Joint Comments on behalf of Respondents No:

Preliminary Objections

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- 1. That the Appellant has no cause of action, locusstandi to file the instant Appeal.
- 2. That the appellant has concealed material facts from the Honorable Tribunal.
- 3. That the matter is badly barred by law and limitaion.
- 4. That the conduct of the Appellant stopped himself to bring this instant appeal.
- 5. That the appeal bad for misjoind and non joind of necassery parties.

On the facts.

- 1- partains to the personal record of the appellant.
- 2- It is correct to extend of advertisement the rest of Para is pertaining to the administrative position of the both FRs I.e. FR Bannu and FR Lakki.
- 3- It is Correct but this office FR Bannu is not bound to other Agencies like Bajur and Orakzai as the appellant mentioned in the Para. As this office has its own procedure to follow. The real facts of delaying the order of the appellant due to F.R Lakki are mentioned as following:
 - i. some candidates belonging to F.R Bannu were filled a writ petition No:32-B/2013 Titled Atta Ullah and Others Vs Govt of kPK and the honorable Peshawar high court bannu bench granted a status quo therefore the appointments of F.R Bannu was Stoped (Copy of status quo is attached as a annexure –A).
 - ii. In the meanwhile the federal Govt had imposed ban on all sorts of recruitments during the status Quo. (Copy of ban letter is <u>attached as a annexure –B).</u>

- . After lifting the ban on the recruitments dated 25/9/2014, the respondent No-4 forwarded a letter to the respondent No-3 regarding the guidance for appointment. Hence, the respondent No-3, in response to the letter to respondent No-4 to stop the instant recruitment due to badly time barred as per rule and policy. (Copy of Gauidance letter is attached as a annexure –C).
- iv. Three candidates filed a writ petition in high court Bannu Bench vide writ 70B/2015 titled Muhammad Shoaib vs ACS FATA. The Honorable high courts delivered a verdict in favor of these three candidates and were appointed by the respondent No 4. Later on, the left over candidates filed a writ petition vide No: 320-B/2015 titled Ashraf ullah Khan vs ACS FATA. The judgment of the high court in favor of the left over candidates was forwarded by the respondent No-4 to the respondent No-3 for guidance. In response, the respondent No 3 vide letter No: 7966-67 dated 6/8/2015 granted approval for appointment. The respondent No-4 appointed more than 67 candidates on PST, CT, PET,DM and Qari dated 17/8/2015. (Copy of Approval Letter is attached as a annexure –D).
- v. The case of was forwarded to Deputy Commissioner (according to his competency) by the respondent no-4 for approval. The Deputy commissioner returned the case with the direction to verify documents, sands, from the board and university concerned before their appointment order.
- vi. An anonymous complaint was made to respondent No-3 regarding the above mentioned recruitment. Taking action on the complaint the respondent No-3 declared all the appointment null and void vide letter No: 1152 dated 1/2/2016. (Copy of letter No: 1152 is attached as a annexure –E).
- vii. The effected teachers filed different writ petitions vide No: 100-B/2016 Titled Hakimullah vs ACS FATA, writ petition No: 126-B/2016 Titled Khalid Usman vs ACS FATA. The high court Bannu bench reinstated all the effected teachers.
- viii. While the fate of AT and TT was still undecided. So the respondent No- 4 forwarded a letter to respondent no 3 for approval. The respondent no 3 granted approval letter vide No:1119 dated 22/6/2017. Consequent upon the approval by the respondent No-4 appointed AT and TT candidates in September 2017 and the appellant is among these appointed teachers. (Copy of Approval Letter is attached as a annexure –F)

iii.

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It is incorrect the appellant has no right for seniority because seniority and back benefits can be claimed from the date of taking over charge after appointment under E & D rule 2011. Therefore, their seniority and back benefits shall be considered from the date of taking over charge. Furthermore, He claim the seniority from F.R Lakki appointment order of the same advertisement dated 22/04/2013 while F.R lakki has been bifurcated after the merger of FATA into KP. As F.R lakki is lying under the jurisdiction of District Lakki and FR Bannu is lying under the jurisdiction of district Bannu after merger. Therefore, both districts have separate seniority/promotion quota which are not dependable on each other. It is also important to mention that no recruitment had taken place during 2012 to 2018 except the same advertisement. So the seniority of F.R Bannu candidates are in sequence and the same merit shall be applied for their promotion quotas.

