Humbly Sheweth;

Facts:

Facts leading to the institution of the instant appeal are as under:

- 1- That the appellant was appointed on contract vide Office Order Endst No. DTE/FATA/Admn/Apptt:/337-41(1-5) dated 26/01/2007 as Instructor by the Directorate of Technical Education FATA, FATA Secretariat in Government College of Management Sciences Miran Shah, North Waziristan Agency. (True Copy of the appointment letter is annexed herewith as Mark "A").
- 2- That the appellant was performing his duties to the best of his abilities and the respondents extended his services on contract from time to time. It is important to mention that the appellant was holding his post on contract 31st December 2008. (True Copy is annexed herewith as Mark "B").
- 3- That the Provincial Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa passed an Act NWFP Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 (NWFP Act No. XVI of 2009) whereby the services of all the employees who were holding a post "on contract or Adhoc basis and holding that post on 31/12/2008 or till the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been validly appoint on regular basis having the same qualification and experience for a regular post".



(True Copy of the Act is annexed herewith as Mark "C").

- 4- That appellant being equally entitled to benefits granted through the Act, applied to the respondents for regularization of his services under the Act. And on refusal of the respondents, the appellant filed a writ petition before the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar The relief sought by the appellant from the Hon'ble Court was the regularization of his services under the beneficial provisions of NWFP Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009. It would be appropriate to mention that the respondents stopped payment of salaries to the appellant since 30th June 2010 and the appellant was performing his duty without getting any salary.
- 5- That the appellant writ petition was allowed by the Hon'ble Court vide judgment and order dated 08/03/2012 wherein directions were given in the following words: "We therefore, issue writ in favour of the petitioners and against the respondents to the effect that the petitioners shall be deemed to be regular and permanent employees of respondent No.1 & 2 Department within the meaning of NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 and the respondents are directed to issue notification of their regularization within a period of one month". (True Copy of Order dated 08/03/2012 are annexed as Mark "D").



6- That in spite of the elapsed of one month period, respondents failed to comply with the clear directions of the Hon'ble Court. It was finally on 31/12/2012, that a notification was issued by the respondents whereby the services of the appellant were regularized under the Regularization Act of 2009. Relevant portion of the Notification is reproduced below:

"In pursuance of the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar judgment dated 08/03/2012 announced in Writ Petition No.1289/2010 the competent authority has been pleased to regularize the service of the following employees of Technical Education Under the NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act 2009 with immediate effect." (True Copy of the notification dated 31/12/2012 are annexed herewith as Mark "E").

- 7- That the Respondents regularize the services of the appellant under the Regularization Act of 2009 as mentioned in the Notification, however, the salary that has been given to the appellant is of fresh candidate. And except for appointment of the appellant on regular basis, the respondents have not given any benefit to the appellant to which he is entitled under the regularization Act.
- Representation before the competent authority, wherein he prayed for payment of his salary as per his entitlement under the Act (from the date of the regularization of his service i.e. 1st January, 2009) as extended to other contract employees whose services were regularize under the Act and also prayed for the release of his salary from 30/06/2010 till the date of his regularization. At the same time, the appellant also requested for determination of his seniority as per mandate of Section 4 of the Act, but no heed has been paid by the respondents to his representation. (True Copy of the Departmental Appeal is annexed herewith as mark "E").



9- That on failure of the respondents to decide his departmental representation dated 13/12/2014 dairy No.5446, within the statutory period of ninety (90) days, the appellant being dissatisfied by the action and inaction of the respondents, approaches this Hon'ble Tribunal and challenges and seeks the release of his salary / payment as per his entitlement in view his regularization of services under the Act and accordingly his seniority inter alia on the following grounds;

GROUNDS:

