Counsel for the appellant present and heard. Contended that the appellant was promoted on 25.1.2010 as Section Officer (BPS-17) on acting charge basis but with immediate effect. He was promoted on regular basis on 12.12.2012. The appellant preferred a departmental appeal for the grant of ante-date promotion on 1.2.2012 from the date when he was promoted on acting charge basis but the same was rejected on 29.1.2013. Counsel for the appellant further contended that the appellant had earlier filed a writ petition which was decided on 22.11.2012 wherein, it was held that once the Supreme Court or the High Court enunciated a principle of law, then benefit of the same must be extended to all those similarly placed albeit they had not come to the court for seeking such relief. However, the writ petition was remanded to the respondent department for consideration. The department vide order dated 29.1.2013 refused the ante-date promotion of the appellant as being not covered under the rules. The learned counsel for the appellant in support of his arguments referred to this Tribunal judgment dated 13.3.2009 passed in Appeal No. 612/2008, Appeal No. 425/2005 by Abdul Latif, decided on 1.12.2005 and C.P No. 820/2004. 

Service Appeal U\Section 4 of the KPK Service Tribunal Act, 1974 against the office order dated 29.01.2013 passed by Respondent No.4 whereby the Departmental appeal of the appellant against the Notification dated 30-05-2011 issued by respondent no.1 whereby appellant services were regularized with immediate effect instead of giving antedate promotion to appellant from 25.01.2010 was regretted hence the instant appeal.

Prayer in Appeal; To set-aside the Notification dated 21-12-2011 passed by respondent no.1 whereby appellant services were regularized with immediate effect instead of giving ante-date promotion to appellant from 25.01.2010.

Grounds

A.That vested right have been accrued in favor of appellant for ante-date promotion when the authority has later on through order dated 30.05.2011 regularized the services of the appellant with immediate effect instead of giving promotion to the appellant from 25.01.2010 although posts were available that's why the appellant was promoted on 25.01.2010.

B. That it is an established principle of law that antedate promotion is given to civil servants aspiring for promotion after he is found fit for promotion and promoted against vacant post on acting charge basis and after some time his services are regularized immediate effect and by not regularizing the services of the appellant from the date when he has taken charge on acting charge basis therefore, the impugned notification is illegal and against the principal of nature justice.

C.That the respondents have not treated the Appellant in accordance with law and rules on the subject and acted in violation of article-4 and 25 of the constitution of Islamic republic of Pakistan, 1973 and unlawfully not given ante-date promotion to appellant which is unjust, unfair hence not sustainable in the eye of law.

D.That the fundamental rights of the appellant has been violated and by not extending the said benefit to the appellant is an illegal and without of lawful authority order passed by Respondent No.1 which is liable to be set aside.

E.That the Honourable apex court has already granted the above mentioned benefit to the other colleagues of the appellant on the same footing and the notification in this regard has already been issued however the appellant has been discriminated thus the impugned notification is liable to be set aside on this court alone.

F.That there cannot be two different scales for treating the some of the civil servants in one way and by extending to them the benefit of their regularization from the date of holding the charge on acting charge basis and leaving aside the other civil servants of the same category and being on the same footing by refusing them antedate promotion without any reasonable/plausible grounds.

G.That in similar facts and circumstances this honorable Tribunal was pleased to accept appeal of Muhammad Iqbal Khattak and the case of the appellant is at par with that case so the impugned order is illegal on this ground also.

For the aforesaid reasons it is, therefore, respectfully prayed that on acceptance this appeal, this honorable tribunal may be pleased to declare office orders dated 30.05.2011 passed by respondent no.1 to be null and void and thus cancelled and ante-date promotion be given to appellant from 25-01-2010.

Any other remedy not specifically asked for but appropriate in the circumstances of the case may also be awarded to the appellant.

PARAWISE COMMENTS ON BEHALF OF RESPONDENTS NO.1,2,3 & 4

PRELIMINARY OBJECTIONS:

- 1. That the appellant has got no cause of action/locus standi to file the instant appeal against he respondents.
- 2. That the appeal is not maintainable.
- 3. That the appellant has presented the facts in manipulated form which disentitles him for any relief whatsoever.
- 4. That the appeal is barred by law/time.
- 5. That this Honourable Tribunal lacks jurisdiction in the matter.
- 6. That the appellant has concealed material facts from the Tribunal.
- 7. That the appellant has not come to the Tribunal with clean hands.
- 8. That the appellant is estopped to file the instant appeal due to his own conduct.
- 9. That the appeal is bad for non-joinder of necessary party.
- 10. That the instant appeal is hit by Section 4(1) (b) of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Services Tribunal Act, 1974.

ON FACTS:

- 1. Pertains to record, hence no comments.
- Subject to proof.
- 3. Incorrect. The appellant was not promoted as Section Officer (BS-17) on acting charge basis rather he was appointed alongwith others as PMS BS-17 on acting charge basis vide Notification dated 25.01.2010.

- 4. Correct.
- 5. The departmental appeal of the appellant was processed and filed being not covered under the rules. Moreover, the writ petition No. 2707-P of 2012 which was treated as departmental appeal was also processed and was regretted by the competent authority being not covered under the rules. The appellants were informed accordingly.

ON GROUNDS

- A. Incorrect. The appellant has got no vested right for his ante-dated promotion w.e.f. 25.01.2010 as under the rules promotion is always with immediate effect and there were no posts of PMS BS-17 falling in the promotion share quota of Supdt: / PS.
- B. Incorrect. In December 2009, 18 posts of PMS BS-17 were available in the promotion share quota of appellant. However, appellant was at S.No. 29 of the panel and he was appointed as PMS BS-17 on acting charge basis against vacant posts of PMS BS-17 meant for initial recruitment under Section 9 (3) of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants (APT) Rules 1989(working paper, minutes of the meeting held on 15.12.2009 are at Annex-I & II). Similarly in May 2011, 11 posts were available in the promotion share quota of appellant and the appellant was at S. No. 08 and was considered for regular promotion to the post of PMS BS-17 and Notification was issued on 30.05.2011 (working paper, minutes of the meeting held on 27.05.2011 and Notification dated 30.05.2011 are at Annex-III, IV & V).
- C. Incorrect. The respondents acted according to law/rules.
- D. Incorrect. No fundamental right of the appellant has been violated. Moreover, the position has been explained in Para-B above.
- E. Incorrect. Each and every case has its own merits. Moreover, no discrimination has been made with the appellant and the impugned Notification is according to rules/law.
- F. Incorrect. As explained in the preceding Paras.
- G. Incorrect. The case of the appellant is not identical to the cases of those PMS BS-17 officers i.e. Muhammad Iqbal Khattak and others whose promotion was ante-dated from the date of occurrence of vacancies or the date of acting charge appointment whichever was later as there were vacancies available in the promotion share quota of PCS(EG) BS-17. While in December 2009, 18 posts of PMS BS-17 were available in the promotion share quota of appellant. However, appellant was at S.No. 29 of the panel and he was appointed as PMS BS-17 on acting charge basis against vacant posts of PMS BS-17 meant for initial recruitment under Section 9 (3) of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants (APT) Rules 1989. Similarly in May 2011, 11 posts were available in the promotion share quota of appellant and the appellant being at S.No.08 was considered for regular promotion to the post of PMS BS-17 and Notification was issued on 30.05.2011