- 5- It is correct but the case was dismissed on merit.
- 6- It is incorrect; the appellant has no right to file an instant appeal in this honorable service tribunal.

On Grounds:

- A. It is incorrect the appellant has no right to claim seniority and back benefits.
- B. In correct, both districts have separate seniority quota and the appellant does not affect from the seniority of F.R Lakki.
- C. Incorrect, the respondent no 4 was an appointment authority at the time therefore, the respondent no 4 scheduled test and interview on the same day. Moreover, F.R Lakki recruitment process was completed on time 22/4/2013 whereas F.R Bannu recruitment delayed due to tussle among candidates by approaching High courts and resorting to other delaying tactics.
- D. It is incorrect, all the evidence detail regarding their delay in appointment order are mentioned in the above Para.
- E. It is incorrect, reply of this Para is explained on detailed on Para No: 3 on fact.
- F. In correct, as explained in the above Para in detail.
- G. The respondents may also be allowed to add additional supporting documents at the time arguments.

Pray

In the light of the above stated facts, it is humbly prayed that appeal of the appellant having no valid legal grounds may very graciously be dismissed with heavy cost.



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Being aggrieved by and dissatisfied with the discriminatory and illegal sub-division of F.R. Bannu for the purpose of appointment of School Teachers in the Frontier Region Bannu otherwise than in accordance with law by the Respondent No. 1, the Petitioners abovenamed prefers this writ petition for the enforcement of their inalienable constitutional and fundamental rights, inter alia, on the following facts and grounds: -

FACTS

1. That, the Competent Authority i.e. the Governor NWFP (now KPK) has in exercise of his powers conferred on him under Article: 241 of the Constitution of Pakistan–1973 has for the purpose of initial recruitment to any service of the province, divided the entire province and the adjoining Frontier Regions/Tribal Agencies into five (05) Zones for ensuring proper representation of the peoples of each and every part of the province and its adjoining Frontier Regions/Tribal Agencies, vide Appendix to the then Govt of NWFP(Now KPK) S&GAD Notification No. SOS.III(S&GAD)/3-39/70 dated 02-10-1973, according to which all the adjoining Tribal Agencies as well as Frontier Regions have been compacted into only one zone i.e. Zone No.1. It is pertinent to mention that this Notification is existing in force as it has been given effect through Rule: 12 of the NWFP Civil Servants (Appointments, Promotion and Transfer) Rules–1989 and Regulation: 3(a) and Part–XI of the NWFP Public Service Commission Regulations–2003.

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Copy of the Notification is filed herewith and marked as Annex "A

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RESPONDENTS

2. That, the Respondent No. 1 has invited applications for appointment to various vacant post of teaching staff in the Schools of F.R. Bannu through his advertisement published in the Daily MASHRIQ (Peshawar) dated 23-10-2012 and the Petitioners above named feeling themselves fully qualified for appointment against the advertised vacant posts have applied to the Respondent No.1, through the prescribed application formatted by the Respondent No. 1, in which item No.4 has been bifurcated for indicating (a) Name of the Agency/F.R. of Domicile and (b) Name of the Sub–Tehsil of the Agency/F.R.

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Copies of the advertisement and the format of the prescribed application form for the teaching posts are filed herewith and marked as Annex "B/1&2", respectively.