- A) Because the inaction of the respondents whereby the appellant services has not been regularized in accordance with the mandate of employees Regularization Act of 2009 and the refusal of the respondents to pay him his salaries from 1st January 2009 violates the right guaranteed and secured to him under the law.
- B) Because it offends the provision of Art; 4 of the Constitution to enjoy the protection of the law and to be treated in accordance with law which is the inalienable right of every citizen, wherever he may be and of every other person for the time being within Pakistan.
- C) Because the action of the respondents is discriminatory and in blatant violation of Article of every citizen, wherever he may be, and of every other person for the time being within Pakistan.
- D) Because the action of the respondents is bad in law.
- E) Because the appellant was entitled to regularization from the commencement of the employees regularization of services Act, and also entitled to the pay and other benefits from 1st January 2009. Moreover, the appellant was not paid any salary from 30th June, 2010 till the issuance of the aforementioned notification on 31st December, 2012 though he was performing his duty in the his College, malafide is apparent.
- F) Because the seniority of the appellant has also not yet been determined in spite of the specific



provision provided for in the Act itself i.e. Section 4 of the Act.

G) Because the appellant crave fro leave to add further grounds at the time of his oral arguments before this Hon'ble Tribunal highlighting further contraventions of the provisions of the law which adversely affected the appellant.

It is, therefore, most humbly prayed that on acceptance of this appeal, may be allowed and his salary and seniority with all back benefits be determined in the light of NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009.

Any other better relief may also kindly be granted in the circumstances of the appellant's case.



No.PA/NWFP/Bills/2009/38472.—The North-West Frontier Province Employees (Regularization of Services) Bill, 2009 having been passed by the Provincial Assembly of North-West Frontier Province on 15th October, 2009 and assented to by the Governor of the North-West Frontier Province on 20th October, 2009 is hereby published as an Act of the Provincial Legislature of the North-West Frontier Province.

THE NORTH-WEST FRONTIER PROVINCE EMPLOYEES (REGULARIZATION OF SERVICES) ACT, 2009 (N-W.F.P. ACT NO. XVI OF 2009)

(First published after having received the assent of the Governor of the

North-West Frontier Province in the Gazette of the N.W.F.P. (Extraordinary),

Dated the 24th October, 2009).

AN ACT

to provide for the regularization of the services of certain employees appointed on adhoc or contract basis.

Preamble. ---WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the regularization of the services of certain employees appointed on adhoc or contract basis, in the public interest, for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

- 1. Short title and commencement. --- (1) This Act may be called the North- West Frontier --- Province Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009.
- (2) It shall come into force at once and shall be deemed to have been taken effect at the promulgation of the Ordinance.
- 2. Definitions. (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - (a) "Commission;" means the North-West Frontier Province Public Service Commission;
 - (aa) "contract appointment" means appointment of a duly qualified person made other. Then in accordance with the prescribed method of recruitment;
 - (b) "enq. o . c." means an adda contract employee appointed by Government on addee or contract basis is second shift/night shift but does not include the employees for project post or appointed on work charge basis or who are paid out of contingencies;
 - (c) "Government" means the Government of the North-West Frontier Province;
 - (d) "Government Department" means any department constituted under rule 3*of the North-West Frontier Province Government Rules of Business, 1985;

- (2) The expressions "adhoe appointment" and "civil servant" shall have the same meanings as respectively assigned to them in the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973 (N.-W.F.P. Act No. XVIII of 1973).
- 3. Regularization of services of certain employees.—All employees including recommendees of the High Court appointed on contract or adhoc basis and holding that post on 31st December, 2008 or till the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been validly appointed on regular basis having the same qualification and experience for a regular post:

Provided that the service promotion quota of all service cadres shall not be affected.

- 4. Determination of seniority.--- (1) The employees whose services are regularized under this Act or in the process of attaining service at the commencement of this Act shall rank junior to all civil servants belonging to the same service or cadre, as the case may be, who are in service on regular basis on the commencement of this Act, and shall also rank junior to such other persons, if any, who, in pursuance of the recommendation of the Commission made before the commencement of this Act, are to be appointed to the respective service or cadre, irrespective of their actual date of appointment.
- (2) The seniority *interse* of the employees, whose services are regularized under this Act within the same service or cadre, shall be determined on the basis of their continuous officiation in such service or cadre:

Provided that if the date of continuous officiation in the case of two or more employees is the same, the employee older in age shall rank senior to the younger one.

