similar benefit was

extended by this Court. Even otherwise, once the law

has been interpreted in the earlier judgments of this

Court in favour of the employees then, the

subsequent Division Bench, in view of the long chain

of authorities / dictas of the Hon'ble Apex Court,

cannot deviate from the previous view, moreso,

when we have no reason to differ with the earlier

view.

26. Accordingly, this and all the connected

petitions, cited in the opening paragraph, are

admitted and allowed and the respondents are issued

a writ, directing them to treat the petitioners of this

and of all the connected petitions as regular/

permanent employees from the date the law came

into force, as discussed above or from the date of

officiating service as stated in the relevant provisions

of law. Formal office order be immediately issued in

this regard by the competent authorities in regard to

the above legal position, the service books/ record of

all the petitioners be duly arranged and prepared,

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however, their inter se seniority be determined by the

competent authorities in accordance with law and

rules on the subject.

TARIO PARVEZ, J. – Facts admitted from both the sides are that certain posts of Water Management Officers PBS-17 under the project "NWFP On-Farm Water Management Cooperation World Bank for the purpose of improving water courses in the Province of NWFP (Now Khyber Pakhtunkhwa)" were advertised to which respondents were selected. Their contracts have been extended from time to time which finally lasted up to 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2009. A summary was prepared and placed before the Chief Minister, KPK with the proposal that 275 posts may be created in the Water Management Department to accommodate the respondents. The posts so proposed were sanctioned. Meanwhile, Section 19 of the N.W.F.P. Civil **ATTESTED**

Servants Act, 1973 was amended through N.W.F.P., Act No.IX of 2005 (Amendment Act, 2005). The respondents were considered to be project employees and not included as regular contract employees, therefore, their services were not regularized. Some of the colleagues of the respondents, feeling dissatisfied as their services were not regularized, approached the tearned Peshawar High Court through Writ Petition No.1645 of 2007 which was decided on 22.12.2008. The petition was accepted and their services were regularized. The said order of the learned Peshawar High Court in Writ Petition was challenged before this Court by filing Civil Petition Nos.834, 835, 836 and 837 of 2010 in which services of their colleagues were regularized.

The respondents were expecting their appointments against 275 regular posts but they were ignored whereas certain contract employees of different projects were adjusted against some of those posts.

2. In the present petitions the Government of KPK (petitioners herein) has challenged the consolidated judgment in Writ Petition No.360 of 2009, decided on 15.09.2011 whereby it has been directed in terms of para-26 of the judgment impugned to treat the respondents as regular permanent employees from the date the law came into force; the same para is reproduced herein below:-

"26. Accordingly, this and all the connected petitions, eited in the opening paragraph, are admitted and allowed and the respondents are issued a writ, directing them to treat the petitioners of this and of all the connected petitions are regular/permanent employees from the date the law

ATTESTED Supreme Couri of Paklown SLAMABAD came into force, as discussed above or from the date of officiating service as stated in the relevant provisions of taw. Formal office order be immediately issued in this regard by the competent authorities in regard to the above legal position, the service books/record of all the petitioners be duly arranged and prepared, however, their inter se seniority be determined by the competent authorities in accordance with law and rules on the subject."

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners has argued that by virtue of Amendment Act, 2005 whereby Section 19 was amended, the contract employees were made regular, whereas under Section 3. of the NWFP (now KPK) Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009, the services of the present respondents who were working on contract basis were to be regularized; but his contention is that although the learned High Court has not decided the validity of the Amendment Act, 2005 nor KPK Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 but the respondents cannot be regularized because whatever regular posts available with the Provincial Government, that have to be filled in on the basis of inter se merit of contractual employees. Learned counsel further states that in absence of any budgetary allocation and in absence of any sanctioned vacancy, the Provincial Government cannot be put under financial burden to adjust the respondents who were contract employees.

4. After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioners and learned counsel for some of the respondents, we find that the judgments of the learned Peshawar High Court impugned before us

are not open to any exception. The laws on subject has been

cromulgated by the petitioners itself; one in the year 2005 by amending the NWEP Civil Services Act, 1973 and the other by introducing the Regularization Act of 2009 where-under services of contract employees have been regularized. For the sake of convenience, the relevant provisions of the Amendment Act. IX of 2005 are reproduced herein below: -

"19(J) .....