It is, therefore, most humbly prayed that on acceptance of these parawise comments, the instant Appeal may very graciously be dismissed with costs.

Rejoinder on behalf of appellant

Preliminary objections;

1. All other preliminary objections have been taken in routine. The appellant is having a cause of action. The appeal is maintainable and true facts have been presented before the tribunal. The appeal is not time barred. This honorable tribunal is having jurisdiction in the matter and no facts have been concealed. The appellant has come to this honorable tribunal with clean hands. All the necessary parties have been arrayed as respondents and it has not been shown how the appellant is estopped by his conduct. The appeal is not hit by section 4(1) (b) of KPK Services Tribunal Act, 1974.

On Facts:

- 1. Para-1 of the reply needs no rejoinder.
- 2. In reply to para-2 it is stated that first appointment of the appellant is attached for ready reference.
- 3. Para-3 of the reply is refuted with all the forces at the command of the appellant. The appellant was promoted alongwith others to PMS BPS-17 on acting charge basis because clearly vacancies were available to the promotion quota of the appellant otherwise the Provincial Selection Board would not have promoted the appellant, because according to Rule-9 of APT Rules civil servant can be promoted to a higher post only if promotion quota post is available otherwise the initial post according to 14 of APT Rules 1989 can only be filled on adhoc basis (copy attached as Annexure-A).
- 4. Para-4&5 of the reply needs no rejoinder.



GROUNDS

Ground-A&B of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct. Vested rights have been accrued in favor of appellant. 434 vacancies in BPS-17were available in 2001 and the share\quota allocated to each cadre as mentioned in the working paper placed before the Provincial Selection Board for

consideration in its meeting held on 09 01 2008 was as under-

87 posts in BPS-17 were vacant in 2001 while about 64 posts of S.Os BPS-17 caused vacant before 25.01.2010 on account of retirement and promotion of SOs (BPS-17) to the post of Deputy Secretaries BPS-18. Copy attached as Annexure-B.

Keeping in view the aforesaid explanation, 64 further posts in BPS-17 were made available in promotion quota while the appellant was shown at S.No._____ of the panel and it is pertinent to mention here that as per circular letter No. SORI(S&GAD)1-29/75 (a), dated 13-2-1993 appeared at Page-79 of Esta Code, no appointment to higher post on acting charge basis can be made. However, against the posts meant for initial quota, adhoc appointment can be made for a period not exceeding one year under Rule-14 of Civil Servants (APT) Rules, 1989. Hence, appointment on acting charge basis instead of regular basis is illegal and based on malafide intention.

The respondent department has filled in the vacancies meant for initial quota on regular basis through Public Service Commission, filled the vacancies meant for promotion of Tehsildars on regular basis through PSB as well as through judgment of Supreme Court of Pakistan but unfortunately filled the vacancies meant for promotion of Superintendents/Private Secretaries on acting charges basis instead of regular basis in violation of rules and judgment of Supreme Court of Pakistan as mentioned above.

- B. Ground-C of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct.
- C. Ground -D of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct.
- D. Ground-E of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct. The appellant has been discriminated.
- E. Ground-F of the reply is incorrect and that of the petition is correct.

F. Ground-G of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct. Further the position has been explained in reply to ground-A&B.

The Provincial Government has promoted many officers to next higher grades with retrospective effect. The following few cases are quoted as examples:-

- 1. Mr.Khalid Khan Umerzai has been promoted to BPS-20 post with retrospective effect vide Notification No.SO(E-I)S&GAD/4-2/2007 dated 3-11-2007.
- Mr.Umer Hayat, Director Fisheries has been promoted to BPS-19 with retrospective effect vide Notification No.SO(E-I)/S&GAD/9-112/2010 dated 10-05-2010.
- 19 Superintendents/Private Secretaries have been promoted to B-17 vide Notification No.SOS-II(S&GAD)3(122)/92 dated 10-7-1995.
- 62 Tehsildars have been promoted to BPS-17 with retrospective effect vide Notification No.SOE-II(ED)2(423)/2010 dated 25-7-2012.

Copies of the notifications attached as Annexure-C,D,E & F.

The post was available in promotion quota of the appellant against which he had been appointed on acting charge basis instead of regular basis. The Supreme Court of Pakistan has already decided a similar law point in an identical case in C.As. Nos.860 and 861 of 2010 that "there is also no dispute with the proposition that if the respondents were to hold a post on acting charge basis, they could also hold the same on regular basis".

It is therefore respectfully prayed that while considering the above rejoinder the appeal may kindly be accepted.



Statutory provision regarding Appointment.

Section 5 of Civil Servants Act. 1973 - Appointment to a civil service of the Province or to a civil post in connection with the affairs of the Province shall be made in the prescribed manner by the Governor or by a person authorised by the Governor in that behalf.

THE NORTH-WEST FRONTIER PROVINCE CIVIL SERVANTS (APPOINTMENT, PROMOTION & TRANSFER) RULES, 1989.

