fell vacant where against Naib Qasids senior to appellant were promoted and the appellant thus become the senior most Naib Qasid and entitled for promotion as Junior Clerk. That against two sanctioned posts of Junior Clerk (BPS-11), one post of Assistant (BPS-16) and one post of Budget and Account Assistant (BPS-14), the Additional Registrar, Peshawar High Court, Mingora Bench requested for constitution of DPC and DSC and in response to the said request, the Registrar, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar constituted Departmental Promotion and Selection Committee for filling up the above posts vide order dated 22.10.2014. That meanwhile the appellant and others submitted joint application for promotion to the post of Junior Clerk but vide letter dated 14.4.2015 the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar transferred and adjusted two Junior Clerks (BPS-11) from the Establishment of District & Sessions Judge/Senior Civil Judge, Swat which order affected the prospects of the appellant for future promotion and hence departmental representation was submitted before the august Peshawar High Court, Peshawar which was rejected and communicated to the appellant vide letter dated 2.5.2015 where-against appellant preferred a review petition which was also dismissed vide order communicated to the appellant dated 11.6.2015 and hence the instant service appeal.

Pre-admission notice was issued to the respondents vide order of this Tribunal dated 5.10.2015. Arguments of learned counsel for appellant and Mr. Kabirullah Khan Khattak, Assistant Advocate General were heard and record perused.

The services of the appellant are governed by the Peshawar High Court Ministerial Establishment (Appointment and Conditions of Service) Rules, 1989 made under the provisions of Article 208 of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. Method of recruitment by initial recruitment or by promotion or transfer is prescribed for the Establishment of the Ministerial Staff of the Peshawar High Court in the said Rules. According to judgment of the august Supreme Court of Pakistan 1997 SCMR 141 titled "Registrar, Supreme Court of Pakistan, Islamabad -vs- Qazi Wali Muhammad" it was observed that the employees of the Supreme Court, Federal Shariat Court and High Courts are not civil servants within the meaning of Civil Servants Act, 1973.

This Tribunal is vested with the jurisdiction to entertain and hear appeals in respect of civil servants whose terms and conditions of service are governed by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants Act, 1973. The grievances and appeal of the appellant would not be entertain-able by this Tribunal as the appellant is neither a civil servant under the provisions of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants Act, 1973 nor entitled to prefer an appeal under the provisions of Section-4 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Service Tribunal Act, 1974 as such the instant appeal is not found entertain-able. The same is, therefore, dismissed in limine. No order as to costs. File be consigned to the record room.

APPEAL UNDER SECTION 64 OF THE KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA TRIBUNAL SERVICE: ACT, 1974:

Respectfully Sheweth:

- That the appellant was appointed as Naib Qasid in the Anti-Terrorism Court Malakand Division at Saidu Sharif Swat on 30/03/2010. (Copy of recruitment order is Annexure "A").
- 2) That after the establishment of Peshawar High Court Mingora Bench/Darul Qaza Swat, the appellant was recruited as Naib Qasid (BPS-01) vide order bearing Endst: No.21676-85/Admn: dated 22-12-2010 along with three others in order of merits mentioned therein. As per recruitment order, the other two were senior to the appellant (Copy of the recruitment order is Annexure "B").
- 3) That the appellant, who is a Master Degree holder has been performing his duty to the best of his abilities, efficiently, honestly with full zeal and obediencea) (Copy of the degree is Annexure "B-1").

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- 4) That in the year 2012 a post of Junior Clerk (BPS-7) fell vacant, upon which, Mr. Muhammad Idrees, Naib Qasid was promoted on the basis of seniority cum-fitness amongst the Naib Qasid(s) vide order bearing Endst: No.11661-68/Admn: dated 14-09-2012. (Copy of promotion order is Annexure "C").
- That vide order bearing Endst: No.12620-27/Admn: dated 23-10-2013, the above named official was further promoted to the post of Senior Clerk (BPS-09), (Copy of promotion order is attached as Annexure "D").
- 6) That two posts of Junior Clerk were fell vacant in the Hon'ble Bench, upon which, two Naib Qasid(s) were promoted on the basis of Seniority cum-fitness vide order bearing Endst: No.14457-63/Admn: dated 31-10-2014 and the appellant was come to the top of seniority amongst Naib Qasid(s) of the Hon'ble Bench (Copy of promotion order is Annexure "E").
- 7) That the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, letter No.6085-6105/B&A dated 24-09-2014 read with corrigendum bearing Endst: No.6292-99 dated 03-10-2014 one post of Assistant (BPS-16), one post of Budget & Account Assistant (BPS-14) and two posts of Junior Clerk (BPS-11) were sanctioned for this Hon'ble Bech (Copies of letters are Annexure "F& G" respectively).
- 8) That for filling up the above posts, the worthy Additional Registrar of Peshawar High Court Mingora Bench vide letter bearing No.3962/Accounts dated 03-102014 send a request for constitution of DPC & DSC along-with working papers so prepared for the purpose (Copies of papers are Annexure "H").
- 9) That in response to the above letter, the worthy Registrar, Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, vide letter No.13898/Admn: dated 22-10-2014 constituted departmental Promotions & Selections Committee for filling up the above posts. For reasons unknown to the petitioner, the said committees are yet to hold their meetings. (Copy of the above letter is Annexure "J").
- 10) That in the meanwhile the appellant along with other Class-IV officials of Peshawar High Court Mingora Bench, submitted joint application for their

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promotions to the posts of Junior Clerk per their seniority, the same was forwarded by the respondent No.3 to respondent No.1. (Copies are Annexure "K").

