Aggrieved against her repatriation from Federal Directorate of Education (FDE) Islamabad to her parent department vide order dated 01.11.2017 and her adjustment at Govt. Post Graduate College for women Haripur, the appellant (Assistant Professor) has approached this Tribunal by filing the present service appeal. Prayer of the appellant is that the impugned order dated 01.11.2017 be set aside and she may be allowed to continue her service/duty under deputation at the same station i.e. Islamabad Model College for Girls (PG) G-10/4 Islamabad.</p> <p>3. Arguments heard. File perused.</p> <p>4. The appellant was posted as Assistant Professor of Home Economics Government Girls Degree College Khalabat Township</p>

Haripur when she was transferred on deputation vide order dated 05.08.2008.


5. Finally the respondent department vide order dated 01.11.2017 accorded ex-post facto sanction for regularization of over stay period beyond five (05) years in respect of the appellant in the Federal Directorate of Education Islamabad with effect from 08.05.2013, repatriated the appellant and adjusted her at Government Post Graduate College for women Haripur.

6. Up till the issuance of the impugned order of repatriation, the appellant remained on deputation in the borrowing department i.e. Federal Directorate of Education Islamabad for more than Nine (09) consecutive years. However the learned counsel for the appellant still persists that the appellant be allowed to continue her service under deputation at the same duty station i.e. Islamabad Model College for Girls (PG) G-10/4 Islamabad. The learned counsel for the appellant remained unable to demonstrate any legal backing in support of the prayer made in the present service appeal.

7. It may also be mentioned that the Federal Directorate of Education vide Notification dated 09.01.2018, available on file, has already repatriated the appellant to her parent department.

8. In view of the above the appellant has not been able to seek indulgence of this tribunal. Consequently the present service appeal is hereby dismissed. Parties are left to bear their own costs. File be consigned to the record room.





The learned counsel for the appellant further relied upon a Wedlock Policy of the provincial Government and according to this policy spouse should not be disturbed from the place of their duty. That even a deputationists is to be dealt with in accordance with this policy. That amendments were made in rules in order to serve the spouse at one station.


The points raised need consideration. The appeal is admitted to regular hearing. The appellant is directed to deposit security and process fee within 10 days. Mr. Abdul Aziz Khan Tanoli, Advocate/counsel for the appellant present. Fresh Wakalatnama submitted, which is placed on file. The appellant who is serving in Education Department of Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa was transferred to Federal Government on deputation in the year, 2008 due to spouse policy as her husband was/is serving at Islamabad in Education Department. The appellant after serving for eight years on deputation has been recalled by the lending department.

Now the appellant has challenged that recall order through this appeal on the ground that the appellant was transferred on deputation on the basis of spouse policy. That originally in Rule 20-A of the Appointment, Promotion and Transfer Rules, 1973, the maximum period for deputation was five years but now in the year, 2012 through an amendment the proviso was inserted in rule 20-A which says that tenure of five years shall not apply to some employees including husband or wife. Getting benefit of this proviso the appellant spent eight years instead of five years on deputation. The learned counsel for the appellant today argued that in the presence of this proviso the lending department had committed illegality by recalling the appellant back. Secondly if the lending department, at all, was to recall the appellant back it could be done only in the public interest. But this Tribunal noticed that the proviso as referred to above does not appear to be self executing. It only gives room to the lending and borrowing departments to extend the period beyond five years if both agreed. But the learned counsel for the appellant is not in agreement with this Tribunal and is of the view that when the notification introduced this proviso all those deputationists shall get automatic extension. Secondly, this Tribunal has also observed that the referred Rules of 1973 pertained to the civil servants of the Federal Government and not the Provincial Government. It would be seen whether any such amendment has been made in the Provincial Laws and Rules and whether the deputationists shall be governed by the law and rules of borrowing department or lending department.

These points need further arguments and case is adjourned to 20.04.2018 for further preliminary hearing before S.B at camp court, Abbottabad.