19(2). A person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to a service or post on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2011, till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on contract basis, shall, with effect from the commencement of the said Act, be deemed to have been appointed on regular basis. All such persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the prescribed manner after the commencement of the said Act, shall, for all intents and purposes be civil servants, except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant shall, in lieu of pension and gratuity, be entitled to receive such amount contributed by him towards the Contributory Provident Fund, alongwith the contributions made by Government to his account in the said fund, in the prescribed manner,"

Similarly, Section 3 of the Regularization Act, 2009 reads as under: -

"3. <u>Regularization of services of certain comployees</u>. All employees including recommendees of the High Court appointed on contract or adhoc basis and holding that post on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2008 or till the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been validly appointed on regular basis having the same qualification and experience for a regular post;

Provided that the service promotion quota of all service cadres shall not be affected."

Dear Sir,

I am directed to refer to your Department's letter No.SOE(AD)17-131/2016 dated 15-02-2017 on the subject noted above and to state that the High Court has discussed two laws, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants (Amendment) Act, 2005 and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Employees (Regularization of Service) Act,2009 in its judgement/order dated 15-9-2011 in Writ Petition N.2877/2009 and other connected petitions. The High Court admitted in para-17 of the judgment, the supremacy/overriding effect of Regularization Act, 2009, over other laws and rules for the time being in force in light of Section-4-A of the Act ibid. It was further provided that any law or rule coming in conflict with the provisions of the Act shall cease to have effect. Thus, the regularization was to be made under the provisions of Regularization Act, 2009, which came into force on 24-10-2009 when it was published in the official Gazzette. Section-3 of the Act ibid has been reproduced in para-16 of the Judgement.

2. Therefore, the regularization Notification is to be made in accordance with the provisions of Regularization Act, 2009 from the date of initial continuous officiating appointment, subject to final verdict of Supreme Court as the cases of regularization of Project Employees, is subjudice in Apex Court in



- 4. That as such the services of the appellant were extended from time to time and as such the provincial Assembly of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa promulgated an Act called "Regularization of Contract employees Act 2009" whereby all the provincial employees who were working on contract basis were regularized. That in light of the said Act the appellant along with his colleagues knocked the door of Peshawar High Court in writ petition No.2877/2009 for their regularization and the same was allowed vide judgment dated 15.9.2011. Copies of the judgments are attached as annexure ...... D & E.

- 7. That appellant feeling aggrieved and having no other remedy filed the instant appeal on the following grounds amongst the others.

## **GROUNDS:**

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A- That the impugned order dated 3.7.2013 issued by the respondents is against the law, facts, norms of natural justice and materials on the record hence not tenable and liable to be modified/amended.

B- That appellant has not been treated by the respondent Department in accordance with law and rules on the subject noted above and as such the respondents violated Article 4 and 25 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan 1973.



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two different Notifications bearing even No. SOE (AD) 11 (2) 70/2004 on 24.11.2004 and 4.2.2005

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for a period of one year extendable upto the project life on their satisfictory performance and was extended from time to time and was lastly was extended from time to time and was lastly

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automatically stand abolished. The petitioners

against the newly created 275 regular posts but vide notifications duted 21.2.2007 and 3.9.2008

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were adjusted against some of those posts but the petitioners were ignored, for no plausible cause 3. In writ petitions at S.No. 14 to 16, mentioned above, the petitioners therein were appointed as Veterinary Assistants (BPS-6) in FATA under the Contract Policy of 2002 and were posted in various Developmental Schemes which were subsequently converted into regular strength. They continued as such till date and their contract was never renewed till the NWFP Civil Servants (Amendment) Act 2005 came into being, regularizing the services of contract employees by operation of law.

Vide the impugned order dated 2.1.2010, issued by respondent No.3, the services of the petitioners, in WP No. 771/2010, WP No.

3157/09 and WP No.3284/2010, were transferred from regular sanctioned posts to the project posts

with the alleged malafide intention, on part of the respondents, to convert their pay scales into fixed

pay due to which their salaries w.e.from January, 2010 have been withheld.

The petitioners are seeking benefit under the provisions of NWFP now KPK, Civil Servants (Amendment) Act, 2005 (NWFP Act) No.1X of 2005) and similar legislation made by the . NWFP. KPK, Employees now (Regularization of Services) Act 2009 (NWFP Act No. XVI of 2009 vide which the services of all adhoc & contractual employees were regularized by the Provincial legislature thus they have filed these constitutional petitions, praying for declaring the impugned orders, issued by the respondents, as without lawful authority as well as of no legal effect and have also prayed for issuing of writ to the respondents for regularization of their services.

5. Arguments heard and case law cited at the bar has been gone through minutely.

6. The respondents were put on notice and by way of interim relief filling of the said posts against which the petitioners are seeking adjustment were held in abeyance.

7. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Mazhar Alam Khan-J on the petition of the petitioners accelerated the date from 8.11.2011 to the second week of August 2011 because of the interim injunction order, suspending the fresh appointments on these posts by the respondents.