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- 11) That vide order bearing Endst: No. 4888-99/Admn: dated 14-04-2015 of the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, (Annexure "M") two Junior Clerks (BPS-11) from the establishment of District & Sessions Judge/Senior Civil Judge Swat (working on detailment), were transferred and adjusted upon the above vacant positions.
- 12) That the said order directly affected the prospects of the appellant for future promotion. Hence, a departmental representation was filed before the august Peshawar High Court, Peshawar (Copy of representation application is Annexure "N").
- 13) That the august Peshawar High Court, Peshawar was pleased to dismiss and reject the said application. The same was communicated to the appellant through Endst: No.5614/Admn: dated 02-05-2015 by respondent No.2 (Copy of letter is Annexure "O").
- 14) That against the above order, the appellant filed a review petition which was dismissed vide letter No.6985/Admn dated 11-06-2015. No reasons were mentioned for dismissal of the same (Copy of review petition and dismissal letter are attached as Annexure "P").
- 15) That feeling mortally aggrieved, the appellant files this appeal *inter alia* on the following grounds

GROUNDS:

- 1. That the impugned orders are unjust, violative of due process of law and of fundamental rights thus, falling foul of Article 4 and 10-A of the Constitution.
- 2. That rights can be conferred upon an individual retrospectively but they cannot be taken back retrospectively. By virtue of the impugned orders, officials of

District Judiciary who were working on detailment at PHC Mingora Bench have been deemed senior to the petitioner. Thus, the appellant has been condemned in retrospect and a cardinal principle of justice has been violated through the order under review.

- 3. That by virtue of the impugned orders, officials of the District Judiciary who were temporarily deputed to PHC Mingora Bench have been preferred over the petitioner. Needless to say that the permanent staff of Peshawar High Court are in the minimum connotation of the notion, not inferior to those serving in the District Judiciary.
- 4. That the impugned orders have been made arbitrarily without any plausible grounds. Through the said order future prospects of the appellant for promotion have also been blocked.
- 5. That the appellant whose mates were appointed as Naib Qasid(s), have now been promoted as Junior Clerks and Senior Clerks. The appellant was having a legitimate expectation to be promoted as Junior Clerk. By virtue of the impugned orders the appellant has been deprived of his lawful rights, which directly affects his job and official responsibilities.
- 6. That keeping the mandates of law aside, even the norms of courtesy and propriety demand that a person serving in his parent department is more deserving for promotion than an alien. By virtue of the impugned orders, officials of another department have been preferred.
- 7. That on the factual side as well, the impugned orders are not sustainable in the eyes of law. The working paper prepared by the authorized officers and sent to Respondent No.1 for filling up the posts of Assistants, Budget and Account
 Assistant and Junior Clerks through DPC and DSC has not been acted upon as yet. Through the impugned orders, the same procedure has been nullified.
- 8. That further grounds with leave of this august Tribunal may be raised at the time of oral submissions before the Hon'ble Bench.

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It is, therefore, humbly prayed that on acceptance of this appeal, the impugned orders may be set aside and the decision of considering staff of the District Judiciary working on detailment at PHC Mingora Bench as senior to the appellant may be withdrawn.

Any other relief though may not specifically prayed for, but which the circumstances of the case demand in the interest of justice, may be granted.

GROUNDS:

That the impugned order is completely in contradiction with the *Civil Servants Act*, 1973 and the *Civil Servants* (Appointment, Promotion and Transfer) *Rules*, 1989 and **discriminatory**.

That the officials of District Judiciary Swat, whose services were temporarily hired on detailment, were not entitled to permanently transfer and adjust them on the vacant positions available in the Hon'ble Bench Darul Qaza, because, the applicant waited for long time with a ray of hope that he would be promoted to the post of Junior Clerk as his 03 Senior colleagues Class-IV officials have already got promotion turn by turn to the posts of Junior Clerk even one of them was further promoted to the post of Senior Clerk. Such deprivation of the applicant from his lawful right, is directly affecting his job.

That in accordance with *Law & Shariah*, the applicant being official of parent department is more deserving for promotion than the officials of District Judiciary Swat.

That Note Para 1 of the impugned order is completely against the *Government Servants Laws*, *Rules*, also against the *Shariah* and *natural justice*, because, which directly further infringed the lawful right of the applicant and other Class-IV Servants of the Hon'ble Bench Darul Qaza, Swat.