That it is reliably learnt that the Respondent No.1 has introduced name of 3. facilitate view to with а Sub-Tehsil in the application form the favouritism/nepotism and appoint those candidates whose merit is low but who are ready to please the incumbent of the office of the Respondent No.1 and thus sabotage the merit and may discriminate candidates with higher merits in the garb of technicality unless and otherwise all the low and high merit candidates belong to one and the same Frontier Region, which is being administered through one and the same APA i.e. the Respondent No.3. Therefore, with a view to block the ways of inter-play of technicalities by the Respondent No.1, the elders and Teachers Association of F.R. Bannu requested the Respondents No. 1,2,3 and other administrative authorities of F.R. Bannu; vide their applications (1) dated 26-10-2012 and (2) dated 20-11-2012; for preparation of one joint merit list of the entire F.R. Bannu in accordance with law and to make appointments to the vacant posts accordingly but the authorities have paid no heed to their request.

Copies of the Elders and Teacher Association's applications (1) dated 26-10-2012 and (2) dated 20-11-2012 are filed herewith and marked as Annex "C/1&2", respectively.

5. That in the above circumstances, the Petitioners see no remedy except to beseech before this Hon'ble High Court by way of the instant Writ Petition under Article: 199(1)(a)&(c) of the Constitution of Pakistan–1973, for the enforcement of their inalienable constitutional and fundamental rights conferred on them under Articles: 4, 25 & 27 of the Constitution of Pakistan–1973, amongst others, on the following grounds:-

GROUNDS

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That, the Petitioners have no other alternate and efficacious (A) remedy for the enforcement of their inalienable constitutional and fundamental rights, except through this Petition. Contel - P/4 /4

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That although Rule 12(2) of the NWIP Civil Servants (B). (Appointment, Promotion & Transfer) Rules-1989 requires that initial recruitment in Basic Pay Scales No. 3 to 15 borne on district cadre shall be made from amongst bonafide residents of the district concerned and does not allow further bifurcation of the District cadre into Tehsil or Sub-Tehsil basis as yet the Respondents are stubborn to bifurcate the District/Agency/F.R. cadre into Tehsil or Sub-Tehsil basis, which is ultra virus, null and void ab-initio, more particularly when it gives way to favouritism/nepotism and parochial, racial, tribal and sectarian prejudices which is strictly prohibited under Article: 34 of the Constitution of Pakistan-1973. As such the Petitioners are being treated otherwise than in accordance with the law/rules existing in force. Therefore, the instant Petition is lawfully maintainable.

That such bifurcation does not exist in any other Agency or Frontier (C). Region, therefore, the Petitioners are right to claim that they have been discriminated against in violation of Articles: 25&27 of the Constitution of Pakistan-1973. As such the instant Writ Petition is lawfully maintainable, under Article: 199 of the constitution of Pakistan-1973.

That the Petitioners are sure to the effect that in case joint merit list (D). is prepared on the basis of the Agency/F.R. then because of their higher merit they will surely succeed in proving their worthiness for appointment on merit but because of the parochial tendency for making the merit list on basis of Tehsil/Sub-Tehsil then they may be looser and will be discriminated against despite their higher academic merit as compared to that of candidates belonging to Bakka Khel or Jani Khel etc Sub-Tehsils. Therefore, this Petition is lawfully maintainable.

That, Advocate for the Petitioner craves leave of this Hon'ble High (E) Court to urge more grounds at the time of hearing of this Petition.

PRAYERS

In view of the above humble submissions, it is earnestly prayed that this 6. Hon ble High Court may graciously be pleased to:-

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Declare that the Respondent No.1 has illegally and unwarranted----(a). prepared the separate Tehsil/Sub-Tehsil wise merit lists which tend ' give way to parochial/racial/tribal prejudices: and __P/5 (D) Adv.fo. Retil

Contol -

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Issue a writ of mandamus to the Respondents in general and to the (b). Respondent No.1 in particular to prepare one joint seniority list on the basis entire F.R. Bannu and make appointment to the vacant posts accordingly.

That as an INTERIM RELIEF, this Hon'ble Court may graciously be (C). pleased to restrain the Respondent No.1 from making appointments against the separate Tehsil/Sub-Tehsil wise merits lists till disposal of the instant petition unless and otherwise the Petitioners shall fall prey to multiple litigation with the prospective employees also.

Any other relief which this Hon'ble High Court may deem fit and (d) necessary in circumstances of the case.

Prayed accordingly in the interest of justice.