Arguments heard extensively and record perused.

8. It was not contested by the respondents that the appointment orders of all the petitioners were made by the competent / appointing authority in the prescribed manner.

9. It deserves to mention here that at the time of appointments of the petitioners as project employees, the method of appointment was through departmental selection committee (DSC). The projects were funded by the ADP, however, keeping in view the progress made, the importance and utility of the projects, the services of the petitioners were retained/ extended but on contract basis. In their initial appointment orders, it was stipulated that their tenure would be extended/ extendable on yearly basis (with the approval of the competent authority) and will be subject to the terms and conditions noted/ notified vide their appointment letters. It is worth to mention here that the posts, 10.1on which the petitioners were appointed as contract employees, were all duly published/ advertised by the respondents in two daily "The News" & "Mashriq newspapers i.e. "Peshuwar", on 23.6.2004 and 22.08,2002

respectively.

11. The petitioners after assuming charge of their assigned jobs on contract basis, initially served as project employees for a period of one year as was mentioned in their appointment orders but the tenure of their service was

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extended for further one year vide Notification

No. SOE (AD)H(2)70/2007 dated 16.9.2008.

12. Two important facts are not contested by. the parties i.e. that the petitioners in all these petitions were project employees thus, their tenure of service was dependent on the completion of the project. It is also not denied after the successful that operation and management of the projects and being of considerable public utility, the Provincial Government converted the schemes/ projects from project budget to the current budget and was taken on the roll and strength of the provincial civit service. The required finds were aflocated

for the same in the annual budget on currency basis. 13. Another development, providing cause of action / grievance to the petitioners, took place

when the Government of NWFP presented a bill

in the Provincial Assembly through which

persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the prescribed manner after the commencement of the said. Act, for all intents and purposes be civil servant, except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant shall, in lieu of pension and gratuity, be entitled to receive such amount contributed by him towards the Contributory Provident Fund, alongwith the contributions made by Government to his account in the said fund, in the prescribed manner."

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14. Through the above provision of law; the employees appointed on contract basis but in the prescribed manner were provided protection by regularizing their services. The proviso added thereto states that a person, who is selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to a service or post but appointed on contract basis, shall with effect from the commencement of this Ordinance or from the date of his continuous appointment whichever may be later, be deemed to have been appointed on regular basis in the department concerned. Such employee shall, for all intents & purposes, be regular

employees of the Institution concerned except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. All such employees shall, in lieu of pension & gratuity, be entitled to the benefits of the Contributory Provident Fund scheme in the prescribed manner.

Again, through sub-section (2) of Section 2 of 15. the (Amendment) Act of 2005, vide proviso added thereto, it was directed that a person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to a service or post on or after the 1st day of July 2001 till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on basis, shall, with effect from the contract commencement of the said Act; be deemed to have been appointed on regular basis. All such persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the prescribed manner, after the commencement of the said Act, shall, for all intents & purposes, be a civil servant except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant in lieu of pension & gratuity be entitled to receive such

amount contributed by him towards the Contributory

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Provident Fund along with contribution made by Government to his account in the prescribed manner. Further provided that in the event of death of such civil servant, whether before or after the retirement, his family shall be entitled to receive the said amount, if it has already not been received by such deceased civil servant.

16. Once again, through the then NWFP now KPK (Regularization of Services) Act No. XVI of 2009, on the strength of provisions of Section 3 thereof, all employees including the recommendee of the High Court appointed on contract or adhoc basis holding that post on 31<sup>st</sup>. December 2008 or till the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been validly appointed on regular basis having the same qualification & experience for a regular post subject to exception that the service / promotion quota of all service cadres shall not be affected.
17. Through the provision of Section 4-A of, the

Amendment Act, overriding effect was given to the provision of this Act over all other laws & rules for

It is therefore, most humbly requested that the Notification dated 10-01-2013 may kindly be modified/amended and my services be regularize from the date of my  $1^{st}$  appointment i.e. 28-11-2004 instead of 12.3.2007 with all consequential benefits.

- That the record reveals that the appellant Mr. Adam Khan along with others was recruited in the Project titled "On Farm Water Management World Bank Assisted Project IDA Credit No. 3516-PAK" as Water Management Officer vide Notification dated 24-11-2004 as per terms and conditions specified for recruitment against the project posts (copy of notification attached **Annex-A**). The contract Project services of the petitioner was extended from time to time and t he appellant worked there till March, 2007 (copies of extensions orders attached **Annex-B&C**).
- 2. Pertains to record hence needs no comments.
- Correct to the extent that the project service of the appellant in OFWM World Bank Assisted Project was extended from time to time and lastly up to March, 2007.

