SERVICE APPEAL UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA SERVICE TRIBUNALS ACT, 1974 AGAINST THE IMPUGNED/NOTIFICATION NO.SOE(H-II/4-1/2012 DATED PESHAWAR, the 13th May, 2014 PASSED BY RESPONDENT NO.2.

PRAYER:-

On acceptance of the instant service appeal this Honourable Tribunal may graciously be pleased to declare the impugned Notification No.SOE(H-II/4-1/2012 Dated Peshawar, the 13th May, 2014 passed by respondent No.2 is illegal, void abinito and of no legal effect and set aside the same and also re-instate the appellant with all back benefits.

Respectfully Sheweth,

Facts giving rise to the present appeal are as under:-

1. That appellant is doctor by profession. He was appointed in the year 1991by respondent No.1 (Annexure-A). He has got about 20 years service at his credit with unblemished and clean sheeted conduct record.



- 2. That appellant was allowed for proceeding on deputation to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia with effect from 08-09-2005. Appellant remained on deputation till 31-10-2009 (Annexure-B).
- 3. That after expiry of deputation period; appellant again submitted application for further one year extension in the deputation period as per law and rules. The law and rules governing the subject are very clear. The case of appellant was very genuine and more so he was assured by the dealing authorities that his case would be approved. On the solid assurance, appellant continued his job in KSA.
- 4. That on 01-07-2010, the request of the appellant was regretted and therefore, appellant left his job at KSA and made his arrival on 12-07-2010.
- 5. That it is alleged that respondent No.3 has issued appellant's temporary posting order on 05-08-2010. This Order has never been communicated to the appellant in spite of his repeated request and in spite of his repeated continuous visit to the dealing offices.
- 6. That disciplinary action was initiated against the appellant for his alleged absence w.e.from 01-11-2009 to 12-07-2010.
- 7. That appellant submitted reply to the show cause and explained the whole situation.
- 8. That appellant waited for further proceeding, but no proceeding has been taken place. Appellant requested for his posting but neither he was posted nor the fate of disciplinary proceeding was communicated.
- 9. That recently another disciplinary action initiated, where appellant has been again served with another Charge Sheet (Annexure-C) of the same nature. Appellant

submitted reply to the charge sheet (Annexure-D). Inquiry conducted (Annexure-E). The inquiry officer vide his report has almost exonerated the appellant and recommended him for minor penalty.

- 10. That respondent No.1 served the appellant with Show Cause Notice (Annexure-F), wherein penalty of stoppage of 03 annual increments was proposed.
- 11. That appellant submitted reply to the show cause notice (Annexure-G).
- 12. That respondent No.2 vide Notification No.SOE(H-II/4-1/2012 Dated Peshawar, the 13th May, 2014 imposed upon the appellant major penalty of removal from service (Annexure-H).
- 13. That being aggrieved from penal order; appellant submitted departmental appeal (Annexure-I), but the same is still pending without disposal, hence the instant service appeal inter alias on the following grounds.

Grounds:

That Respondents have not treated appellant in A. accordance with law, rules and policy on subject and acted in violation of Article 4 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973. Appellant after rejection of his application for extension of his deputation period; immediately approached respondent, but was not adjusted rather disciplinary action was initiated, and he was charge sheeted to which appellant submitted reply. The disciplinary action was delayed for almost two year without any result. Recently another fresh disciplinary action has been initiated and culminated into removal from service. The action of the

authorities is against the provision of Article 13 of the Constitution of Pakistan 1973.

- B. That the impugned penalty is against the law laid down by the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan. The authority while enhancing penalty in dis regard of the recommendation of the inquiry officer for imposing minor penalty has to give valid, plausible and convincing reasons. In the instant case, the inquiry officer vide his report recommended minor penalty and whereas the punishing authority imposed major penalty of removal from service without assigning any reason. On this score the impugned penalty is very harsh and does not commensurate with alleged guilt and therefore, liable to set aside and rescind.
- C. That respondent No.1 vide his final Show Cause Notice proposed penalty of stoppage of 03 annual increments, but respondent No.2 vide impugned order has penalized the appellant with major penalty of removal from service, which is illegal, unlawful and without lawful authority, hence not maintainable in the eyes of law.
- D. That it is very astonishing that charge sheet has been served by respondent No.1. The inquiry has also been conducted vide his order. The final show cause has also been served by him and whereas the penal Notification has been issued by respondent No.2. Departmental disciplinary action could only be initiated by the appointing authority. In the instant case the so called disciplinary action has been initiated by the respondent No.1, who is not the appointing authority of the appellant

and therefore, the whole disciplinary action is void abinito and liable to be struck down on this score alone.