That about six months ago working papers were prepared by the worthy Additional Registrar, Peshawar High Court, Mingora Bench (Darul Qaza) Swat, and sent the same to the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, for filling up the posts of Assistant, Budget & Account Assistant and Junior Clerks through DPC & DSC with full detail of promotions and appointments. In response to that, the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, constituted both the committees i.e. DPC & DSC (Annexure "H"), which process was delayed due to some unknown reasons and now the impugned order. The impugned order is not only against the Government Servants Laws/Rules but also in violation of the fundamental rights guaranteed by the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973.

That despite the fact that the applicant is well qualified, having enough experience in official work, typing as well as computer skills and is fit for promotion for the post of Junior Clerk but even then preference was given to the employees of District Judiciary over the applicant, such deprivation causing mental disturbance to the applicant in particular as well as other Class-IV officials of the Hon'ble Bench too.

Per recruitment order, the other two were senior to the petitioner (Copy of the recruitment order is Annexure "B").
- 3) That the petitioner, who is a Master Degree holder has been performing his duty to the best of his abilities, efficiently, honestly with full zeal and obedience (Copy of the degree is Annexure "B-1").

- 4) That in the year 2012 a post of Junior Clerk (BPS-7) fell vacant, upon which, Mr. Muhammad Idrees, Naib Qasid was promoted on the basis of seniority cum-fitness amongst the Naib Qasid(s) vide order bearing Endst: No.11661-68/Admn: dated 14-09-2012. (Copy of promotion order is Annexure "C").

- 11) That vide order bearing Endst: No. 4888-99/Admn: dated 14-04-2015 of the Hon'ble Peshawar High Court, Peshawar, (Annexure "M") two Junior Clerks (BPS-11) from the establishment of District & Sessions Judge/Senior Civil Judge Swat (working on detailment), were transferred and adjusted upon the above vacant positions.
- 12) That the said order directly affected the prospects of the petitioner for future promotion. Hence, a departmental representation was filed before this august Court (Copy of representation application is Annexure "N").
- 13) That this august Court was pleased to dismiss and reject the said application. The same was communicated to the petitioner through Endst: No.5614/Admn: dated 02-05-2015 by respondent No.2 (Copy of letter is Annexure "O").
- 14) That feeling mortally aggrieved and having no other efficacious and adequate remedy in law, the petitioner files this review petition *inter alia* on the following grounds

GROUNDS:

- 1. That the order under review is unjust, violative of due process of law and of fundamental rights thus, falling foul of Article 4 and 10-A of the Constitution.
- 2. That rights can be conferred upon an individual retrospectively but they cannot be taken back retrospectively. By virtue of the order under review, officials of District Judiciary who were working on detailment at PHC Mingora Bench have been deemed senior to the petitioner. Thus, the petitioner has been condemned in retrospect and a cardinal principle of justice has been violated through the order under review.
- 3. That by virtue of the order under review, officials of the District Judiciary who were temporarily deputed to PHC Mingora Bench have been preferred over the petitioner. Needless to say that the permanent staff of this august Court are in

the minimum connotation of the notion, not inferior to those serving in the District Judiciary.

- 4. That the order under review has been made arbitrarily without any plausible grounds. Through the said order future prospects of the petitioner for promotion have also been blocked.
- 5. That the petitioner whose mates were appointed as Naib Qasid(s), have now been promoted as Junior Clerks and Senior Clerks. The petitioner was having a legitimate expectation to be promoted as Junior Clerk. By virtue of the order of under review the petitioner has been deprived of his lawful rights, which directly affects his job and official responsibilities.
- 6. That keeping the mandates of law aside, even the norms of courtesy and propriety demand that a person serving in his parent department is more deserving for promotion than an alien. By virtue of the order under review, officials of another department have been preferred.
- 7. That on the factual side as well, the order under review is not sustainable in the eye of law. The working paper prepared by the authorized officers and sent to this Hon'ble Court for filling up the posts of Assistants, Budget and Account Assistant and Junior Clerks through DPC and DSC has not been acted upon as yet. Through the order under review, the same procedure has been nullified.
- 8. That further grounds with leave of this august Court may be raised at the time of oral submissions before the Hon'ble Bench.

It is, therefore, humbly prayed that on acceptance of this review petition, order dated 18-04-2015 may be reviewed and the representation of the petitioner may be allowed.

Any other relief though may not specifically prayed for, but which the circumstances of the case demand in the interest of justice, may be granted.

YAHYA AFRIDI,J.- Through this single judgment, we propose to dispose of three Writ Petitions, as common questions of law. The particulars of the said writ petitions are as under:-

- 1. W.P.No.2440-P/2012 (Engineer Musharaf Shah, Assistant Engineer (Acting Charge Basis) Rehabilitation of Irrigation System of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Directorate Peshawar vs. Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa through Chief Secretary Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Peshawar and other).
- 2. WP No. 3388-P/2012 (Asif Khan, Sub-Divisional Officer (Irrigation) Shahbaz Garhi, Mardan and others vs. The Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa through Chief Secretary, Civil

Secretariat, Peshawar and others).

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3. WP No. 3595-P/2012 (Saifullah S/o Abdullah Khan, Sub-Divisional Officer (OPS), Peshawar vs. Secretary, Govt. of KPK, Irrigation Department, Peshawar and others).