It is pertinent to mentioned here that the appellant Mr. Adam Khan was appointed as fresh candidate in another Project titled "National Program for Improvement/Lining of Watercourses Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Component" vide Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Agriculture, Livestock & Cooperative Deptt: Peshawar notification No. SOE(AD)II(2)70/2007/WMO dated 12/03/2007 without through proper channel as per terms and conditions specified for project posts (copy of recruitment order attached Annex-D).

4. Incorrect, that the appellant Mr. Adam Khan along with others in 2<sup>nd</sup> spell of service i.e. from 12-03-2007 while serving in the Project titled "National Program for Improvement/Lining of Watercourses (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Component) filed writ petition No. 2249/2011 in the honourable Peshawar High Court Peshawar for regularization of his services which was allowed by the honourable court vide judgment dated 15-09-2011 (copy of judgment attached Annex-E). The department filed CPLA

against the judgment dated 15-09-2011 of honourable Peshawar High Court Peshawar in august Supreme Court of Pakistan. The august Supreme Court of Pakistan vide judgment dated 22-03-2012 decided the case and in compliance to the decision of the august Supreme Court of Pakistan (**Annex-F**) the services of the appellant was regularized vide notification dated 03-07-2013 (**Annex-G**).

- 5. As explained in Para-4 above.
- 6. Correct to the extent that the appellant filed departmental appeal which was sent to the Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Law Parliamentary Affairs & Human Rights Department for consideration. The law department considered the appeal with the opinion that "therefore the regularization notification is to be made in accordance with the provision of Regularization Act, 2009 from the date of initial continuous officiating appointment, subject to final verdict of Supreme Court as the cases of regularization of the Project Employees is subjudice in apex court in Review Petition" (copy of Section Officer Opinion-I Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Law Parliamentary Affairs & Human Rights department attached Annex-H) which was duly communicated to the appellant.
- 7. The appeal of the appellant was considered by the competent authority therefore, the grievance of the appellant is out of place as his regularization order was issued w.e.from 12-03-2007.

## <u>GROUNDS</u>

- A. The notification dated 03-07-2013 is according to law, facts & material on record.
- B. Incorrect, the competent authority considered the appeal of the appellant as explained in para-4 above. Therefore, the plea of the appellant is not based on facts and out of place as the

appellant has been treated in accordance with law, rules & policy on the subject matter and material on record.

- C. Needs no comments.
- D. The acts of Respondents are based on facts and material on record and he is not entitled for counting of his previous project service toward seniority.
- E. Incorrect, the appellant is treated as per law, rules and not discriminated in any way.
- F. The notification dated 03-07-2013 is based on facts, therefore, not liable to be reviewed.
- G. The regularization notification of the appellant is according to law and no disparity has been made.
- H. Incorrect, the appellant joined NPIWCs project on 12-03-2007 therefore, his seniority in the cadre will be reckoned from the date of continuous appointment against that very post, therefore, the same is not tenable and liable to be reviewed.
- I. That Respondents also seek permission of this Tribunal to advance further grounds during arguments.

In light of the above facts, it is prayed that appeal of the appellant may please be dismissed.



2. The epitome of the controversy involved in

writ petitions at S.No. 1 to 13, mentioned above,

is that the petitioners therein were appointed as

Water Management Officers (Agriculture/

Engineering) (BPS-17), on contract basis, for

"National Program for improvement/ lining of

water courses in Pakistan (for NWFP)" vide

two different Notifications bearing even No. SOE

(AD) 11 (2) 70/2004 on 24 11.2004 and 4.2.2005

for a period of one year extendable upto the project life on their satisfactory performance and were posted in different projects. Their contract

was extended from time to time and was lastly

extended vide Notification dated 16.9.2008 upto

30.6.2009.

Consequent upon approval of Chief Executive of the Province, sanction for creation of 275 posts was accorded by the competent authority in the offices called "On-Farm Water

Management Department", at district level, with

effect from 1st July, 2007 vide notifications dated

21.4.2007 and 30.7.2007 and by virtue thereof,

equal number of posts on developmental side

automatically stand abolished. The petitioners were expecting their adjustment/ appointments against the newly created 275 regular posts but vide notifications dated 21.2.2007 and 3.9.2008

certain contract employees of different projects

ATTEST

were adjusted against some of those posts but the petitioners were ignored, for no plausible cause

3. In writ petitions at S.No. 14 to 16,

mentioned above, the petitioners therein were appointed as Veterinary Assistants (BPS-6) in

FATA under the Contract Policy of 2002 and

were posted in various Developmental Schemes

which were subsequently converted into regular strength. They continued as such till date and

their contract was never renewed till the NWFP

Civil Servants (Amendment) Act 2005 came into being, regularizing the services of contract

employees by operation of law.