PART-I

GENERAL

- 1. Short title and commencement: (1) These rules may be called the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989.
 - (2) They shall come into force at once.
- 2. **Definitions:-(1)** In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires:-
 - (a) "Appointing Authority" in relation to a post, means the persons authorized under rule 4 to make appointment to that post;
 - (b) "Basic Pay Scale" means the Basic Pay Scale for the time being sanctioned by Government, in which a post or a group of posts is placed;
 - (c) "Commission" means the North West Frontier Province Public Service Commission;
 - ²⁹ (d) "Departmental Promotion Committee" means a committee constituted for making selection for promotion or transfer to such posts under a Department, or offices of Government, which do not fall within the purview of the Provincial Selection Board;
 - 30 (dd)"Departmental Selection Board" means a Board constituted for the purpose of making selection for initial recruitment /appointment to posts under a Department or office of Government in Basic Pay Scale 17 not falling within the purview of the Commission:

Provided that more than one such committees may be constituted for civil servants holding different scales of pay".

- (e) "Departmental Selection Committee" means a committee constituted for the purpose of making selection for initial appointment to posts under a department, or office of Government [in Basic Pay Scale 17 and below not falling within the purview of the Commission];
- (f) "Post" means a post sanctioned in connection with the affairs of the Province, but not allocated to all Pakistan Unified Grades; and
- ³¹(g) "Provincial Selection Board" means the Board constituted by Government for the purpose of selection of civil servants for promotion or transfer to posts in respect

whereof the appointing authority under rule 4 is the Chief Minister and shall consist of such persons as may be appointed to it by Government from time to time.

- (2) Words and expressions used but not defined in these rules shall have the same meanings as are assigned to them in the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act,1973(N.W.F.P act XVIII of 1973) or any other statutory order or rules of Government for the time being in force.
- 3. Method of Appointment:- (1) Appointment to posts shall be made by any of the following methods, namely:-
 - (a) by promotion or transfer in accordance with the provisions contained in Part-II of these rules; and
 - (b) by initial recruitment in accordance with the provisions contained in Part-III of these rules.
 - (2) The method of appointment, qualifications and other conditions applicable to a post shall be such as laid down by the Department concerned in consultation with the Services and General Administration Department and the Finance Department.
- 4. **Appointing Authority:-** The authorities competent to make appointment to posts in various basic pay scales shall be as follows:-

- 3. Posts in Basic Pay Scales 3 to 15.
 - (a) In the case of civil Servants borne on ministerial establishment of Civil Courts subordinate to High Court, the officer authorized as such by the Chief Justice; and
 - (b) In other cases
 - (i) an officer declared under the relevant Delegation of Powers Rules, which shall to this extent be deemed as operative; or
 - (ii) Where no such appointing authority has been declared, the Secretary to Government or the Head of an Attached Department/ Office, as the case may be.
- 4. Posts in Basic Pay Scale 1 and 2. Deputy Secretary incharge of Administration or office, as the case may be.
- 5. ³³Departmental Promotion & Selection Committee/Board (1) In each Department or office of Government there shall be one or more Departmental Promotion Committee and Departmental Selection Committee ³⁴(or, as the case may be, Departmental Selection Board), the composition of which shall be determined by the Services and General Administration Department or the Department in consultation with the Services and General Administration Department.
- (2) Each such Committee (or the Board, as the case may be), shall consist of at least three members, one of whom shall be appointed as Chairman.
- Procedure when recommendation is not accepted: When an appointing authority for Basic Pay Scale 17 or below does not accept the recommendation of a Departmental Promotion or Selection Committee, or the Departmental Selection Board, as the case may be, it shall record its reasons and obtain order of the next higher authority.

PART-II

APPOINTMENT BY PROMOTION OR TRANSFER

- 7. **Appointment by Promotion or Transfer.** ³⁶(1) Except as otherwise provided in any service rules for the time being in force, appointment by promotion or transfer to posts in respect whereof the appointing authority under rule 4 is the Chief Minister shall ordinarily be made on the recommendation of the Provincial Selection Board and promotion and transfer to posts other than those falling within the purview of the Provincial Selection Board shall ordinarily be made on the recommendation of appropriate Departmental Promotion Committee".
- (2) Appointment by transfer shall be made from amongst the persons holding appointment on regular basis in the same basic pay scale, in which the posts to be filled, exist.
- (3) Persons possessing such qualifications and fulfilling such conditions as laid down for the purpose of promotion or transfer to a post shall be considered by the Departmental Promotion Committee or the Provincial Selection Board for promotion or transfer, as the case may be.
- (4) No promotion on regular basis shall be made to posts in Basic Pay Scale 18 to 21 unless the officer concerned has completed such minimum length of service as may be specified from time to time.
- 8. Inter-Provincial Transfer:-(1) Persons holding appointment in BPS 1 to 15 under Federal Government and other Provincial Government may, in deserving cases, be transferred to equivalent posts under these rules:-

Provided that:-

- the Federal Government or the Government of the Province concerned, as the case may be, has no objection to such a transfer;
- the person seeking transfer possesses the requisite qualification and experience and the post to which his transfer is intended can, under the rules, be filled by transfer;
- (iii) the person concerned holds appointment to the post in his parent Department on regular basis;
- (iv) the person concerned is a bona fide resident of the North-West Frontier Province.
- (v) a vacancy exists to accommodate the request for such a transfer; and:
- (vi) Provided further that in most deserving cases, the merit of which shall be determined on case to case basis and the decision of the Competent Authority in that behalf shall be final, Government may allow transfer of a civil servant in BPS-16 and above, subject to the aforesaid conditions.
- (2) A person so transferred shall be placed at the bottom of the cadre strength which he joins for the purpose of determining his seniority vis-à-vis other members borne on the cadre.

Sub rule (1) substituted by Notification No. SOR-I(S&GAD)4-1/80/II, dated 14-01-1992.

- (3) It will be the sole discretion of the appointing authority to accept or refuse a request for transfer under this rule and any decision made in this behalf shall be final and shall not be quoted as precedence in any other case.
- 9. Appointment on Acting Charge or current Charge Basis. (1) Where the appointing authority considered it to be in the public interest to fill a post reserved under the rules for departmental promotion and the most senior civil servant belonging to the cadre or service concerned, who is otherwise eligible for promotion, does not possess the specified length of service the authority may appoint him to that post on acting charge basis;

³⁷Provided that no such appointment shall be made, if the prescribed length of service is short by more than ³⁸[three years].