- 4A. Overriding effect.— Notwithstanding any thing to the contrary contained in any other law or rule for the time being in force, the provisions of this Act shall have an overriding effect and the provisions of any such law or rule to the extent of inconsistency to this Act shall cease to have effect.
- 5. Repeal.-- The North-West Frontier Province Employees (Regularization of Services) Ordinance, 2009 (N.-W.F.P. Ordinance No. VII of 2009) is hereby repealed.

instant petition, seek the indulgence of this Court by issuing directions to respondents to treat the petitioners as regularized employees under the NWFP Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009. The petitioners in connected Writ Petitions No. 1145/2010, 1252/2010, 2639/2010, 1870/2011, 2992/2011, 3244/2011, 3285/2011 and 46/2012, have also similar grievances against the respondents, therefore, we propose to dispose of all the writ petitions through this common judgment in W.P. No.1289/2010.

2. In these petitions the common point of law involved is whether petitioners' appointment on various posts in the respondents' department in pursuance to the advertisement made in the newspapers was on contract basis so as to attract the provisions of Section 3 of

NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 for their regularization or not.

- 3. To understand the position, we would take into account the advertisement made in the press, the appointment orders of petitioners, their salary slips and relevant provisions of the Act, 2009 but before that we may give here a brief resume of the facts and circumstances leading to filing of instant petitions.
- The Director Technical Education & Man Power Training, Peshawar (respondent No.4) advertised certain posts of Instructors, Junior Instructors, Librarians etc. in BPS 14, 16 and 17 lying vacant in various Government Colleges of Management Sciences Ghalani, Khar Bajaur, Parachinar, Miranshah and Government Technical Institutes Bara, Yakka Ghund, Sadda Miranshah and Ghaljai on contract basis for one year extendable to a further period. Petitioners having requisite qualification for the respective posts applied for appointment.
- 5. A Recruitment Committee was constituted comprising of Deputy Secretary (P&D), Deputy Secretary (Admn), Director Technical Education, NWFP and Deputy Director Technical Education FATA assisted by subject specialists/experts. Merit list of the candidates for each category was prepared and submitted for

approval of Governor, which was accordingly approved and petitioners were issued the appointment orders.

- on completion of one year term, the contract was extended from time to time without any break till the year 2009, when the NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 was promulgated where under the employees appointed on adhoc or contract basis by the Government were given the status of regular employees. Petitioners represented against before respondent No.1 for their regularization but the same was denied to them on the ground that they were not appointed on contract basis rather their appointment was on fixed pay against the project posts; hence they were not qualifying the conditions as contained in the Act ibid.
 - 7. We have heard learned counsel for the parties and have also gone through the record appended with these petitions.
 - 8. A look at the advertisement at Annexure: A would disclose that the posts were on contract basis. The appointment orders issued to petit oners would reveal—that—though their appointments were made on fixed pay but Para-2 of the terms and conditions contained in the—said appointment—letters—was to—the effect that, "their period of selection was for one year or till the creation

From the above, no doubt remains that although

appointment of petitioners was on fixed pay but the posts

on which petitioners were appointed were not temporary

posts rather regular one liable to be filled through regular

appointment.

Except the bald allegation of respondents that petitioners were project employees and daily wages, nothing has been brought on record to show that their appointments were made on the posts meant for a Project. Anexure: E at Page-43 is the Summary for Governor. According to it, the Governor was pleased to upgrade the existing five Government Commercial Training Institutes in FATA to the level of College of Management Sciences so as to offer Bachelor's degree in Business Administration and Information Technology to the students. For the purpose, Schedule for New Expenditure (SNE) was prepared to recruit the regular staff and forwarded to SAFRON Division for sanction. It further reveals that recruitment of staff being a lengthy process, it was proposed that for the purpose of starting the classes staff may be recruited on contract basis till appointment of regular staff and their salaries may be paid from ADP. From the above summary, which is duly

approved by the Governor, it is very much evident that neither the posts to be filled in were temporary nor the same were meant for any Project except that their salaries were to be paid from ADP.