Vide the impugned order dated 2.1.2010, issued by respondent No.3, the services of the petitioners, in WP No. 771/2010, WP No.

3157/09 and WP No.3284/2010, were transferred

from regular sanctioned posts to the project posts

with the alleged malafide intention, on part of the

respondents, to convert their pay scales into fixed

pay due to which their salaries w.e.from January, 2010 have been withheld.

The petitioners are seeking benefit under 4 the provisions of NWFP now KPK, Civil Servants (Amendment) Act, 2005 (NWFP Act No.IX of 2005) and similar legislation made by now KPK, Employees NWFP, the (Regularization of Services) Act 2009 (NWFP Act No. XVI of 2009 vide which the services of all adhoc & contractual employees were regularized by the Provincial legislature thus they have filed these constitutional petitions, praying for declaring the impugned orders, issued by the respondents, as without lawful authority as well as of no legal effect and have also prayed for of writ to the respondents for issuing regularization of their services.

5. Arguments heard and case law cited at the bar has been gone through minutely.



6. The respondents were put on notice and by way of interim relief filling of the said posts

against which the petitioners are seeking

adjustment were held in abeyance.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Mazhar Alam Khan-J
 on the petition of the petitioners accelerated the

date from 8.11.2011 to the second week of

August 2011 because of the interim injunction.

order, suspending the fresh appointments on

these posts by the respondents.

Arguments heard extensively and record

perused.

8. It was not contested by the respondents that the appointment orders of all the petitioners were

made by the competent / appointing authority in the

prescribed manner.

9. It deserves to mention here that at the time of

appointments of the petitioners as project employees,

the method of appointment was through

departmental selection committee (DSC). The

projects were funded by the ADP, however, keeping

in view the progress made, the importance and utility of the projects, the services of the petitioners were retained/ extended but on contract basis. In their initial appointment orders, it was stipulated that their tenure would be extended/ extendable on yearly basis (with the approval of the competent authority) and will be subject to the terms and conditions noted/ notified vide their appointment letters.

10. It is worth to mention here that the posts, on which the petitioners were appointed as

contract employees, were all duly published/

advertised by the respondents in two daily newspapers i.e. *"The News" & "Mashriq Peshawar"* on 23.6.2004 and 22.08.2002

respectively.

11. The petitioners after assuming charge of their assigned jobs on contract basis, initially served as project employees for a period of one year as was mentioned in their appointment orders but the tenure of their service was

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extended for further one year vide Notification

No. SOE (AD)II(2)70/2007 dated 16.9.2008.

12. Two important facts are not contested by

the parties i.e. that the petitioners in all these petitions were project employees thus, their

tenure of service was dependent on the

completion of the project. It is also not denied

that after the successful operation and

management of the projects and being of

considerable public utility, the Provincial

Government converted the schemes/ projects

from project budget to the current budget and was

taken on the roll and strength of the provincial

civil service. The required funds were allocated

for the same in the annual budget on currency

## basis.

13. Another development, providing cause of

action / grievance to the petitioners, took place

when the Government of NWFP presented a bill

in the Provincial Assembly through which

Section 19 of the NWFP Civil Service Act was to

be amended. The said bill was passed by the

Provincial Assembly of NWFP on the 5<sup>th</sup> July,

2005 and assented to by the Governor of NWFP on 12<sup>th</sup> July, 2005 which was notified/ published

in the Gazette of NWFP; extra ordinary on 23rd

July, 2005.

Sub-section (2) of Section 2 of the Amendment Act IX of 2005 is to the following

effect:-

"2. Amendment of section 19 of N.W.F.P Act No. XVIII of 1973.- In the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973 Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973 (N.W.F.P. Act No. XVIII of 1973) for (N.W.F.P. Act No. XVIII of 1973) for section 19, the following shall be substituted:-

(19.(1) Pension and gratuity.---Not

relevant. (2) A person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to appointment in the prescribed manner to service or post on or after the Ist day of service or post on or after the Ist day of July, 2001, till the commencement of the July, 2001, till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on contract basis, shall, with effect from the commencement of the said Act be deemed to have been of the said Act be deemed to have been ATTES persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the the after manner prescribed commencement of the said Act, for all intents and purposes be civil servant, except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant shall, in lieu of pension and gratuity, be entitled to receive such amount contributed by him towards the Contributory Provident Fund, alongwith the contributions made by Government to his account in the said fund, in the prescribed manner.