FACTS

1. That, on 18/11/1997, appellant was appointed as a "Lecturer" (BPS-17) at GGC No.2, Abbottabad. **(Copy of appointment order is annexed as annexure "A")**.
2. That, on 21/02/2007 appellant was promoted as a "Assistant Professor" (BPS-18) and posted at Govt Girls College Khalabat District Haripur. **(Copy of Promotion order is annexed as annexure "B")**.
3. That, appellant's Husband was appointed in Federal Govt College H/9, Islamabad College for boys (Now Islamabad College for boys H-9, Islamabad) as a Associate Professor w.e.f. 13/10/1990 and he is still working there as a Associate Professor. **(Copy of Service Certificate is annexed as annexure "C")**.
4. That, on 13/08/2008, appellant was posted at Islamabad on Deputation and still performing duty in Islamabad Model College For Girl (PG) G-10/4 Islamabad.
5. That, on 01/11/2017 vide impugned notification issued by respondentNo.3 for repatriation to the parent department and adjustment of appellant at Govt Post Graduate College for Women Haripur with immediate effect. **(Copy of impugned Notification dated 01/11/2017 is annexed as annexure "D")**.
6. That, on 27/11/2017, appellant filed a departmental appeal against the impugned notification dated 01/11/2017 before

respondent No.1 which is still pending. **(Copy of departmental appeal is annexed as annexure "E")**.

7. That, on 09/01/2018, respondent No.5 issued notification for repatriation of appellant to parent department in the light of notification of respondent No.2 **(Copy of notification dated 09/01/2018 is annexed as annexure "F")**.
8. That, the impugned notification is liable to be set-aside on following grounds:-

GROUND:

- a. That, said notification is against the Spouse Policy of Govt Employees.
- b. That, on 14/09/2017 vide notification No. SOR-1(E&AD) 9-5/2010 issued by Govt of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Admin Department (Regulation Wing), the applicant was permitted to continue her duty for further 05 years. **(Copy of notification is annexed as annexure "G")**.
- c. That, the children of appellant are getting education in different educational institutes in Islamabad and due to impugned order the education of the children of appellant shall be very badly affected.
- d. That, according to the Federal Establishment Division's instruction / guidelines vide OM No. 10/30/97-R-2 dated 12/05/1998 and 17/12/1999 posting of husband and wives at the same station should be facilitated.
- e. That, according to the Govt of Pakistan, Cabinet Secretariat Establishment Division's notification dated 16/04/2012 in exercise of powers conferred by Sub-Section-(1) of Section 25

of the Civil Servants Act, 1973 (LXXI 1973) read with notification No. SRO 120(1) 98, dated 27/02/1998, the Prime Minister the following amendment in the Civil Servants (appointment, promotion and transfer) Rules, 1973 namely: **(Copy of both the notifications dated 16/04/2012 are annexed as annexure "H" & "I")**.

- f. That, in the aforesaid Rules, in rule 20 A, after sub rule (3) the following proviso shall be inserted and shall deem to have always been so inserted, namely: provided that posting of serving husband and wife at the same station shall be exempted from the said rule which means that the deputation according to wed-lock policy was for indefinite period.
- g. That, the instant appeal is well within time.

It is therefore, very humbly prayed that on acceptance of instant appeal, the impugned Notification dated 01/11/2017 may graciously be set- aside and the appellant be allowed to continue her service / duty under deputation at the same duty station i.e. Islamabad Model College For Girl (PG) G-10/4 Islamabad and the impugned order may kindly be suspended till the final decision of Service Appeal.

Muhammad Zia-ul-Haq, Assistant, working with District Livestock Officer, District Government, Lahore, has assailed the order dated 18-1-2003 passed by the Secretary, Government of the Punjab, Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Lahore, whereby the appellant was transferred to Kasur with immediate effect and his representation was also rejected by respondent No.1 on 1-2-2003 declining to interfere with the impugned order dated 18-1-2003.

2. Appellant was serving as Assistant with respondent No.3 and was adjusted against the said post on 1-7-2002 under the wedlock policy as his wife was working as a teacher in the Government Tahir Model Girls Middle School, Gulshan-e-Shalimar Scheme, Lahore, under the control of the Education Department. He was transferred to Kasur on 18-1-2003 by respondent No.1 allegedly on the pressure of an MPA who wanted to accommodate respondent No.4, transferred in the place of the appellant. Appellant filed departmental representation before respondent No.1, who declined it on 1-2-2003, hence the present appeal.