- (2) So long as a civil servant holds the acting charge appointment, a civil servant junior to him shall not be considered for regular promotion but may be appointed on acting charge basis to a higher post.
- (3) In the case of a post in Basic Pay Scale 17 and above, reserved under the rules to be filled in by initial recruitment, where the appointing authority is satisfied that no suitable officer drawing pay in the basic scale in which the post exists is available in that category to fill the post and it is expedient to fill the post, it may appoint to that post on acting charge basis the most senior officer otherwise eligible for promotion in the organization, cadre or service, as the case may be, in excess of the promotion quota.
- (4) Acting charge appointment shall be made against posts which are likely to fall vacant for period of six months or more. Against vacancies occurring for less than six months, current charge appointment may be made according to the orders issued from time to time
- (5) Appointment on acting charge basis shall be made on the recommendations of the Departmental Promotion Committee or the Provincial Selection Board, as the case may be.
- (6) Acting charge appointment shall not confer any vested right for regular promotion to the post held on acting charge basis.

PART-III

INITIAL APPOINTMENT

- 10. Appointment by Initial Recruitment:-(1) Initial appointment to posts ³⁹ [in various basic pay scales] shall be made-9
 - (a) if the post falls within the purview of the Commission, on the basis of Examination or test to be conducted by the Commission; or

- (3) A candidate for initial appointment to a post must possess the educational qualification or technical qualifications and experience and except as provided in the rules framed for the purpose of relaxation of age limit, must be within the age limit as laid down for the post, provided that-
 - (i) 45 where recruitment is to be made on the basis of written examination, then, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other rules for the time being inforce, age shall be reckoned on 1st January of the year in which the examination is proposed to be held;
 - (ii) in other cases as on the last date fixed for submission of applications for appointment.
- ⁴⁶(4) Where a civil servant dies during service, then notwithstanding the procedure provided for in sub-rule (2), the appointing authority may appoint one of the children of such civil servant, or if the child has not attained the age prescribed for appointment in Government service, the widow of such civil servant, to a post in any of the Basic Pay Scales 1 to 15:

Provided that the child or the widow, as the case may be, possesses the minimum qualification prescribed for appointment to the post:

Provided further that if there are two widows of the deceased civil servant, preference shall be given to the elder widow:

- (5) No candidate shall be appointed to a post unless he is found, after such medical examination as Government may prescribe, to be in good mental and bodily health and free from physical defect likely to interfere in the efficient discharge of his duties.
- 12. **Zonal and Divisional representation:** (1) Except as otherwise specifically provided in any rule for the time being in force, initial recruitment to posts in Basic Pay Scales 16 and 17 and other posts in Basic Pay Scales 3 to 15 borne on Provincial cadre shall be made in accordance with the Zonal quota specified by Government from time to time:

Si Provided that initial recruitment to the post of Civil Judge/Judicial Magistrate/Allaqa Qazi (BPS-18) shall also be made in accordance with the zonal quota specified by the Government from time to time.

- (2) Initial recruitment to posts in Basic Pay Scales 3 to 15 borne on divisional or district cadre shall be made from amongst bona fide residents of the division or district concerned, as the case may be.
- (3) Initial recruitment to posts in Basic Pay Scales 1 and 2 or equivalent shall ordinarily be made on local basis.

PART-IV

AD HOC APPOINTMENT

- Requisition to Commission:-When under any rule for the time being in force, a post is required to be filled in through the Commission, the appointing authority shall forward a requisition on the prescribed form to the Commission immediately after it is decided to fill in the post, or if that is not practicable and the post is filled on ad hoc basis as provided in rule 14, within two months of the filling of the post.
- 14. Ad hoc Appointment:-(1) When the appointing authority considers it to be in the public interest to fill in a post falling within the purview of the Commission urgently, it may, pending nomination of a candidate by the Commission, proceed to fill in such post on ad hoc basis for a period not exceeding ⁵²[one year] by advertising the same in accordance with the procedure laid down for initial appointment in Part-III of these rules.
- (2) Short term vacancies in the posts falling within the purview of the Commission and vacancies occurring as a result of creation of temporary posts for a period not exceeding ⁵³[one year], may be filled in by appointing authority otherwise than through the Commission on a purely temporary basis after advertising the vacancy.

PART-V

PROBATION AND CONFIRMATION

- ⁵⁴15. <u>Probation.</u> ---- (1) Persons appointed to posts by initial recruitment, promotion or transfer shall be on probation for a period of one year.
- (2) The appointing authority, if considers necessary, may extend the probation period for one year as may be specified at the time of appointment.
- (3) On the successful completion of probation period, the appointing authority shall, by specific order, terminate the probation:

Provided that if no specific order is issued on the expiry of the first year of probation period, the period of probation shall be deemed to have been extended under sub-rule (2):

Provided further that if no specific order is issued on the expiry of the extended period of probation, the period of probation shall be deemed to have been successfully completed.

16. Confirmation:-After satisfactory completion of the probationary period, a civil servant shall be confirmed; provided that he holds a substantive post, provided further that a civil servant shall not be deemed to have satisfactorily completed his period of probation, if he has failed to pass an examination, test or course or has failed to complete successfully a training prescribed within the meaning of sub-section (3) of Section 6 of the North West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973.

PART-VI

SENIORITY

- 17. Seniority:-(1) the seniority inter se of civil servants ⁵⁵(appointed to a service, cadre or post) shall be determined:
 - in the case of persons appointed by initial recruitment, in accordance with the order of merit assigned by the Commission ⁵⁶[or as the case may be, the Departmental Selection Committee;] provided that persons selected for appointment to post in an earlier selection shall rank senior to the persons selected in a later selection; and
 - (b) in the case of civil servants appointed otherwise, with reference to the date of their continuous regular appointment in the post; provided that civil servants selected for promotion to a higher post in one batch shall, on their promotion to the higher post, retain their inter se seniority as in the lower post.

Explanation-I:- If a junior person in a lower post is promoted to a higher post temporarily in the public interest, even though continuing later permanently in the higher

post, it would not adversely effect the interest of his seniors in fixation of his seniority in the higher post.

Explanation-II: If a junior person in a lower post is promoted to a higher post by superseding a senior person and subsequently that senior person is also promoted the person promoted first shall rank senior to the person promoted subsequently; provided that junior person shall not be deemed to have superseded a senior person if the case of the senior person is deferred for the time being for want of certain information or for incomplete record or for any other reason not attributing to his fault or demerit.

Explanation-III:- A junior person shall be deemed to have superseded a senior person only if both the junior and the senior persons were considered for the higher post and the junior person was appointed in preference to the senior person.