14. Through the above provision of law, the

employees appointed on contract basis but in the

prescribed manner were provided protection by

regularizing their services. The proviso added thereto

states that a person, who is selected for appointment

in the prescribed manner to a service or post but appointed on contract basis, shall with effect from

the commencement of this Ordinance or from the date of his continuous appointment whichever may

be later, be deemed to have been appointed on

regular basis in the department concerned. Such

employee shall, for all intents & purposes, be regular

ATTEST

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employees of the Institution concerned except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. All such employees shall, in lieu of pension & gratuity, be entitled to the benefits of the Contributory Provident Fund scheme in the prescribed manner.

15. Again, through sub-section (2) of Section 2 of the (Amendment) Act of 2005, vide proviso added thereto, it was directed that a person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to a service or post on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 2001 till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on contract basis, shall, with effect from the commencement of the said Act, be deemed to have been appointed on regular basis. All such persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the prescribed manner, after the commencement of the said Act, shall, for all intents

& purposes, be a civil servant except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant in lieu of pension & gratuity be entitled to receive such amount contributed by him towards the Contributory



Provident Fund along with contribution made by Government to his account in the prescribed manner.

Further provided that in the event of death of such

civil servant, whether before or after the retirement,

his family shall be entitled to receive the said

amount, if it has already not been received by such

deceased civil servant.

16. Once again, through the then NWFP now KPK

(Regularization of Services) Act No. XVI of 2009,

on the strength of provisions of Section 3 thereof, all

employees including the recommendee of the High

Court appointed on contract or adhoc basis holding

that post on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008 or till the

commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have

been validly appointed on regular basis having the

same qualification & experience for a regular post

subject to exception that the service / promotion

quota of all service cadres shall not be affected.

17. Through the provision of Section 4-A of the

Amendment Act, overriding effect was given to the

provision of this Act over all other laws & rules for  $\Lambda$ 

EXAMINER Peshawar High Cour the time being enforce and it was further provided that any law or rule, coming in conflict with the

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provision of Amendment Act or inconsistent thereto,

shall cease to have effect. This clause overriding & superimposing nature has equipped the provision of

Amendment Act No. XLI of 2009, with ever lasting effect over all other laws & rules then in vogue.

18. Learned counsel for the petitioners invited attention of the Court to the earlier judgments of the Bench involving same & similar Issues which were rendered in the case of "Dr. Rizwan Ullah & others Vs. Government of NWFP & others" (W.P.No.

1510/1997) and in many other writ petitions, whose contractual services were regularized by the strength of the said judgment, elaborately dealing with each

& every provision of law relevant to the subject matter promulgated from time to time and it was further stated at the bar that this judgment of the Court was accepted & acted upon by the various

departments of the Provincial Government and services of contractual employees were duly

regularized, issuing office orders at different occasions and no grudge or grievance was shown

against it by the Government to take the matter to the

# Hon'ble Apex Court.

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The learned counsel representing the 19.

petitioners further invited our attention to different

office orders, issued in light of the judgment cited

above by various Heads of the Institutions / the Provincial

Administrative Secretaries of Government complying with the said judgment in

full. The learned counsel then invited the Court

attention to the case of "Mst. Shagufta Sayed Vs.

Government of KPK & others" W.P.No. 1731/2006

along with W.P.No. 475/2006 dated 11.09.2007,

extending the benefit of the provision of

Regularization of Services (Amendment) Act 2005

to various employees, who were appointed on

contract basis on Farm Management Wing of the

Agriculture Department. The learned counsel also

produced copy of the judgment of the Hon'ble Apex

Court given in Civil Appeals No. 150-P & 151-P of decided on 24.03.2011 where the

2009 decided on 24.03.2011 where abovementioned judgment of this Court was

impugned. The Hon?ble Apex Court after elaborately

& extensively dealing with each & every legal &

factual aspect of the case, not only upheld the view

held by this Court but also referred to its own

judgment given in Civil Appeals No. 834-P to 837-P

of 2010 decided on 01.03.2011 wherein, it was held

that the cases of contractual employees though

appointed on project are squarely covered by the

provision of Section 19 (2) of the NWFP Civil

Servants Act 1973. Accordingly, both the appeals

filed by the Government in the said case were

dismissed.

21. Confronted with the above ironclade legal

position, the learned Additional Advocate General

and the learned counsel appearing for the

respondents were time and again asked to draw line

of distinction between the case of the petitioners and

of those to whom benefit of the said provision of law

EXAMINER Peshawar Hish Co was extended and their contractual services were regularized, however, they were found defenseless

and were found having no answer muchless plausible

to offer. We have on record the copies of the appointment orders issued by the Competent Authority appointing the petitioners at different

occasions on different dates as contract employees

on the posts in question

22. An ironclad proof in the shape of documentary record is available on file that the petitioners were

appointed on contract basis by the Competent

Authority, which is a fact undeniable in nature and their contractual services were renewed and extended

from time to time.