3. Learned counsel for the appellant contended that the transfer of the appellant to Kasur and that of respondent No.4 to Lahore in the place of the appellant was at the behest of an MPA who wanted his man (respondent No.4) to be posted at Lahore and the said exchange being as a result of ulterior consideration could not be allowed to prosper. It was next submitted by the learned counsel for the appellant that he was posted at the present post on 1-7-2002 under the wedlock policy, which fact was not even adverted to, rather respondent No.1 rejected his representation without giving any reasons on the ground that he was junior to many others, a consideration totally alien to the transfer policy. In this manner it was stated that the transfer policy was grossly violated. Learned District Attorney after being assisted by the departmental representative present with office file replied that the appellant had put in more than six years of service at Lahore and his transfer to the present post on 1-7-2002 was a result of devolution policy transferring powers to the Local Government, however, the stark fact remained that the appellant continuously served at Lahore for more than six years and a time had come whereby others had to be accommodated and he was to be shifted from Lahore. Learned counsel for respondent No.4 supported the impugned order and submitted that under section 9 of the Punjab Civil Servants Act, every civil servant was liable to serve anywhere in the province on any post established by the Government. Therefore, appellant could have no grievance, if he was transferred due to the exigency of service for administrative reasons.

4. I have heard the respective counsels at length and perused the record.

5. After the transfer of the appellant to Kasur vide impugned order dated 18-1-2003, District Livestock Officer, city District Government, Lahore in the parwise comments submitted to the Appellate Authority on the representation of the appellant, made the following observations:

"The appeal of the official, in original, is forwarded as the contents of the appeal are based on facts. His transfer is premature as he was adjusted in this office w.e.f. 1-7-2002 under (Wedlock Policy) by the Director General (Ext), Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Punjab Lahore, vide Order No.12910-16 dated 17-8-2003.

With reference to the discussion made with the honourable Secretary, Government of the Punjab, Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Punjab, Lahore, dated 18-1-2003, it is submitted that Mr. Muhammad Zia-ul-Haq is the sole official who is dealing with Audit, Accounts and Budget matters and his transfer will affect the working of this office adversely.

It is, therefore, requested that his appeal may please be considered favourably in the light of contents of appeal as well hardship of this office and his transfer orders may be cancelled. However, some other junior most Assistant of this office be substituted for transfer at District Kasur, if it is unavoidable, please."

6. These observations indicate that not only the transfer of the appellant to the post which he was holding before his transfer to Kasur was under wedlock policy but the work of the appellant was also appreciated and request was made that the appeal be considered favourably not only on the ground of hardship but also in public interest. Respondent No.1 dismissed the representation of the appellant on 1-2-2003 on the ground that the appellant was junior most without giving any further reasons.

7. It is true section 9 *ibid* has an overriding effect on all circulars, notifications and policies. However, if any policy of the Government enunciated in its circular has to be deviated from good reasons have to be given. Undoubtedly, the policy of the Government is that spouses have to be allowed to work at the same station to avoid hardship. On the other hand, section 9 ordains that a Government servant can be transferred and posted anywhere in the Province on any post. There is no denying the prerogative of the Government as mandated in the provision of law quoted, however, the policy and the practice through various circulars and notifications have been made to mollify and temper with the mandate. The authority at the helm of the affairs in order to implement the mandate as provided in section 9 *ibid*

has to give good reasons why the beneficial construction provided in the circular has to be done away with. Regretfully respondent No.1 has not at all given any reasons rather was swayed by factors totally divorced from the fact in issue. Wedlock policy has been introduced and acted upon with a philosophy. If the husband in Government department is posted at one city and his wife posted, in another Government department, is working in a different city, it is definitely going to cause mental distress to both of them with the consequences which are not only injurious to them but to the public and Government exchequer. Respondent No.1 while rejecting departmental representation of the appellant did not consider these circumstances and failed to give any reasons that transfer to Kasur was essential in the administrative interest of the Government overriding the wedlock policy. Similarly the transfer of respondent No.4 to Lahore was not indicated as to how the mutual exchange promotes the interest of the State. A policy made is to be implemented and any departure of the same has to be explained. Without giving good reasons the policy of the Government with respect to transfer would become redundant which is not wisdom in enacting it.