2. In the first two petitions (Writ Petitions No. 2440- P & 3388-P/2012), hereinafter referred to as *"first set of petitions*, the petitioners are seeking the following common relief:

<u>Firstly</u>, to direct the respondents to act in accordance with law and to allow regular promotion to the petitioner & to place his cases before the Departmental Promotion Committee for his confirmation/regular promotion against the post of Assistant Engineer BPS-17;

Secondly, declare to the amendment introduced in the recruitment rules vide Notification NO. SOE/IRR/2-3-5-2010-11 dated 25.6.2012 are inapplicable to the case of the petitioner have and no retrospective effect;

<u>Thirdly</u>, the respondents are legally not competent to process the promotion cases on such rules to the detriment of the rights of the petitioner or any other remedy deemed proper may also be allowed. While in the third petition (Writ Petition No. 3595-P/2012), hereinafter referred to as *"third petition"*, the petitioner is seeking essentially the following:-

I. Direct the authority /department to issue **Notification** of Promotion of the petitioner, etc to the Assistant post of Engineer, BPS-17 with all service benefits; and/or

II. Any other writ/ order/direction deemed proper and just in the circumstances of the case, be also issued/ ordered/given".

3. Before this Court considers the petitions on merits, it would be essential to first decides the preliminary jurisdictional objection raised by the respondent department in view of the express bar provided in Article 212 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973 ("Constitution").

4. The constitutional bar imposed upon this Court under Sub-Article (2) of Article 212 of the Constitution reads as under:-

"212. Administrative Courts and Tribunals.

(1)Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the appropriate Legislature may by Act provide for the establishment of one or more Administrative Courts or Tribunals to exercise exclusive jurisdiction in respect of—

- (a) matters relating to the terms and conditions of persons who are or have been in the service of Pakistan, including disciplinary matters;
- (b) matters relating to claims arising from tortuous acts of Government, or any person in the service of Pakistan, or of any local or other authority empowered by law to levy any tax or cess and any servant of such authority acting in the discharge of his duties as such servant; or
- (c) matters relating to the acquisition, administration and disposal of any property which is deemed to be enemy property under any law.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything hereinabove contained, where any Administrative Court or Tribunal is established under clause (1), no court shall grant other an injunction, make any order or entertain any proceedings in respect of any matter to which the jurisdiction of such Administrative Court or Tribunal extends:

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall not apply to an Administrative Court or Tribunal established under an Act of a Provincial Assembly unless, at the request of that Assembly made in the form of a resolution, Parliament by law extends the provisions to such a Court or Tribunal.

(3)".

(Emphasis provided)

5. The above constitutional provision, opening with the "*non-obstente*" clause, expressly bars all Courts, including the High Court to take cognizance of matters, which can be agitated and adjudicated before an administrative tribunal constituted and functioning under the law. This essential principle has been eloquently explained in the authoritative judgment of this Court in <u>Mian Amanul Mulk's</u> <u>case</u> (PLD 1981 Peshawar 1) and the decision of full bench Court of the Sindh High Court in <u>Abdul</u>

<u>Bari's case (PLD 1987 Karachi 290).</u>

6. Now, in order to appreciate the scope of matters, which can be adjudged exclusively by an administrative tribunal, we will have to refer to section 4 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Service Tribunal Act, 1974 ("*Act of 1974*"), which reads as under:-

4. <u>Appeal to Tribunals</u>.

Any civil servant aggrieved by any final order, whether original or appellate, made by a departmental authority in respect of any of the terms and conditions of his service may, within thirty days of the communication of such order to him or within six months of the establishment of the appropriate Tribunal, whichever is later, prefer an appeal of the Tribunal having jurisdiction in the matter:

Provided that:-

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(a).....

(b) no appeal shall lie to a Tribunal against an order or decision of a departmental authority determining..

> (i) the fitness or otherwise of a person to be appointed to or hold a particular post or to be promoted to a higher post or grade; or

> (ii) the quantum of departmental punishment or penalty imposed on a civil servant as a result of a departmental inquiry, except where the penalty imposed is dismissal from service, removal from service or compulsory retirement; and

(c) no appeal shall lie to a Tribunal against an order or decision of a departmental authority made at any time before the 1st July, 1969.

(Emphasis provided)

7. In view of the above provision of the Act of 1974, the condition precedents for invoking the jurisdiction of the Tribunal are as under:-

- i. Civil servant is to be aggrieved of a final order;
- *ii.* The said order has to passed by the departmental authority; and

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iii. finally, the said order is to relate to terms and conditions of service of the aggrieved civil servant.

8. When we consider the circumstances leading to the filing of the "*first set of petitions*", it is noted that the same fulfils the three essential conditions of invoking the jurisdiction of the Tribunal, which are explained as under;

Condition No.I

As far as the first condition precedent is concerned, no doubt, prior to the filing of the "first set of petitions", there was no "final order" passed by the departmental authority, denying the rights of the petitioners to be "eligible" for promotion to a higher post. However, after the institution of "first set of petitions", the respondent department, interalia, has denied and disputed the "eligibility" of the petitioner to be considered for promotion. The said denial in writing, duly supported by an affidavit of a responsible competent officer would, thus, be deemed a "final order", as envisaged under Section 4 of the Act of 1974.

