Arguments on application for seeking permission to serve notices to the respondents through Post Registered A/D via General Post Office (GPO) instead of TCS/newspaper publication heard and record perused.

The main contention presented by the learned counsel for the appellant is that the appellant, being a Grade-11 employee, faces financial constraints due to the large number of private respondents, making it difficult to afford the expenses related to TCS/newspaper publication.

In the instant appeal, numerous private respondents have been impleaded vide order dated 20.05.2024 passed by this Tribunal. Due to the substantial number of private respondents, it has been determined that serving them effectively is essential to proceed with the matter in accordance with the principles of justice and due process. Therefore, application of the appellant is rejected. Given the large number of private respondents, newspaper publication is selected as the appropriate method for serving notice. The publication shall be made in the "Daily Mashriq" newspaper. The appellant is directed to deposit requisite expenses for the publication in "Daily Mashriq" newspaper, within a period of three (3) days from today. Upon receipt of the deposit, office shall make arrangements for the publication of the notice in the "Daily Mashriq" newspaper. To come up for appearance of private respondents and arguments on 02/10/2024 before the D.B. Parcha Peshi given to the parties.