8. As a result of the discussion, appeal is accepted, orders dated 18-1-2003 and 1-2-2003 passed by respondent No.1 transferring the appellant to Kasur are set aside. Appellant shall be allowed to work as Assistant with respondent No.3. The case is remitted to respondent No.1 who shall apply his mind to the representation made by the appellant after hearing both the appellant and respondent No.4 whereafter through a speaking order dispose of the same within 60 days from the date he receives a copy of the judgment of this Tribunal.

But later on the Competent Authority has been pleased to give no objection certificate (NOC) and to allow permanent absorption of the Appellant in Federal Directorate of Education (FG Colleges) Islamabad. Moreover, the Competent Authority has also grant ex-post facto sanction for regularization of over stay for a period of 4 months beyond 13/08/2013 (Copy of notification is attached as Annex-D). Then a letter was received from Federal Directorate of Education wherein it has been stated that the case for permanent absorption of the appellant cannot be considered due to non-provision in the Recruitment rules. However, her deputation period can be extended beyond "5 years" with the approval of Establishment Division on the issuance of "NOC" from parent department (Annex-E). Accordingly the Competent Authority in Higher Education Department in consultation with Establishment and Administration Department accorded ex-post facto sanction for the regularization of over stay period beyond five (05) years in respect of the appellant w.e.f 08-05-2013.

Furthermore, the Competent Authority has also approved repatriation of the appellant and adjusted her at Government Postgraduate College for women, Haripur with immediate effect. (Copy of notification is attached as Annex-F). The Federal Directorate of Education has also repatriated the appellant to her parent department (Copy of notification is attached as Annex-G).



---Wedlock Policy---Transfer---Civil servant was adjusted against post of Assistant at place 'L' under Wedlock Policy as his wife was also working as a teacher at place 'L'---Civil servant was transferred at place 'K'---Government Policy was that spouse had to be allowed to work at the same station to avoid hardship---Wedlock Policy had been introduced and acted upon with a philosophy---If husband in Government Department was posted at one city and his wife posted in another Government Department was working in a different city, it was definitely going to cause mental distress to both of them with the consequences which were not only injurious to them but to the public and Government exchequer---Authority while rejecting departmental appeal of civil servant, did not consider said circumstances and had failed to give any reason that transfer of civil servant to place 'K' was essential in the administrative interest of Government overriding the Wedlock Policy---Transfer of co-civil servant to place 'L' was not indicated as to how mutual exchange would promote interest of the State---Order transferring civil servant to place 'K' was set aside and he was allowed to work at place 'L' and case was remanded to be decided afresh after applying mind to representation made by civil servant after hearing civil servant and co-civil servant. JUDGMENT

Muhammad Zia-ul-Haq, Assistant, working with District Livestock Officer, District Government, Lahore, has assailed the order dated 18-1-2003 passed by the Secretary, Government of the Punjab, Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Lahore, whereby the appellant was transferred to Kasur with immediate effect and his representation was also rejected by respondent No.1 on 1-2-2003 declining to interfere with the impugned order dated 18-1-2003.

2. Appellant was serving as Assistant with respondent No.3 and was adjusted against the said post on 1-7-2002 under the wedlock policy as his wife was working as a teacher in the Government Tahir Model Girls Middle School, Gulshan-e-Shalimar Scheme, Lahore, under the control of the Education Department. He was transferred to Kasur on 18-1-2003 by respondent No.1 allegedly on the pressure of an MPA who wanted to accommodate respondent No.4, transferred in the place of the appellant. Appellant filed departmental representation before respondent No.1, who declined it on 1-2-2003, hence the present appeal.