- That where an authority had been authorized to make Ē. some order under the rules of law, such authority alone can exercise power in question.....Where anything was prescribed by law to be done in a particular manner, it must be done in that manner or not at all. Order passed by authority other than competent authority, even though of higher rank would be nullity in the eyes of law, more so, when such order was penal one. Reliance is placed on 1989 MLD 3676, 1998 CLC 770, PLD 1997 Lah 692, 2001 PLC(CS) 771, 2000 PLC(CS) 21, 1988 PLC(CS) 387 and so many other numbers of judgments of the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan. In the instant case, the very impugned disciplinary action has been exercised by incompetent authority, therefore, nullity in the eyes of law and liable to be set aside.
- F. That when initial order or act relating to initiation of disciplinary proceedings was contrary to law, than all subsequent proceedings and action taken there on would have no base and would fall. If mandatory condition for exercise of jurisdiction by the judicial or qasi judicial authority was not fulfilled, entire proceedings, which followed, would become illegal and would suffer from inherent defect of jurisdiction. Any order passed in continuation of those proceeding would equally suffer from illegality and would be without jurisdiction. Reliance is placed on 2003 PLC(CS) 748 and 2009 SCMR 339(A). More over the appellant has been prosecuted under wrong law.

- G. That major penalty has been imposed without giving reason for disregarding appellant's defense constitute violation of Section 24A of the General Clauses Act, 1897, therefore, the impugned order is not sustainable in the eyes of law and liable to be struck down.
- H. That the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan has in thousands of cases has held that no major punishment could be imposed without regular inquiry, the subject impugned order based on slipshod inquiry has therefore, no base in the light of the decision of the Apex Court, thus liable to be set aside.
- I. That so called slipshod inquiry has been conducted in the absence and at the back of the appellant. Appellant active participation during inquiry proceeding has been willfully and deliberately ignored. Inquiry proceedings are of judicial in nature in which participation of accused civil servant as per law condition sine qua non. On this ground the impugned orders are coarm non judice and liable to be set back.
- J. That the well-known principle of law "Audi altram Partem" has been violated. This principle of law was always deemed to have embedded in every statute even though there was no express specific or express provision in this regard.

....An adverse order passed against a person without affording him an opportunity of personal hearing was to be treated as void order. Reliance is placed on 2006 PLC(CS) 1140. As no proper personal hearing has been afforded to the appellant before the issuing of the impugned order, therefore, on this ground as well the

impugned order is liable to be set aside.

- K. That no inquiry report has been provided nor final show cause notice. Failure to supply copy of inquiry report to a civil servant proceeded against would be sufficient circumstances to hold that either no inquiry was held at all or if inquiry was held, the inquiry report was held as a secret document. Delivery of copy of inquiry report to civil servant proceeded against being a mandatory requirement; disciplinary action taken against a civil servant would not be sustainable in the eyes of law. Reliance is placed on the reported judgment 2010 TD (Service)19.
- L. That petitioner is jobless since impugned order, there fore entitled to be re instated with all back benefits.

For the aforesaid reasons, it is therefore, humbly prayed that the appeal may kindly be allowed as prayed for above.

Any other relief as deemed appropriate in the circumstances of case not specifically asked for, may also be granted to appellant.



The undersigned was appointed as enquiry officer by the Communit Authority under triber enkhrunkhw experiment Servants (Efficiency and 7 ciplina) Rules, 2011 vide Govt: 6. When Pakhtunkhwa, riealth Department Peshawar letter # 80(E)/H-II/4-1/2012 dated: 11.02.2013 to probe the findings as per charge sheet given below:

PROCEEDINGS:

In order to probe the above charge sheet, the undersigned (the enquiry officer) issued notice through Director General Health Services, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Peshawar office to the accused to appear before the enquiry contribute on 15.03.2012 at 11:00 am in his office at Haripur for personnel hearing. The representative of office of Director General Health Services, Peshawar was also requested to attend the proceedings. The written reply of the accused doctor had already been received on 10-03-2013 (Annexure-I). The personnel hearing was carried out on the said date which was attended by Dr. Ahdur Repnan, Assistant Director (P-I) from the DG(Healtin milice. Brief provided by the DG office.

Findings:

- I. Dr. Mohammad Ayub was allowed for deputation to KSA by the Health department from 08-09-2005 to 31-10-2009 (4 years) extending the deputation on yearly basis (Annexure-Ri).
- II. On expiry of 4th year deputation, Dr. Ayub applied for extension of another one year deputation on 20-10-2009. But department failed to respond to his request by 01-07-2010 (9 months time) when his request was regretted by that time the doctor, considering that case would be decided in his favour, had already entered into contract with Saudi Government for another one

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year. However on receipt of Health Department letter of regret, he submitted his arrival report on 12-07-2010.