- (2) Seniority in various cadres of civil servants appointed by initial recruitment vis-à-vis those appointed otherwise shall be determined with reference to the dates of their regular appointment to a post in that cadre; provided that if two dates are the same, the person appointed otherwise shall rank senior to the person appointed by initial recruitment.
- ⁵⁷(3) In the event of merger/restructuring of the Departments, Attached Departments or Subordinate Offices, the inter se seniority of civil servants affected by the merger/restructuring as aforesaid shall be determined in accordance with the date of their regular appointment to a cadre or post.
- The inter-se-seniority of civil servants in a certain cadre to which promotion is made from different lower posts, carrying the same pay scale shall be determined from the date of regular appointment/promotion of the civil servants in the lower post.

Provided that if the date of regular appointment of two or more civil servants in the lower post is the same, the civil servant older in age, shall be treated senior.

- 18. General Rules: In all matters not expressly provided for in these rules, civil servants shall be governed by such rules as have been or may hereafter be prescribed by Government and made applicable to them.
- 19. Repeal:- The North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1975, are hereby repealed.

Appointment by transfer.

l am directed to say that rule 7 of the NWFP Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989, provides that appointment by transfer to posts should be made:

(1) to posts in BPS-2 to 16 on the recommendations of the appropriate Departmental Promotion Committee;

(2) to posts in BPS-17 and above on the recommendations of the Provincial Selection Board; and

(3) from amongst the persons possessing qualifications and other conditions prescribed for the posts and holding appointment on regular basis in the same basic pay scale in which the posts to be filled exist.

It has been brought to notice that in some of the departments, appointment by transfer is also made in cases where no provision for appointment by transfer exists in the relevant service/recruitment rules.

I am accordingly directed to clarify that the above provisions regarding appointment by transfer are applicable in only those cases where the appointment by transfer is specifically provided for in the relevant service/recruitment rules or in the method of appointment, qualification etc laid down for each post under sub-rule (2) of rule 3 of the aforesaid rules.

CHIEF SECRETARY KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA

Posting of Junior Officers on Posts in Higher Scale

This Department's Circular letter No.SORI(S&GAD)1-29/75(A), dated 13.2.1993, on the subject noted above and to state that it has been noticed that certain Provincial Government Departments are resorting to the practice of posting officers in a lower scale on posts in higher scales. This practice is against the provisions of NWFP Civil Servants Act,1973 and rules made thereunder as well as the instructions of the Establishment Division reproduced below:-

"The grant of higher appointments to junior officers against senior posts amounts to accelerated promotion in view of the decision given by the Supreme Court of Pakistan in the case of Government of Pakistan Versus Qazi Abdul Karim. The Ministries/Divisions or Provincial Governments can only fill vacancies in a particular grade by officers of the same grade, and officers in a junior grade will not be appointed against a vacancy in a higher grade".

2. It may be pointed out that in the light of rule 9 of the NWFP Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989, the methods prescribed for posting a junior officer to a higher post are restricted to the following only:-

i) ACTING CHARGE APPOINTMENT AGAINST A HIGHER POST

Where the senior most officer in a cadre is otherwise fully eligible for promotion but does not possess the specified length of service, the competent authority may appoint him to the higher post on acting charge basis, but only on the recommendation of Departmental Promotion Committee/Selection Board and subject to the condition that such officer lacks the prescribed length of service not more than (one year).

ii) <u>CURRENT CHARGE APPOINTMENT OF A HIGHER POST</u>

Only the senior-most officer of a cadre can be given current charge appointment of a higher post with the approval of the competent authority. However, this can only be an arrangement upto a maximum of six months.

iii) . ADDITIONAL CHARGE APPOINTMENT OF AN EQUIVALENT POST

An officer can be given the additional charge of a second post but only of a post in an equivalent grade, upto a period of six months by the competent authority.

- 3. Adherence to the above rules is a legal requirement so that the actions taken by officers are not held at any stage to be irregular. Also, appointments in violation of the rules constitute administrative indiscipline.
- 4. I am, therefore, directed to request that all such cases of irregular appointments be reviewed and ensure not to resort to such appointments that violate the provisions of the Civil Servants Act and the statutory rules framed thereunder.
- 5. I am further directed to request that these instructions may be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.

Rejoinder on behalf of appellant

Preliminary objections;

1. All other preliminary objections have been taken in routine. The appellant is having a cause of action. The appeal is maintainable and true facts have been presented before the tribunal. The appeal is not time barred. This honorable tribunal is having jurisdiction in the matter and no facts have been concealed. The appellant has come to this honorable tribunal with clean hands. All the necessary parties have been arrayed as respondents and it has not been shown how the appellant is estopped by his conduct. The appeal is not hit by section 4(1) (b) of KPK Services Tribunal Act, 1974.

On Facts;

- 1. Para-1 of the reply needs no rejoinder.
- 2. In reply to para-2 it is stated that first appointment of the appellant is attached for ready reference.
- 3. Para-3 of the reply is refuted with all the forces at the command of the appellant. The appellant was promoted alongwith others to PMS BPS-17 on acting charge basis because clearly vacancies were available to the promotion quota of the appellant otherwise the Provincial Selection Board would not have promoted the appellant, because according to Rule-9 of APT Rules civil servant can be promoted to a higher post only if promotion quota post is available otherwise the initial post according to 14 of APT Rules 1989 can only be filled on adhoc basis (copy attached as Annexure-A).
- 4. Para-4&5 of the reply needs no rejoinder.

« GROUNDS

A. Ground-A&B of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct. Vested rights have been accrued in favor of appellant. 434 vacancies in BPS-17were available in 2001 and the share\quota allocated to each cadre as mentioned in the working paper placed before the Provincial Selection Board for

consideration in its meeting held on 09.01.2008 was as under:

87 posts in BPS-17 were vacant in 2001 while about 64 posts of S.Os BPS-17 caused vacant before 25.01.2010 on account of retirement and promotion of SOs (BPS-17) to the post of Deputy Secretaries BPS-18. Copy attached as Annexure-B.