<u>Condition No.II</u>

As the respondent department has responded in the negative to the claim of the petitioners, the second condition is also fulfilled.

Condition No.III

Before we discuss the third condition precedent, it would be pertinent to understand the true import of the term; *"terms and conditions of service"* of a civil servant. The said term has been defined in Section 3 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants Acts, 1973 (*"Act of 1973"*), which reads as under:-

> "3. Terms and conditions.—The terms and conditions of service of a civil servant shall be as provided in this Act and the rules".

It is by now a settled principle of administrative and service laws that a civil servant has <u>no</u> "*right to promotion*" to a higher post. However, a "*right to be considered for promotion*" would accrue in favour of the civil servant on his fulfilling the requisite prescribed qualification. The basic decision on this issue was rendered in <u>Fida</u> <u>Muhammad Khan's case (PLD 1960 S.C. 45)</u> and later in <u>Muhammad Akbar Qureshi's case (PLD</u> 1962 S.C. 428) and thereafter, consistently followed in various decisions including that of <u>M.A.</u> <u>Rafique's case (1990 SCMR 927) and Fazali</u> <u>Rahmani's case (PLD 2008 S.C. 769).</u>

9. In addition to the above-stated general principles concerning the civil servant's right to promotion and to be considered for promotion, the statutory service provisions also supplements the said principles.

<u>Firstly</u>, it is noted that there is no express statutory "*right to promotion*" vested in a civil servant. However, every civil servant, when he joins the civil service has a "*legitimate expectation*" to rise up the rungs of the service structural ladder. This "*legitimate expectation*" is <u>not</u> legally enforceable.

<u>Secondly</u>, it is only when the civil servant fulfills the essential prescribed qualifications for promotion that his *"legitimate expectation"* matures into a *"vested right"*.

<u>Thirdly</u>, the civil servant's "vested right" to be considered for promotion to a higher post, has been expressly provided under Section 9 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants Act, 1973 ("Act of 1973") read with sub-rule (3) of Rule-7 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants (Appointments, Promotion and Transfer) Rules, 1989 ("**Rules of 1989**"). The said provisions read as follows:

<u>Act of 1973</u>

<u>"9. Promotion.</u> (1) A civil servant possessing such minimum qualifications as may be prescribed shall be eligible for promotion to a higher post for the time being reserved under the rule for departmental promotion in the service or cadre to which he belongs.

Rules of 1989.

7. <u>Appointment by Promotion or</u> <u>Transfer</u>. (1)

(2)

(3) Persons possessing such qualifications and fulfilling such conditions as laid down for the purpose of promotion or transfer to a post shall be considered by the Departmental Promotion Committee or the Provincial Selection Board for promotion or transfer, as the case may be".

10. In order to appreciate the true scope of the right of a civil servant to be considered for promotion, it would be appropriate to review the various stages his promotion case proceeds. The promotion process generally takes the following course:-

PROMOTION PROCESS.

Eligibility Test (First Stage).

On creation of a new post or availability of a vacancy in a higher post, civil servants, who are *"eligible"* under the prescribed rules to be promoted to the said higher post, are shortlisted by the department, keeping in view the number of post; thereafter, the department prepares the list of eligible officers for its placement before the competent promotion authority/Board for its decision.

Fitness Test (Second Stage).

On receipt of the shortlisted eligible civil servants for promotion, the competent promotion authority/Board, in cases of selection posts, considers the *"fitness"* of all short listed eligible civil servants placed before it for promotion to the higher grade, keeping in view the criteria prescribed under the relevant rules of promotion.

What is crucial to understand is that in the First Stage, the essential and determining factor is the *"eligibility"* of the civil servant. While in the second stage, in cases of selection posts, it is *"fitness"* of the civil servant, which is the determining factor for promotion of the civil servant to the higher post.

11. Now, let us move on to the legal forums available to a civil servant for redressal of his grievance during the various stage his promotion case proceeds. The competent forum for redressal during each stage of the promotion process can be explained as under:

LEGAL FORUMS.

Pre-eligibility stage.

In case the departmental authority, despite clear availability of vacancies in the higher post is not processing the promotion case of the eligible civil servants, they cannot seek "*mandamus*" from the Tribunal, as aptly explained by the Apex Court in <u>Qamar Dost Khan's case</u> (2006 SCMR 1630). In such circumstances, the aggrieved civil servant may seek the indulgence of the constitutional Court under Article 199 of the Constitution. The writ so issued by the Constitutional Court would only be to the extent of directing the departmental authority to act in accordance with law and to initiate the process of promotion.

Eligibility Stage. Once the departmental authority proceeds with the promotion process and decides on

the "eligibility" of the civil servants and shortlists the candidates to be placed before the competent departmental promotion authority/Board, the issue would transform from inaction of the department to that of "terms and conditions" of the aggrieved civil servant. In such circumstances, the legal forum for redressal of a grievance of the said aggrieved civil servant would then only be entertained and determined by a validly constituted and functioning. Tribunal. The order of referring the promotion case departmental promotion of others to the authority/Board would be the "final order", as envisaged under Section 4 of the Act of 1974.