- III. The Directorate General Health Services Peshawar issued his posting on temporary basis in DHQ Hospital, Abbottabad on 05.08.2010. The Doctor stated that he didn'r receive any such order and remained waiting for the posting.
- IV. Till March 2012 i.e 18 months neither Doctor approached the Health Department to enquire about his posting nor the MS DHQ, Abbottabad reported his absence.
- V. The MS DHQ Hospital, Abbottabad reported to DG Health about the absence of the Doctor on 27.03.2012.
- VI. In response to his temporary posting order on 05.08.2010, Secretary Health office asked the DG office to take disciplinary action against the Doctor for his willful absence w.c.f 01 11.2009 to 12.07.2010 which was accordingly conveyed to Doctor by DG office office of the dated 20.09.2010.
- VII. Doctor gave his reply dated: 27.09.2010 explaining the reason for delay which was accordingly conveyed to Secretary Health office by DG Health office letter dated: 10.11.2019.
- VIII. In response to DG Health office, Secretary Health office responded that the Doctor may be directed to appear before the Secretary Health for personnel hearing along with documents letter dated: 10.11.2010.
- IX. No response from the Doctor is forthcoming, however, he again gave an application to the Secretary Health office for his posting on 11.07.2012.
- X. In response to this application, Secretary Health office directed the DG Health office to initiate disciplinary proceedings against the Doctor vide letter dated: 07.00.2 12.

After going through whole episode of correspondence, it agreess that Doctor didn't get his temporary posting order and continued his deputation with Saudi Government with the intention that as and when he will be posted he will join the duty as his subsequent application dated: 11 07.2012 reflects that he is still interested in performing his duties with the Government. The delay in reporting and lack of any action in time by the Department enabled the Doctor to continue his deputation.

<u>Kecommendations</u>

The Doctor availed of the opportunity created by the official correspondence of the Department and kept his deputation continued which was mainly created by the non / miss-communication of posting orders. It is therefore, recommended that:

- 1. The Health Department should abruptly act on such incidents to avoid creation of any miss opportunity for the employees.
- 2. Doctor is found to be guilty of miss-conduct, however, keeping in view his experience in profession and shortage of Doctors in public sector, it is recommended that:
 - i. Period after 31.10.2009 should be converted into Extra Ordinary Leave (Ex Pakistan Leave)
 - ii. and minor penalty at 4 (a) (iii) of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Government Servants (Efficienc), a . . scipline) Rules 2011 should be imposed.

AND WHEREAS, the Inquiry Officer after having examined the charges, evidence on record and explanation of the above mentioned accused doctor, submitted his report and recommendation.

AND WHEREAS, Show Cause notice was served upon Dr. Muhammad Ayub, Medical Officer (85-17), BHU Pano Dhori, Mancehra to which he replied.

AND WHEREAS, Dr. Muhammad Ayub was granted the opportunity of personal hearing.

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of powers conferred under the aforementioned rules, the Competent Authority, after having examined the charge, findings / recommendations of the Inquiry Officer, is pleased to impose the major penalty of "Removal from Service" upon Dr. Muhammad Ayub, MO (BS-17), BHU Pano Dheri, Mansehra, with immediate effect. Respected Sir,

With due regards it is humbly submitted that I was appointed as Medical officer in Health Department KPK on regular basis on 11.12.1991. I was allowed deputation for Saudia Arabia for four years which was expired on 31.10.2009. Due to extension in my agreement with Saudia Government I applied Health Department KPK to extend my deputation period for further one year on 20.10.2009 (Prior to expiry of my deputation period).

The matter remained under process with the Department for a long time which resulted my overstay. Due to which disciplinary proceedings were initiated against me and an enquiry committee was constituted. I was served with the show cause notice which was replied accordingly and lastly I have received subjected notification wherewith I have been removed from service.

In the notification it is clearly mentioned that action against me has been taken on the recommendations of the Inquiry Officer Mr. Mohammad Asif District officer (F &P) Haripur.

For your kind perusal the recommendations of the Inquiry officer are reproduced as under:

"The doctor availed of the opportunity created by the official correspondence of the department and kept his deputation continued which was mainly created by the non/miscommuniciation of posting order. It is therefore recommended that:

- 1. The Health Department should abruptly act on such incidents to avoid creation of any miss opportunity for the employees.
- 2. Doctor is found to be guilty of miss-conduct however keeping in view his experience in profession and shortage of doctors in public sector, it is recommended that:
 - i. Period after 31.10.2009 should be converted into extra ordinary leave (Ex-Pakistan

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And minor penalty at 4 (a) (ii)of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Government servants ii. (efficiency and discipline) Rules 2011 should be imposed."

From the above mentioned facts it is very much clear that the competent authority while making the decision has totally ignored the recommendations of the inquiry Officer and issued the notification at his own will.

It is, therefore, requested that my appeal may kindly be considered sympathetically keeping in view my 23 years service by exonerating me from the charges leveled against me and I may be very kindly be reinstated.