3. Learned counsel for the appellant contended that the transfer of the appellant to Kasur and that of respondent No.4 to Lahore in the place of the appellant was at the behest of an MPA who wanted his man (respondent No.4) to be posted at Lahore and the said exchange being as a result of ulterior consideration could not be allowed to prosper. It was next submitted by the learned counsel for the appellant that he was posted at the present post on 1-7-2002 under the wedlock policy, which fact was not even adverted to, rather respondent No.1 rejected his representation without giving any reasons on the ground that he was junior to many others, a consideration totally alien to the transfer policy. In this manner it was stated that the transfer policy was grossly violated. Learned District Attorney after being assisted by the departmental representative present with office file replied that the appellant had put in more than six years of service at Lahore and his transfer to the present post on 1-7-2002 was a result of devolution policy transferring powers to the Local Government, however, the stark fact remained that the appellant continuously served at Lahore for more than six years and a time had come whereby others had to be accommodated and he was to be shifted from Lahore. Learned counsel for respondent No.4 supported the impugned order and submitted that under section 9 of the Punjab Civil Servants Act, every civil servant was liable to serve anywhere in the province on any post established by the Government. Therefore, appellant could have no grievance, if he was transferred due to the exigency of service for administrative reasons.

4. I have heard the respective counsels at length and perused the record.

PLC (Service)

5. After the transfer of the appellant to Kasur vide impugned order dated 18-1-2003, District Livestock Officer, city District Government Lahore in the parwise comments submitted to the Appellate Authority on the representation of the appellant, made the following observations:

"The appeal of the official, in original, is forwarded as the contents of the appeal are based on facts. His transfer is premature as he was adjusted in this office w.e.f. 1-7-2002 under (Wedlock Policy) by the Director General (Ext), Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Punjab Lahore, vide Order No.12910-16 dated 17-8-2003.

With reference to the discussion made with the honourable Secretary, Government of the Punjab, Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Punjab, Lahore, dated 18-1-2003, it is submitted that Mr. Muhammad Zia-ul-Haq is the sole official who is dealing with Audit, Accounts and Budget matters and his transfer will affect the working of this office adversely.

It is, therefore, requested that his appeal may please be considered favourably in the light of contents of appeal as well hardship of the office and his transfer orders may be cancelled. However, some other junior most Assistant of this office be substituted for transfer at District Kasur, if it is unavoidable, please."

6. These observations indicate that not only the transfer of the appellant to the post which he was holding before his transfer to Kasur was under wedlock policy but the work of the appellant was also appreciated and request was made that the appeal be considered favourably not only on the ground of hardship but also in public interest. Respondent No.1 dismissed the representation of the appellant on 1-2-2003 on the ground that the appellant was junior most without giving any further reasons.

7. It is true section 9 *ibid* has an overriding effect on all circulars, notifications and policies. However, if any policy of the Government enunciated in its circular has to be deviated from good reasons have to be given. Undoubtedly, the policy of the Government is that spouses have to be allowed to work at the same station to avoid hardship. On the other hand, section 9 ordains that a Government servant can be transferred and posted anywhere in the Province on any post. There is no denying the prerogative of the Government as mandated in the provision of law quoted, however, the policy and the practice through various circulars and notifications have been made to mollify and temper with the mandate. The authority at the helm of the affairs in order to implement the mandate as provided in section 9 *ibid*

has to give good reasons why the beneficial construction provided in the circular has to be done away with. Regretfully respondent No.1 has not at all given any reasons rather was swayed by factors totally divorced from the fact in issue. Wedlock policy has been introduced and acted upon with a philosophy. If the husband in Government department is posted at one city and his wife posted, in another Government department, is working in a different city, it is definitely going to cause mental distress to both of them with the consequences which are not only injurious to them but to the public and Government exchequer. Respondent No.1 while rejecting departmental representation of the appellant did not consider these circumstances and failed to give any reasons that transfer to Kasur was essential in the administrative interest of the Government overriding the wedlock policy. Similarly the transfer of respondent No.4 to Lahore was not indicated as to how the mutual exchange promotes the interest of the State. A policy made is to be implemented and any departure of the same has to be explained. Without giving good reasons the policy of the Government with respect to transfer would become redundant which is not wisdom in enacting it.

8. As a result of the discussion, appeal is accepted, orders dated 18-1-2003 and 1-2-2003 passed by respondent No.1 transferring the appellant to Kasur are set aside. Appellant shall be allowed to work as Assistant with respondent No.3. The case is remitted to respondent No.1 who shall apply his mind to the representation made by the appellant after hearing both the appellant and respondent No.4 whereafter through a speaking order dispose of the same within 60 days from the date he receives a copy of the judgment of this Tribunal.