Fitness stage. The legal forum for redressal of a civil servant aggrieved of the decision of the promotion authority/Board on his lack of *"fitness"* to be promoted to a higher post would not be the Tribunal. No doubt, the subject-matter of promotion falls within the scope of *"terms and conditions"* of his service, as the process and criteria of promotion has been provided under the Act of 1973 and the relevant Rules. However, the *"proviso"* to subsection (2) of Section 4 of the Act 1974, has expressly barred the Tribunal to entertain any such

grievance of a civil servant. In addition thereto, Section 23B of the Act of 1973 also bars the jurisdiction from civil Courts of ordinary entertaining any matters relating to the "terms and conditions of service" of a civil servant. Thus, a civil servant's grievance regarding the decision of departmental promotion competent the authority/Board on his lack of "fitness" to be promoted to a higher post cannot be agitated before a civil Court or the Tribunal. Faced with having no alternative remedy, the aggrieved civil servant may approach the constitutional Court for redressal of his of the invoking Article 199 grievance by Constitution.

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12. The jurisprudential distinctions in regard to maintainability of petitions before the constitutional Courts and the Tribunals have by now been settled. While dealing with maintainability of petitions filed by a civil servant relating to *"terms and conditions"* of his service, it is settled that the exclusive jurisdiction to decide the same vests in the Service Tribunal and not the constitutional Courts. The leading pronouncements on the matter have been explained in <u>Muhammad Anis and others v. Abdul</u>

1994 SC 539). and others (PLD <u>Haseeb</u> Muhammad Iqbal v Executive District Officer (Revenue) (2007 SCMR 682), Syed Abdul Qadir Shah v. Government of Punjab (1972 SCMR 323), <u>Mian Abdul Malik v. Dr. Sabir Zameer Siddiqui</u> and others (1991 SCMR 1129), Muhammad Akram and others v. The State and others (1996 SCMR Muhammad Rehman Khan v. Chief 324), Secretary, NWFP and others (2004 PLC (C.S) 62), <u>Abdul Ghafoor, Supervisor/Inspector, NHA v.</u> National Highway Authority and others (2002 SCMR 574) and Zafarullah Baloch v. Government of Balochistan and others (2002 SCMR 1056).

13. It would be interesting to note that the apex Court has in some cases clearly vested the Tribunal with exclusive jurisdiction on matters relating to terms and conditions of a civil servant, wherein the impugned action or inaction of the departmental authority did not have a formal *"final order*". Some of the leading cases are as follows:-

Vires of Rules.

Service Tribunal was competent to adjudicate on the question of "*vires*" of rules framed by the department, even if the same were challenged on the basis of violating fundamental rights of the civil servant. The very rules were deemed to be the "final order". Cases in point are <u>Iqan Ahmed Khurram's</u> <u>case</u> (PLD 1980 S.C. 153) and <u>I.A. Sharwani's case</u> (1991 SCMR 1041).

Departmental Inquiry Proceedings

A challenge was made to the enquiry proceedings before the constitutional Court, where it was argued that as there is no "*final order*", the enquiry proceedings could be challenged before a constitutional Court. The apex Court in <u>Abdul</u> <u>Wahab Khan's case</u> (PLD 1989 S.C. 508), while dealing with matter held otherwise with the following observations:

> without "Even such observation, the petitioner is entitled to seek remedy in accordance with the law applicable to the tribunal concerned with regard to the appeals. The filing of petitioner would have to satisfy all the conditions for filing such an appeal. One of the conditions being that the order impugned before the Tribunal should be such which is appealable in accordance with the relevant Service Tribunals Act. But the order impugned before the High Court vis-à-vis the stage at which it has been passed, is not appealable, the petitioner would have to wait

till such an order is passed against him which is appealable before the tribunal".

14. In view of the above legal discourse, it can safely be stated that the right to be considered for promotion to a higher post by a civil servant is a matter, which relates to the *"terms and conditions of service"* and the Services Tribunal has to decide the same. It is an admitted position that the Administrative Service Tribunal has been duly constituted and is presently functioning in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa under the enabling provision of the Act of 1974.

15. Having reached the conclusion that this constitutional Court lacks the jurisdiction to entertain the petitions, it would not be appropriate to pass any finding on merits and the challenge made to *vires* of the impugned rules in both sets of petitions.

16. Accordingly, for the reasons stated above, thisCourt:

i.

Declare grievance of the petitioners relating to their rights to be eligible for promotion to a higher post are "vested right" provided and protected under Section 9 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Civil Servants Acts, 1973 and hence, are terms and conditions of service of the petitioners.

Declare that as the respondents have refused the right of petitioners to be considered for promotion in their comments, the same are deemed as final order provided under Section 4 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Service Tribunal Act, 1974.

that the *exclusive* Declare jurisdiction to entertain and adjudicate upon the matters relating to the right to be considered for promotion to a higher grade vested in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Service Tribunal Act, 1974 and that this Court is constitutionally barred under Article 212 of the **Constitution of Islamic Republic** of Pakistan, 1973 to take cognizance thereof.

