
1. Learned counsel for the appellant present. Mr. Asif Masood Ali Shah, Deputy District Attorney for the respondents present.

2. During the course of arguments, learned counsel for the appellant pointed out that after filing of this service appeal the department, vide sanction No. SO(B&A)E&SED/1-16/2022/M.Phil. Allowance dated 18.08.2022, allowed M.Phil allowance but with immediate effect whereas, according to the learned counsel the appellant was entitled to M.Phil allowance from the date of acquiring of M.Phil degree. The record reflects that a letter of the Finance Department annexed with the reply, which is a sort of clarification that the M.Phil allowance could be allowed to the applicant from the date of approval of competent authority and no arrears could be claimed being not covered under the policy on the subject. Learned counsel submitted that he would not press this appeal and would take further appropriate steps in accordance with law to seek redressal of grievances regarding claim of the arrears of M.Phil allowance from the date of acquisition of M.Phil Degree till the date of the grant of the allowance. Disposed of accordingly. Consign.