Keeping in view the aforesaid explanation, 64 further posts in BPS-17 were made available in promotion quota while the appellant was shown at S.No.____ of the panel and it is pertinent to mention here that as per circular letter No. SORI(S&GAD)1-29/75 (a), dated 13-2-1993 appeared at Page-79 of Esta Code, no appointment to higher post on acting charge basis can be made. However, against the posts meant for initial quota, adhoc appointment can be made for a period not exceeding one year under Rule-14 of Civil Servants (APT) Rules, 1989. Hence, appointment on acting charge basis instead of regular basis is illegal and based on malafide intention.

The respondent department has filled in the vacancies meant for initial quota on regular basis through Public Service Commission, filled the vacancies meant for promotion of Tehsildars on regular basis through PSB as well as through judgment of Supreme Court of Pakistan but unfortunately filled the vacancies meant for promotion of Superintendents/Private Secretaries on acting charges basis instead of regular basis in violation of rules and judgment of Supreme Court of Pakistan as mentioned above.

- B. Ground-C of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct.
- C. Ground -D of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct.
- D. Ground-E of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct. The appellant has been discriminated.
- E. Ground-F of the reply is incorrect and that of the petition is correct.

F. Ground-G of the reply is incorrect and that of the appeal is correct. Further the position has been explained in reply to ground-A&B.

The Provincial Government has promoted many officers to next higher grades with retrospective effect. The following few cases are quoted as examples:

- Mr.Khalid Khan Umerzai has been promoted to BPS-20 post with retrospective effect vide Notification No.SO(E-I)S&GAD/4-2/2007 dated 3-11-2007.
- 2. Mr.Umer Hayat, Director Fisheries has been promoted to BPS-19 with retrospective effect vide Notification No.SO(E-I)/S&GAD/9-112/2010 dated 10-05-2010.
- 3. 19 Superintendents/Private Secretaries have been promoted to B-17 vide Notification No.SOS-II(S&GAD)3(122)/92 dated 10-7-1995.
- 4. 62 Tehsildars have been promoted to BPS-17 with retrospective effect vide Notification No.SOE-II(ED)2(423)/2010 dated 25-7-2012.

The post was available in promotion quota of the appellant against which he had been appointed on acting charge basis instead of regular basis. The Supreme Court of Pakistan has already decided a similar law point in an identical case in C.As. Nos.860 and 861 of 2010 that "there is also no dispute with the proposition that if the respondents were to hold a post on acting charge basis, they could also hold the same on regular basis".

It is therefore respectfully prayed that while considering the above rejoinder the appeal may kindly be accepted.

Statutory provision regarding Appointment.

Amorause A

Section 5 of Civil Servants Act, 1973 - Appointment to a civil service of the Province or to a civil post in connection with the affairs of the Province shall be made in the prescribed manner by the Governor or by a person authorised by the Governor in that behalf.

THE NORTH-WEST FRONTIER PROVINCE CIVIL SERVANTS (APPOINTMENT, PROMOTION & TRANSFER) RULES, 1989.

PART-I

GENERAL

- 1. Short title and commencement: (1) These rules may be called the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989.
 - (2) They shall come into force at once.
- 2. **Definitions:-(1)** In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires:-
 - (a) "Appointing Authority" in relation to a post, means the persons authorized under rule 4 to make appointment to that post;
 - (b) "Basic Pay Scale" means the Basic Pay Scale for the time being sanctioned by Government, in which a post or a group of posts is placed;
 - (c) "Commission" means the North West Frontier Province Public Service Commission;
- ²⁹ (d) "Departmental Promotion Committee" means a committee constituted for making selection for promotion or transfer to such posts under a Department, or offices of Government, which do not fall within the purview of the Provincial Selection Board;
- 30 (dd)"Departmental Selection Board" means a Board constituted for the purpose of making selection for initial recruitment /appointment to posts under a Department or office of Government in Basic Pay Scale 17 not falling within the purview of the Commission:

Provided that more than one such committees may be constituted for civil servants holding different scales of pay".

- (e) "Departmental Selection Committee" means a committee constituted for the purpose of making selection for initial appointment to posts under a department, or office of Government [in Basic Pay Scale 17 and below not falling within the purview of the Commission];
- (f) "Post" means a post sanctioned in connection with the affairs of the Province, but not allocated to all Pakistan Unified Grades; and
- ³¹(g) "Provincial Selection Board" means the Board constituted by Government for the purpose of selection of civil servants for promotion or transfer to posts in respect

- (2) Words and expressions used but not defined in these rules shall have the same meanings as are assigned to them in the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act,1973(N.W.F.P act XVIII of 1973) or any other statutory order or rules of Government for the time being in force.
- 3. Method of Appointment:- (1) Appointment to posts shall be made by any of the following methods, namely:-
 - (a) by promotion or transfer in accordance with the provisions contained in Part-II of these rules; and
 - (b) by initial recruitment in accordance with the provisions contained in Part-III of these rules.
 - (2) The method of appointment, qualifications and other conditions applicable to a post shall be such as laid down by the Department concerned in consultation with the Services and General Administration Department and the Finance Department.
- 4. Appointing Authority:- The authorities competent to make appointment to posts in various basic pay scales shall be as follows:-

PART-II



APPOINTMENT BY PROMOTION OR TRANSFER

- Appointment by Promotion or Transfer. ³⁶(1) Except as otherwise provided in any service rules for the time being in force, appointment by promotion or transfer to posts in respect whereof the appointing authority under rule 4 is the Chief Minister shall ordinarily be made on the recommendation of the Provincial Selection Board and promotion and transfer to posts other than those falling within the purview of the Provincial Selection Board shall ordinarily be made on the recommendation of appropriate Departmental Promotion Committee".
- (2) Appointment by transfer shall be made from amongst the persons holding appointment on regular basis in the same basic pay scale, in which the posts to be filled, exist.
- (3) Persons possessing such qualifications and fulfilling such conditions as laid down for the purpose of promotion or transfer to a post shall be considered by the Departmental Promotion Committee or the Provincial Selection Board for promotion or transfer, as the case may be.
- (4) No promotion on regular basis shall be made to posts in Basic Pay Scale 18 to 21 unless the officer concerned has completed such minimum length of service as may be specified from time to time.
- 8. Inter-Provincial Transfer:-(1) Persons holding appointment in BPS 1 to 15 under Federal Government and other Provincial Government may, in deserving cases, be transferred to equivalent posts under these rules:-

Provided that:-

- (i) the Federal Government or the Government of the Province concerned, as the case may be, has no objection to such a transfer;
- the person seeking transfer possesses the requisite qualification and experience and the post to which his transfer is intended can, under the rules, be filled by transfer;
- (iii) the person concerned holds appointment to the post in his parent Department on regular basis;
- (iv) the person concerned is a bona fide resident of the North-West Frontier Province.
- (v) a vacancy exists to accommodate the request for such a transfer; and:
- (vi) Provided further that in most deserving cases, the merit of which shall be determined on case to case basis and the decision of the Competent Authority in that behalf shall be final, Government may allow transfer of a civil servant in BPS-16 and above, subject to the aforesaid conditions.
- (2) A person so transferred shall be placed at the bottom of the cadre strength which he joins for the purpose of determining his seniority vis-à-vis other members borne on the cadre.