- Direct the office to retain copies iv. of memo of Writ Petitions bearing No. 2440-P and 3388-P/2012 and transmit the same to the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Services Tribunal for decision in accordance with law. Parties are directed to appear before the <u>10th</u> Tribunal on Services October, 2014.
- v. In view of the above directions, Writ Petition NO. 3595-P/2012 having become infructuous is disposed of, accordingly.

THE PESHAWAR HIGH COURT MINISTERIAL ESTABLISHMENT (APPOINTMENT AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE) RULES, 1989.

. . -- .

1. <u>Short title, application and Commencement</u>; - (1) These rules may be called the Peshawar High Court Ministerial Establishment (Appointment and Conditions of Service) Rules, 1989.

- 2. They shall apply to all persons appointed to the posts borne on the Establishment except those appointed by transfer or on deputation from any other Department, service or post.
- 3. They shall come into force at once.

2. **Definitions:**- In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context-

- (a) "Appendix" means the Appendix to these rules;
- (b) "appointing authority" means the authority specified in rule 4;
- (c) "Board" means a Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, established by law in Pakistan or any other educational authority or institution declared by Government to be a Board for purpose of these rules;
- (d) "Chief Justice" or "Judge" shall respectively means the Chief Justice or a Judge of the Peshawar High Court;
- (e) "holder of post" means a person appointed to any post specified in Column 2 of the appendix, but does not include a person appointed by transfer or on deputation from other service, Department or post;
- (f) "Establishment" means the Ministerial Establishment of the Peshawar High Court consisting of the posts specified in column 2 of the Appendix;
- (g) "Government" means the Government of North-West Frontier Province;
- (h) "initial appointment" means appointment made otherwise than by promotion or transfer;
- (i) "post" means a post specified in column 2 of the Appendix and includes such other post or posts as may, from time to time, be added to it;
- (j) "recognized University" means any University incorporated by Law in Pakistan or any other University declared by Government to be recognized University for the purpose of these rules;
- (k) "Zone" means the different areas for the time being notified by Government as a separate Zone for the purpose of giving

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representation to the bonafide residents of each such area in the services of the Province.

3. <u>Constitution of the Establishment.</u> -- The Establishment shall consist of the posts specified in Appendix, and shall include such other posts as may be added to it from time to time.

4. <u>Appointing Authority.</u> – Appointment to the posts shall be made by the Chief Justice or by an officer of the High Court authorized by the Chief Justice in that behalf.

5. <u>Method of Recruitment:</u> (1) Recruitment to the cadre posts borne on the Establishment shall be made by initial recruitment or by promotion or transfer in the manner specified in these rules.

- (2) Subject to these rules, vacancies in various posts shall be filled in the following manners;
 - (a) vacancies in the post of Registrar shall be filled by transfer;
 - (b) vacancies in the post of Additional Registrar and Secretary to the Chief Justice shall be filled at the discretion of the appointing authority by transfer or by promotion; provided that the said two posts shall be inter-transferable;
 - (c) vacancies in the post of Assistant Registrar, Private Secretary to the Chief Justice, Superintendents and Senior Clerks shall be filled by promotion, provided that the posts of Assistant Registrar and Private Secretary to the Chief Justice shall be inter-transferable;
 - (d) vacancies in the posts of Judgment Writers and Stenographers shall be filled by promotion or, if no suitable person is available for promotion, by initial appointment;
 - (e) seventy five percent of the posts of Assistants shall be filled by promotion on the basis of seniority-cum-fitness and the remaining twenty five percent by initial appointment;
 - (f) vacancies in the remaining posts specified in column 2 of the appendix shall be filled by initial recruitment; provided that twenty percent of the vacancies in the posts of Junior Clerk may be filled by promotion from amongst Daftaries and Naib Qasids who have passed the Secondary School Certificate Examination from the Board.

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4-Ministerial Establishment of the High Court

- (3) Vacancies to be filled by initial recruitment shall be reserved for bonafide resident of Zones in accordance with such policy or proportion as may be laid down by Government from time to time.
- (4) Vacancies to be filled by promotion or transfer shall be filled from amongst persons eligible for such promotion or transfer in accordance with the provisions contained in column 4 of appendix.

6. <u>Age.</u>---No person shall be appointed to a post by initial recruitment who is less than eighteen years or more than twenty five years of age-

- (a) where recruitment is to be made on the basis of written examination, on the 1st January of the year in which the examination is proposed to be held; and
- (b) in other cases, on the last date fixed for submission of application for appointment; provided that that appointing authority may, in the case of upper age limit, grant such concession to a candidate as may be admissible to him for appointment to Government service under any general or specific order of Government for the time being in force.

7. **Qualification.**—(1) No person shall be appointed to a post by initial recruitment unless he possesses the qualifications prescribed for the post in column 3 of the Appendix.