10. A similar question had arisen before the august Supreme Court of Pakistan in the case of Ali Akbar vs. The Government of NWFP (C.P. No.462-P of 2006) decided on 05.05.2009, wherein it was held as under:-

"The petitioner's appointment by office order dated 04.02.1985 was as Research Officer in BPS-16 and according to Para-7 of the said order, it was a stop gap arrangement and on ad-hoc basis till the regular appointee. The petitioger's appointment order mentions -three different terms as regard his status, namely, "on temporary basis", "stop gap arrangement" and "one ad-hoc basis". However, Para-7 of the order mentions his appointment on ad-hoc basis to continue till the post is filled up tough regular appointment. It follows that the post to which the petitioner was appointed was not a temporary post but a regular post liable to be filled through regular appointment. The

order of appointment also does not mention

anywhere that the post in question was a

temporary one. Furthermore, the petitioner's

appointment in a particular pay scale as

Assistant Research Officer in the Directorate

of Agriculture Research establishes that the

petitioner's appointment was on ad-hoc basis

same office order, the petitioner was posted

against a vacancy in the Project Research on

the Cultivation of Edible Mashroom in

Pakistan. The order, therefore, had made a

clear distinction against the petitioner's

appointment and positing, whereas he was

vacancy. It is, therefore, wrong to say that

the petitioner was a project employee and

termination of his service on that score

cannot be maintained.

11. The objection of respondents that petitioners were appointed against project posts in view of the advertisement and summary to Governor is not sustainable.

Under Section 2(b), the word "employee" means an adhoc or a contract employee appointed by Government on adhoc or contract basis or second shift/night shift but does not include the employees of project post or appointed on work charge basis or who are paid out of contingencies.

Admittedly, the posts were advertised on contract basis and petitioners were appointed on the posts having requisite qualification after going through the process of test and interview conducted by a Recruitment Committee. There is no mention in the appointment order that petitioners' appointment is against the project posts except that their appointment was made on fixed pay as against the terms of advertisement wherein the posts were clearly mentioned to be on contract basis. The salary slips of petitioners also indicate that though they were being paid fixed pay but their post is clearly written to be "contract" post. The

petitioners also draw their salaries from the AGPR. The other objection of the Department that the petitioners were appointed on fixed pay, hence their services could not be regularized is, therefore, also nothing but a trick played by the respondents in the appointment orders to avoid monetary benefits of the posts to which the petitioners under the law were entitled to get. The term "fixed pay" has not been defined in service laws. As stated above, the petitioners' appointments were made in pursuance to the advertisement published in the press against the posts on contract basis and it can, therefore, be safely inferred that status of petitioners' was that of contract employees regardless of the words "fixed pay" used in their appointment letters.

14. The respondents, during the course of proceedings in these writ petitions, sought time on so many occasions that the Government has in principles decided to regularize the petitioners by proposing legislation to cater therefore, and even copy of a bill contending to be placed before the Parliament, was also produced but till to-date nothing has been done.

15. The respondents while inviting the attention of this Court to Para-3 of Appointment letters, contended that as the petitioners have accepted the terms and

conditions of their appointment, wherein it is categorically mentioned that petitioners will not be considered for regularization at any stage, at any time, being employees on fixed pay, therefore; the principle of estoppel would attract to their cases. We have not been impressed by the arguments on two counts; one that there can be no estoppel against Statute and second that an employee at the time of appointment has little choice to enforce any condition of his choice on the employer. In the case of Ikram Bari and 524 others vs. National Bank of Pākistan through President and another (2005 SCMR 100) it has been held by their lordships in the following words:-