- (3) It will be the sole discretion of the appointing authority to accept or refuse a request for transfer under this rule and any decision made in this behalf shall be final and shall not be quoted as precedence in any other case.
- 9. Appointment on Acting Charge or current Charge Basis. (1) Where the appointing authority considered it to be in the public interest to fill a post reserved under the rules for departmental promotion and the most senior civil servant belonging to the cadre or service concerned, who is otherwise eligible for promotion, does not possess the specified length of service the authority may appoint him to that post on acting charge basis;

³⁷Provided that no such appointment shall be made, if the prescribed length of service is short by more than ³⁸[three years].

- (2) So long as a civil servant holds the acting charge appointment, a civil servant junior to him shall not be considered for regular promotion but may be appointed on acting charge basis to a higher post.
- (3) In the case of a post in Basic Pay Scale 17 and above, reserved under the rules to be filled in by initial recruitment, where the appointing authority is satisfied that no suitable officer drawing pay in the basic scale in which the post exists is available in that category to fill the post and it is expedient to fill the post, it may appoint to that post on acting charge basis the most senior officer otherwise eligible for promotion in the organization, cadre or service, as the case may be, in excess of the promotion quota.
- (4) Acting charge appointment shall be made against posts which are likely to fall vacant for period of six months or more. Against vacancies occurring for less than six months, current charge appointment may be made according to the orders issued from time to time.
- (5) Appointment on acting charge basis shall be made on the recommendations of the Departmental Promotion Committee or the Provincial Selection Board, as the case may be.
- (6) Acting charge appointment shall not confer any vested right for regular promotion to the post held on acting charge basis.

PART-III

INITIAL APPOINTMENT

- 10. Appointment by Initial Recruitment:-(1) Initial appointment to posts ³⁹[in various basic pay scales] shall be made-9
 - (a) if the post falls within the purview of the Commission, on the basis of Examination or test to be conducted by the Commission; or

eligible for appointment in more than one post, he/she shall ordinarily be appointed to the post carrying higher pay scale.

⁴⁷(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in any rule for the time being in force, two percent of all posts in each basic pay scale to be filled in by initial recruitment shall be reserved for disabled candidates and ten percent of all posts meant for initial recruitment shall be reserved for female candidates:

Explanation-I---For the purpose of reservation under this sub-rule "disability" does not include such disability which hampers in the smooth performance of the duties required of a disabled candidate.

Explanation-II---Ten per cent quota reserved above shall be in addition to the posts exclusively reserved for female candidates.

- ⁴⁹(7) Notwithstanding anything contained in any rule for the time being in force, 0.5 percent of all the posts in each basic pay scale to be filled in by initial recruitment shall be reserved for candidates belonging to minorities in addition to their participation in the open merit:

Provided that, the reservation shall not apply to-

- (i) the percentage of vacancies reserved for recruitment on merit;
- (ii) short term vacancies likely to last for less than one year; and
- (iii) isolated posts in which vacancies occur only occasionally.
- 11. Eligibility. (1) A candidate for appointment shall be a citizen of Pakistan and bona fide resident of the North-West Frontier Province.

Provided that for reasons to be recorded in writing, Government may, in a particular case, relax this restriction.

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- (3) No person, not already in Government service, shall be appointed to a post unless he produces a certificate of character from the principal, academic officer of the academic institution last attended and also certificates of character from two responsible persons, not being his relatives, who are well acquainted with his character and antecedents.
- (4) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-rule (3), an appointment by initial recruitment shall be subject to the verification of character and antecedents of the candidate or the person appointed, to the satisfaction of appointing authority.

- (5) No candidate shall be appointed to a post unless he is found, after such medical examination as Government may prescribe, to be in good mental and bodily health and free from physical defect likely to interfere in the efficient discharge of his duties.
- 12. Zonal and Divisional representation: (1) Except as otherwise specifically provided in any rule for the time being in force, initial recruitment to posts in Basic Pay Scales 16 and 17 and other posts in Basic Pay Scales 3 to 15 borne on Provincial cadre shall be made in accordance with the Zonal quota specified by Government from time to time:

⁵¹Provided that initial recruitment to the post of Civil Judge/Judicial Magistrate/Allaqa Qazi (BPS-18) shall also be made in accordance with the zonal quota specified by the Government from time to time.

- (2) Initial recruitment to posts in Basic Pay Scales 3 to 15 borne on divisional or district cadre shall be made from amongst bona fide residents of the division or district concerned, as the case may be.
- (3) Initial recruitment to posts in Basic Pay Scales 1 and 2 or equivalent shall ordinarily be made on local basis.

PART-IV

AD HOC APPOINTMENT

- 13. Requisition to Commission:-When under any rule for the time being in force, a post is required to be filled in through the Commission, the appointing authority shall forward a requisition on the prescribed form to the Commission immediately after it is decided to fill in the post, or if that is not practicable and the post is filled on ad hoc basis as provided in rule 14, within two months of the filling of the post.
- 14. Ad hoc Appointment:-(1) When the appointing authority considers it to be in the public interest to fill in a post falling within the purview of the Commission urgently, it may, pending nomination of a candidate by the Commission, proceed to fill in such post on ad hoc basis for a period not exceeding ⁵²[one year] by advertising the same in accordance with the procedure laid down for initial appointment in Part-III of these rules.
- (2) Short term vacancies in the posts falling within the purview of the Commission and vacancies occurring as a result of creation of temporary posts for a period not exceeding ⁵³[one year], may be filled in by appointing authority otherwise than through the Commission on a purely temporary basis after advertising the vacancy.