(2) No person, if not already in Government service, shall be appointed to a post unless he/she produces a certificate of character from the principal academic officer of the academic institution last attended and also certificate of character from two other responsible persons not being his/her relatives, who are well acquainted with his/her character and antecedents.

8. <u>**Probation.-**</u> (1) A person appointed to a post against a substantive vacancy shall remain on probation for a period of two years, if appointed by initial recruitment, and for a period of one year, if appointed otherwise.

Explanation: Officiating service and service spent on deputation to a corresponding or a higher post may be allowed to count towards the period of probation

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(2) If the work or conduct of a holder of post during the period of probation has, in the opinion of the appointing authority, not been satisfactory, the appointing authority may, notwithstanding that the period of probation has not expired dispense with his services, if he has been appointed by initial recruitment and if he has been appointed otherwise, revert him to his former post, or if there be no such post, dispense with his services.

(3) On completion of the period of probation of a holder of the post, the appointing authority may, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him in his appointment or if his work or conduct has, in the opinion of the appointing authority, not been satisfactory.-

- (a) in case he has been appointed by initial recruitment, dispense with his services; or
- (b) in case he has been appointed otherwise, revert him to his former post, and if there be no such post, dispense with his services; or
- (c) extend the period of probation by a period not exceeding two years in all, and during or on the expiry of such period pass such orders as it could have passed during or on the expiry of the initial probationary period.

Explanation-I.— If no orders have been made by the day following the completion of the initial probationary period, the period of probation shall be deemed to have been extended.

Explanation-II.-- If no orders have been made by the day on which the maximum period of probation expires, the probationer shall be deemed to have been confirmed in his appointment.

Explanation-III.-A probationer who has satisfactorily completed his period of probation shall be confirmed with effect from the date of his continuous appointment to the post in a substantive vacancy; provided that where the period of his probation has been extended under the provisions of clause (c) of this sub-rule, the date of confirmation shall, subject to the other provisions of this rule be the date on which the period of probation was last extended.

(4) Where the appointing authority has prescribed any training or departmental examination for the purpose of confirmation against a post,

no person shall be confirmed against the post, unless he successfully completes the training or passes the departmental examination so prescribed.

(5) If a holder of the post fails to complete successfully any training or pass any departmental examination prescribed under sub-rule(4), within such period or in such number of attempts as may be prescribed by the appointing authority, the appointing authority may.—

- (a) in case he has been appointed by initial recruitment, dispense with his services; and
- (b) in case he has been appointed otherwise, revert him to his former post, or if there be no such post, dispense with his services.

9. <u>Seniority:</u> (1) The seniority interse of the holders of posts shall be determined.--

(a)

- in the case of persons appointed by initial recruitment, in accordance with the order of merit assigned by the authority on whose recommendation the appointment is made; provided that persons selected in an earlier selection shall rank senior to persons selected in a latter selection; and
- (b) in the case of persons appointed otherwise, with reference to the date of their continuous regular appointment; provided that persons selected for promotion in one batch shall retain their inter-se seniority as held by them in the lower cadre.

Explanation-I.- If a junior person in a lower post is promoted to a higher post by superseding a senior person and subsequently that senior person is also promoted, the person promoted first shall rank senior to the person promoted subsequently.

Explanation-II.-- A junior person appointed to a higher post shall be deemed to have superseded a senior person if both the junior and senior persons were considered for the higher post and the junior person was appointed in preference to the senior person.

(2) Seniority of the holder of posts appointed by initial recruitment vis-à-vis those appointed otherwise shall be determined with

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reference to the dates of their continuous regular appointment to the post; provided that if the date of continuous regular appointment in the case of two or more persons is the same, the person appointed otherwise shall rank senior to the person appointed by initial recruitment.

10. <u>Pay and Allowances and other Fringe benefits</u>.--- Members of the Establishment shall be entitled to the same pay and allowances (including the scale of pay) and other fringe benefits as are admissible to Government Servants of the equivalent status or rank in accordance with the rules made by the Government from time to time.

11. <u>Liability of Transfer</u>.-- Holders of posts shall be liable to transfer anywhere in the North-West Frontier Province from the principal seat of the High Court to any of its Circuit Benches and vice versa.

12. <u>General Rules</u>.-- In all other matters not expressly provided for in these rules or any other rules hereafter made, the rules made or deemed to have been made by Government under the North-West Frontier Province Civil Servants Act, 1973 (N.W.F.P Act XVIII of 1973), shall mutatis mutandis apply to the holders of posts under these rules.

13. **Relaxation.**-- Any of these rules may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, be relaxed in individual cases, if the Chief Justice is satisfied that a strict application of the rule would cause undue hardships to the individual concerned.

14. <u>**Delegation.--**</u> The Chief Justice may delegate all or any of his powers under these rules to a Judge or officer of the High Court.

15. **Powers of the Chief Justice to safeguard rights of holders of posts.**-- Whenever in the application of these rules, the terms and conditions of service of a holder of post, as guaranteed by any law for the time being in force, are likely to be adversely affected, the Chief Justice shall make appropriate orders to safeguard the legal rights of such person in accordance with law.