Bank that the temporary Godown staff and the daily wages employees should be continued to be governed on disgraceful terms and conditions of service for an indefinite period. In view of section 24-A of the General Clauses Act 1897, the National Bank was required to act reasonably, fairly and justly. An employee being jobless and in fear of being shown the door had no option but to acc. pt and continue with the appointment on whatever conditions it was offered by the Bank. In the case of Pakistan v. Public at Large

Shariat Appellate Bench of this Court that the provisions of law impugned therein amounted to a contract between the Government and the civil servant and thus they involved his consent. It was observed that in fact it as not in the nature of a free consent between the agents. On one hand, State power was projected in the form of a Statute and on the other; the civil servant had no choice of a bargain on those provisions when joining the service. He could not get it changed. In Habibullan v. Government of the Punjab and 5 others PLD 1980 Lah. 37, it was held that the employer being placed in a position of authority and strength-could always coerce employees to waive their legal protection and accept contractual terms at the pains of losing his job.

15. We may observe here that firstly the respondents utilized the word "fixed pay" in their appointment letters purely as a means of evading their statutory obligations in terms of the service laws and also to save money by denying them the opportunity of pension/provident fund benefits etc. although their appointments were made in accordance with the prescribed method of recruitment and through a duly constituted Recruitment Committee and secondly, when

the right of their regularization accrued in view of the promulgation of the Act, 2009 they denied them such benefit and came up with lame excuses. before this Court that they were project employees. daily wages and payee out of contingency. The petitioners, as is evident from the record, are neither project employees, nor daily wages nor receiving salary from contingency but were contract employees on regular posts and after promulgation of NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009, have now assumed the status of regular employees of the Department. The acts of respondents being reprehensible amounts to exploitation of petitioners at their own expense and are, therefore, liable to be declared as illegal and in excess of lawful jurisdiction.



My services alongwith my other colleagues were regularized under Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Employees (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009, with immediate effect vide Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Industries, Commerce & Technical Education Department Notification No. SOIII(IND)TE/3-9/2012 dated 31-12-2012.

In this connection, it is stated that:-

1- After allowing seniority from 01-01-2009, according to section-4 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009, we were regularized with immediate effect were deprived from pay benefits, seniority, annual increments and arrears thereof from the back date i.e. 01-01-2009.

While accepting the Writ petition No. 1145/2010, the Peshawar High Court, Peshawar in last Para of its judgment announced on 08-03-2012, directed the respondents to issue notification of regularization of petitioner within a period of one month.

Instead of issuing notification of our regularization within one month as per direction of the Court the respondent delayed the desired on one pretext or the other. The required notification was finally issued on 31-12-2012 with immediate effect which amounts to deprivation of the petitioners from their pay benefits, seniority, annual increments and arrears at least from the date of announcement of the judgment and in this respect various services appeals are penaling adjudication before service tribunal, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

In view of the above, it is humbly prayed that I may kindly be allowed pay benefits, seniority, annual increments and arrears from my actual date of regularization i.e. from 01-01-2009 according to Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009.

REPLY ON BEHALF OF RESPONDENT NO.2 & 5

BRIEF HISTORY

The appellant was appointed on fixed pay against the ADP/Project post in 2007. The tenure of ADP/Project was ended on 30.06.2010 and the services of the appellant were terminated on completion of the Project. Latter on, the services were regularized in compliance of the judgement dated 08.03.2012 of the Peshawar High Court Peshawar, and the appellant reported his arrival to the place of posting w.e.f 01.01.2013. The appellant has not performed any duty during the gape period from 30.06.10 (A/N) to 31.12.12. However, the appellant has claimed the pay and seniority for the gape period.

Respectfully Sheweth

PRELIMINARY OBJECTIONS

- 1. That the appellant has no cause of action / Locus Standi to file the instant appeal.
- 2. That the appellant is not civil servant within the meaning of section 2(b) of the NWFP Civil servant Act, therefore, the honourable Tribunal has no jurisdiction to entertain the present appeal.
- 3. The appeal is wholly incompetent, misconceived and untenable.
- **4.** That the appellant has not come to this honourable tribunal with clean hands. The appeal also suffers from mis-statement and concealment of facts.
- 5. That the appellant is stopped to file the suit as he voluntarily accepted the terms and conditions of his service.
- **6.** The appeal is not competent as the appellant was a project employee having no status to file the instant appeal.
- 7. That the appeal is badly time barred.