PART-V

PROBATION AND CONFIRMATION

- ⁵⁴15. Probation. ---- (1) Persons appointed to posts by initial recruitment, promotion or transfer shall be on probation for a period of one year.
- The appointing authority, if considers necessary, may extend the probation period for one year as may be specified at the time of appointment.
- On the successful completion of probation period, the appointing authority shall, by specific order, terminate the probation:

Provided that if no specific order is issued on the expiry of the first year of probation period, the period of probation shall be deemed to have been extended under sub-rule (2):

Provided further that if no specific order is issued on the expiry of the extended period of probation, the period of probation shall be deemed to have been successfully completed.

Confirmation:-After satisfactory completion of the probationary period, a civil servant shall be confirmed; provided that he holds a substantive post, provided further that a civil servant shall not be deemed to have satisfactorily completed his period of probation, if he has failed to pass an examination, test or course or has failed to complete successfully a training prescribed within the meaning of sub-section (3) of Section 6 of the North West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973.

PART-VI

SENIORITY

- 17. Seniority:-(1) the seniority inter se of civil servants 55 (appointed to a service, cadre or post) shall be determined:
 - in the case of persons appointed by initial recruitment, in accordance with the (a) order of merit assigned by the Commission 56 [or as the case may be, the Selection Committee;] provided that persons selected for appointment to post in an earlier selection shall rank senior to the persons selected in a later selection; and
 - in the case of civil servants appointed otherwise, with reference to the date of (b) their continuous regular appointment in the post; provided that civil servants selected for promotion to a higher post in one batch shall, on their promotion to the higher post, retain their inter se seniority as in the lower post.

Explanation-I:- If a junior person in a lower post is promoted to a higher post temporarily in the public interest, even though continuing later permanently in the higher

post, it would not adversely effect the interest of his seniors in fixation of his seniority in the higher post.

Explanation-II:- If a junior person in a lower post is promoted to a higher post by superseding a senior person and subsequently that senior person is also promoted the person promoted first shall rank senior to the person promoted subsequently; provided that junior person shall not be deemed to have superseded a senior person if the case of the senior person is deferred for the time being for want of certain information or for incomplete record or for any other reason not attributing to his fault or demerit.

Explanation-III: A junior person shall be deemed to have superseded a senior person only if both the junior and the senior persons were considered for the higher post and the junior person was appointed in preference to the senior person.

- (2) Seniority in various cadres of civil servants appointed by initial recruitment vis-à-vis those appointed otherwise shall be determined with reference to the dates of their regular appointment to a post in that cadre; provided that if two dates are the same, the person appointed otherwise shall rank senior to the person appointed by initial recruitment.
- Departments or Subordinate Offices, the inter se seniority of civil servants affected by the merger/restructuring as aforesaid shall be determined in accordance with the date of their regular appointment to a cadre or post.
- The inter-se-seniority of civil servants in a certain cadre to which promotion is made from different lower posts, carrying the same pay scale shall be determined from the date of regular appointment/promotion of the civil servants in the lower post.

Provided that if the date of regular appointment of two or more civil servants in the lower post is the same, the civil servant older in age, shall be treated senior.

- 18. General Rules: In all matters not expressly provided for in these rules, civil servants shall be governed by such rules as have been or may hereafter be prescribed by Government and made applicable to them.
- 19. Repeal:- The North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1975, are hereby repealed.

Appointment by transfer.

I am directed to say that rule 7 of the NWFP Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989, provides that appointment by transfer to posts should be made:-

to posts in BPS-2 to 16 on the recommendations of the appropriate (1) Departmental Promotion Committee;

to posts in BPS-17 and above on the recommendations of the Provincial (2)

Selection Board; and

from amongst the persons possessing qualifications and other conditions (3) prescribed for the posts and holding appointment on regular basis in the same basic pay scale in which the posts to be filled exist.

It has been brought to notice that in some of the departments, appointment by transfer is also made in cases where no provision for appointment by transfer exists in the relevant service/recruitment rules.

I am accordingly directed to clarify that the above provisions regarding appointment by transfer are applicable in only those cases where the appointment by transfer is specifically provided for in the relevant service/recruitment rules or in the method of appointment, qualification etc laid down for each post under sub-rule (2) of rule 3 of the aforesaid rules.





Posting of Junior Officers on Posts in Higher Scale

This Department's Circular letter No.SORI(S&GAD)1-29/75(A), dated 13.2.1993, on the subject noted above and to state that it has been noticed that certain Provincial Government Departments are resorting to the practice of posting officers in a lower scale on posts in higher scales. This practice is against the provisions of NWFP Civil Servants Act,1973 and rules made thereunder as well as the instructions of the Establishment Division reproduced below:-

"The grant of higher appointments to junior officers against senior posts amounts to accelerated promotion in view of the decision given by the Supreme Court of Pakistan in the case of Government of Pakistan Versus Qazi Abdul Karim. The Ministries/Divisions or Provincial Governments can only fill vacancies in a particular grade by officers of the same grade, and officers in a junior grade will not be appointed against a vacancy in a higher grade".

2. It may be pointed out that in the light of rule 9 of the NWFP Civil Servants (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989, the methods prescribed for posting a junior officer to a higher post are restricted to the following only:-

i) ACTING CHARGE APPOINTMENT AGAINST A HIGHER POST

Where the senior most officer in a cadre is otherwise fully eligible for promotion but does not possess the specified length of service, the competent authority may appoint him to the higher post on acting charge basis, but only on the recommendation of Departmental Promotion Committee/Selection Board and subject to the condition that such officer lacks the prescribed length of service not more than (one year).

ii) CURRENT CHARGE APPOINTMENT OF A HIGHER POST

Only the senior-most officer of a cadre can be given current charge appointment of a higher post with the approval of the competent authority. However, this can only be an arrangement upto a maximum of six months.

iii) ADDITIONAL CHARGE APPOINTMENT OF AN EQUIVALENT POST

An officer can be given the additional charge of a second post but only of a post in an equivalent grade, upto a period of six months by the competent authority.

- 3. Adherence to the above rules is a legal requirement so that the actions taken by officers are not held at any stage to be irregular. Also, appointments in violation of the rules constitute administrative indiscipline.
- 4. I am, therefore, directed to request that all such cases of irregular appointments be reviewed and ensure not to resort to such appointments that violate the provisions of the Civil Servants Act and the statutory rules framed thereunder.
- 5. I am further directed to request that these instructions may be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.