23. The undeniable legal position is that the

petitioners are contract employees because they have

not been absorbed permanently in the departments

concerned where they have been appointed,

therefore, they are entitled to the protection of the

beneficial provision of sub-section (2) of Section 2

of the then NWFP now KPK Civil Servants

ATTES

(Amendment) Act 2005 and their rights are further protected in a more effective manner by provisions

of Section 3 of the then NWFP now KPK Employees

(Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 to which superimposing & overriding effect was given on all

the rules & law to the contrary. The latest enactment

came into force on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2009 when it was published in the official gazette of the Province extra

## ordinary.

24. The learned AAG and the learned counsel appearing for the respondents also took the plea that these are not substantive vacancies, therefore, the

question of regularization of contractual services of

the petitioners could not be made, is absolutely

fallacious because in the first instance no document

or record was produced to substantiate this plea. The contents of the published notice in the Press do not

indicate in any manner that these vacancies are

temporary and not substantive one, hence, this plea

has been raised out of malafide and has no

foundation to stand upon. However, in case the

number of vacancies not commensurate with number of petitioners then, in that case some of them may be placed in the surplus pool for onward posting on various projects in near future when the circumstances so arises and re-adjustment becomes

# possible.

25. For the detailed reasons discussed above, we

entertain no amount of doubt that the petitioners are

entitled to the prayed relief because services of

similarly placed employees of different Institutions/

departments, who were appointed on contract basis,

were held to have been regularized through the provision of various enactments, discussed above,

moreso, when the main judgment of this Court was

not impugned before the Hon'ble Apex Court by the

Provincial Government, therefore, no distinction can

be drawn between the case of the petitioners and of

those to whom the same and similar benefit was

extended by this Court. Even otherwise, once the law

has been interpreted in the earlier judgments of this

-19

Court in favour of the employees then, the

subsequent Division Bench, in view of the long chain

of authorities / dictas of the Hon'ble Apex Court,

cannot deviate from the previous view, moreso,

when we have no reason to differ with the earlier

view.

26. Accordingly, this and all the connected

petitions, cited in the opening paragraph, are,

admitted and allowed and the respondents are issued

a writ, directing them to treat the petitioners of this

and of all the connected petitions as regular/

permanent employees from the date the law came

into force, as discussed above or from the date of

officiating service as stated in the relevant provisions

of law. Formal office order be immediately issued in

this regard by the competent authorities in regard to

the above legal position, the service books/ record of

all the petitioners be duly arranged and prepared,

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however, their inter se seniority be determined by the

competent authorities in accordance with law and

rules on the subject.

#### ORDER

22.03.2012.

TARIO PARVEZ, J. – Facts admitted from both the sides are that certain posts of Water Management Officers PBS-17 under the project "NWFP On-Farm Water Management Cooperation World Bank for the purpose of improving water courses in the Province of NWFP (Now Khyber Pakhtunkhwa)" were advertised to which respondents were selected. Their contracts have been extended from time to time which finally lasted up to 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2009. A summary was prepared and placed before the Chief Minister, KPK with the proposal that 275 posts may be created in the Water Management Department to accommodate the respondents. The posts so proposed were sanctioned. Meanwhile, Section 19 of the N.W.F.P. Civil ATTESTED

SuphAntendent preme Court of Pakistan ISLAMABAD

Servants Act, 1973 was amended through N.W.F.P., Act No.IX of 2005 (Amendment Act, 2005). The respondents were considered to be project employees and not included as regular contract employees, therefore, their services were not regularized. Some of the colleagues of the respondents, feeling dissatisfied as their services were not regularized, approached the tearned Peshawar High Court through Writ Petition No.1645 of 2007 which was decided on 22.12.2008. The petition was accepted and their services were regularized. The said order of the learned Peshawar High Court in Writ Petition was challenged before this Court by filing Civil Petition Nos.834, 835, 835 and 837 of 2010 in which services of their colleagues were regularized.

The respondents were expecting their appointments against 275 regular posts but they were ignored whereas certain contract employees of different projects were adjusted against some of those posts.