- 1. Incorrect. The appellant was appointed on fixed pay and not on contract (Annex-A).
- 2. Incorrect. Correct to the extent that the appellant was holding the post on fixed pay on 31-12-2008. But the rest of the para pertain to record.
- 3. Correct.
- 4. Incorrect. The appellant was basically appointed on fixed pay as is clear from his appointment order. However the Department of Technical Education, K.P.K. being the parent department, in compliance of the judgment dated 8.03.2012 of the Peshawar High Court Peshawar, has already regularized the services of the appellant and thus implemented the orders of the honourable Court in letter and spirit. On his regularization, the appellant submitted his arrival report to the place of posting and never objected to the terms and conditions of the notification. The same issue under COC No. 96-P/ 2013 and 97-P/2013 was heard by honourable Peshawar High Court, and decided in the favour of the Department. (Annexure-B)
- 5. Correct.
- **6. Incorrect**. As per para-4 above.
- 7. Incorrect. The appellant was regularized in service on 31/12/2012 with immediate effect and accordingly he reported to the place of his posting without any hesitation / objection, thus accepting the terms and conditions of service. The posts were ADP posts which ended on 30/06/2010. Furthermore, the SNEs for appellant post is still under process and not yet finalized.
- 8. Correct to the extent that a departmental representation was filed before Technical Education, K.P.K but the rest of the para is denied as the appellant is not entitled to any back benefit (pay/seniority) as he did not perform any duty during the gap period.
- 9. As per para 8 above."

GROUNDS

- a. **Incorrect**. The acts of the respondents are in accordance with law as the services of the petitioner have already been regularized. Furthermore, the creation of SNE for the post of the appellant is still under process and appellant has not performed any duty during the gap period.
- b. **Incorrect.** The appellant was treated as per mandate of law and there has been no violation of Article 4 of the constitution on the part of the respondent.
- c. Incorrect. As per para-(a) above.
- d. Incorrect.
- e. **Incorrect.** As per para-4 above.
- f. Incorrect. Seniority will be given from the date of regular appointment.
- g. Needs no comments.

h. The department seeks the permission of this honourable court to argue on additional grounds at the time of hearing.

It is, therefore, requested that in view of the above facts, the instant appeal for having no force of law and facts may be dismissed with cost.

IKRAMULLAH KHAN, J. Through this single judgment, we propose to dispose of two Contempt of Court Petitions, as common question of law and facts is involved in all the two petitions. The particulars of the same are as follows:-

- 1. COC No. 96-P/2013 in WP No. 1289/2010, (Muhammad Ilyas etc vs. Hussain Zada etc).
- 2. COC No. 97-P/2013 in WP No. 1145/2010 (Noor Hassan Khan etc vs. Hussain Zada etc).
- 2. On 8.3.2012, this Court while allowing Writ Petitions of the petitioners passed the following order:-

"We, therefore, issue writ in favour of petitioners and against the respondents to the effect that petitioners shall be deemed to be

regular and permanent employees of respondents No.1 and 2 Department within the meaning of NWFP (Regularization of Services) Act, 2009 and the respondents are directed to issue notification of their regularization within a period of one month?

- 3. The respondents were put to notice, who appeared before the Court and stated that petitioners have been regularized. Grievance of the petitioners is that they should be regularized w.e.f. 1.1.2009.
- As the respondents have regularized the petitioners, the orders of this Court have been complied with. In case, the petitioners are still aggrieved, they may seek their appropriate remedy before the competent forum, if so advised.
- 5. These contempt petitions being misconceived are dismissed and the show cause notices issued against the respondents are hereby recalled.