2. In the present petitions the Government of KPK (petitioners herein) has challenged the consolidated judgment in Writ Petition No.360 of 2009, decided on 15.09.2011 whereby it has been directed in terms of para-26 of the judgment impugned to treat the respondents as regular permanent employees from the date the law came into force; the same para is reproduced herein below:-

"26. Accordingly, this and all the connected petitions, eited in the opening paragraph, are admitted and allowed and the respondents are issued a writ, directing them to treat the petitioners of this and of all the connected petitions are regular/permanent employees from the date the law

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came into force, as discussed above or from the date of officiating service as stated in the relevant provisions of law. Formal office order be immediately issued in this regard by the competent pathorities in regard to the above legal position, the service books/second of all the petitioners be duly arranged and prepared, however, their inter se seniority be determined by the competent authorities in accordance with law and rules on the subject."

CPs.562-P.10-571-P etc.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners has argued that by virtue of Amendment Act, 2005 whereby Section 19 was amended, the contract employees were made regular, whereas under Section 3 of the NWFP (now KPK) Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009, the services of the present respondents who were working on contract basis were to be regularized; but his contention is that although the learned High Court has not decided the validity of the Amendment Act, 2005 nor KPK Employees (Regularization of Services) Act; 2009 but the respondents cannot be regularized because whatever regular posts available with the Provincial Government, that have to be filled in on the basis of inter se merit of contractual employees. Learned counsel further states that in absence of any budgetary allocation and in absence of any sanctioned vacancy, the Provincial Government cannot be put under financial burden to adjust the respondents who were contract employees.

4. After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioners and learned counsel for some of the respondents, we find that the judgments of the learned Peshawar High Court impugned before us

are not open to any exception. The laws on subject has been ATTESTED

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promulgated by the petitioners itself; one in the year 2005 by amending the NWFP Civit Servints Act, 1973 and the other by introducing the Regularization Act of 2009 where-under services of contract employees have been regularized; For the sake of convenience, the relevant provisions of the Amendment Act. IX of 2005 are reproduced herein below: -

"19(1) .....

19(2). A person though selected for appointment in the prescribed manner to a service or post on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2011, till the commencement of the said Act but appointed on contract basis, shall, with effect from the commencement of the said Act, be deemed to have been appointed on regular basis. All such persons and the persons appointed on regular basis to a service or post in the prescribed manner after the commencement of the said Act, shall, for all intents and purposes be civil servants, except for the purpose of pension or gratuity. Such a civil servant shall, in lieu of pension and gratuity, be entitled to receive such amount contributed by thim towards the Contributory Provident Fund, alongwith the contributions made by Government to his account in the said fund, in the prescribed manner."

Similarly, Section 3 of the Regularization Act, 2009 reads as under: -

"3. <u>Regularization of services of certain employees</u>. All employees including recommendees of the High Court appointed on contract or adhoc basis and holding that post on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2008 or till the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been validly appointed on regular basis having the same qualification and experience for a regular post;

Provided that the service promotion quota of all service cadres shall not be affected."

In above view of the matter, we find that under the

Regularization Act, 2009, the services of all the persons appointed on

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contract were regularized.

CPs.562. P to 571-P etc.

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In view of the fact that validity of the law is not in 6. question and when undisputedly and admittedly the respondents were appointed in the prescribed manner though on contract basis but they otherwise fulfilled the requirements of the Amendment Act, 2005 as . . ... well as requirement of Regularization Act, 2009, they were entitled to ...... same and similar treatment as meted out to other similarly placed colleagues of the respondents. Objection that vacancies are not available would be invalid because it is within the power of the Provincial Government to create/sanction additional posts in order to accommodate its contractual employees and to give affect to the

Amendment Act, 2005 and Regularization Act, 2009.

For the foregoing reasons, we find no force in these

<u>Corrigendum for Agriculture department notification no.soe (AD) 17-131/2004</u> Dated 03-7-2013 in respect of date of Joining.

Dear Sir,

I am directed to refer to your Department's letter No.SOE(AD)17-131/2016 dated 15-02-2017 on the subject noted above and to state that the High Court has discussed two laws, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants (Amendment) Act, 2005 and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Employees (Regularization of Service) Act,2009 in its judgement/order dated 15-9-2011 in Writ Petition N.2877/2009 and other connected petitions. The High Court admitted in para-17 of the judgment, the supremacy/overriding effect of Regularization Act ,2009, over other laws and rules for the time being in force in light of Section-4-A of the Act ibid. It was further provided that any law or rule coming in conflict with the provisions of the Act shall cease to have effect. Thus, the regularization was to be made under the provisions of Regularization Act, 2009, which came into force on 24-10-2009 when it was published in the official Gazzette. Section-3 of the Act ibid has been reproduced in para-16 of the Judgement.

2. Therefore, the regularization Notification is to be made in accordance with the provisions of Regularization Act, 2009 from the date of initial continuous officiating appointment, subject to final verdict of Supreme Court as the cases of regularization of Project Employees, is subjudice in Apex Court in
